### **PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**

Outwardly it may have seemed fairly quiet over the last two months, as far as Parish Council matters are concerned, and no doubt the majority of you were all very busy with Festive and New Year activities, and dealing with the impact of the Omicron variant which thankfully now seems to have peaked and be on the decline. But things do never stop and whilst there may have been no PC meeting in December, your Councillors did meet up to start putting together the budget for the next financial year April 22 – Mar 23, which aside from dictating our spend for the forthcoming year also determines the figure that you pay as a parish precept in your Council Tax bill. Last year for a Band D Council Tax payer that precept was £69.19 and we're pleased to advise that despite increasing our precept budget which for 2021-22 was £49,011 to a figure of £55,120, your individual precept payment will remain unchanged. We have been able to achieve this because of an increase in the housing base within the parish from 708 to 796 that are now Band D Council Tax Payers. Unfortunately, it is very unlikely that your overall Council Tax bill will remain unchanged, as all indications to date, suggest that Buckinghamshire Council will be increasing Council Tax for 2022-23.

Some of you who are regular Facebook users will no doubt have seen the post from 'The Brother Supper' a catering company based in Milton Keynes which suggested they were looking at potentially taking over The Dolphin Public House, and they were enquiring as to what type of food residents would like to see on offer. At first it wasn't clear from their post was as to whether they were intending to use the Dolphin purely as a place to prepare the food for their existing catering service or to actually reopen the premises as a pub and restaurant, but a subsequent response from them confirmed they were looking at taking on the pub to open as a pub/restaurant. We have approached the company and as and when we have more news, we will circulate that information.

Whilst, details and outcomes of Planning Applications are covered within the 'Planning Section' within this publication, we think the latest news regarding the open space off Mount Pleasant warrants a special mention, in that the application to build two over 55's bungalows on that land has been refused by the planners. They stated in their decision document that the 'proposed single storey dwellings would result in an incongruous form of development which is visually discordant with the surrounding built form'. The planners also recognise this is a visually sensitive location and would also result in the loss of an area of Green Space. Hopefully this refusal may lead to a positive outcome in the resident's application to the Secretary of State for this area to be granted Village Green status.

It's taken a while to achieve, but hopefully you will have noticed and like the pair of new, bright white village entrance gates which have now been erected by Bucks Highways on the Newton Road. Highways honoured their commitment to provide and install these new gates at their cost. It now means that the three entrance roads to the village have pairs of gates denoting the boundaries, and aside from being an attractive feature, also act as a reminder that you are now entering a 30-mph zone and to reduce your speed accordingly. You will see elsewhere in this edition the proposed events for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations over the June Bank Holiday Weekend. This is a once in a lifetime event



with no British monarch ever achieving 70 years in reign, so it's so important that we as a community put on something special. The Parish Council is working with other village organisations and will be meeting on a regular basis to coordinate the plans. But we will be reaching out to you for ideas and assistance in making these four days something to remember.

As mentioned earlier, there was no PC Meeting in December, but here follows brief details from the January meeting.

- Whilst there was a good public attendance it was noted that once again, we had no representation from any of and we do have three, of our Unitary Ward Councillors, the last time a Ward Councillor attended a Stoke Hammond Parish Council meeting was September last year, but it would seem that some of our neighbouring parishes are seeing attendances from Ward Councillors on a more regular basis at their PC meetings.
- As part of the new Precept budget the Parish Council have set aside £3500 to fund parish organisation projects, with a maximum of £350 available per project. The Stoke Hammond Gardening Club being particularly 'fast out of the blocks' with an application already before the PC. Their application was approved, with an award of £350.
- Parish Councillor Damian Willingale who is currently the lead for the evolving Neighbourhood Plan, gave the meeting an update on the number of questionnaires returned, which was felt to be a rather disappointing 90 in total of which 64 were completed online. This equates to approx. 6% of the parish population that are eligible to participate. However, when speaking with our Neighbourhood Planning consultant a Mr Neil Homer, he advised that this 6% figure was typical for many of the other projects he has been involved in. A meeting with Mr Homer is to be arranged to discuss the next steps forward on this major project.
- Things are progressing albeit slowly on the project to possibly reinstate the village pond at the top of Church Road. It seems community grants maybe available to help fund this, and a visit is expected at the end of January by a specialist consultant to assess the viability of the project.
- Still talking of projects, both Taylor Wimpey and Bovis homes have been approached
  about the possibility of installing a Parish Notice Board and a Heart Defibrillator in
  Newton Leys South. It would seem the former Notice Board is not an issue, but the
  latter more difficult as the defibrillator requires a permanent electrical mains feed,
  and it's a question of where this could be sourced.

The February PC Meeting will be held at the Community Centre, Bragenham Side on Tuesday 1st February commencing 7.30pm with the March meeting being the same time and place on March 1st



## News from Buckinghamshire Council

7 January 2022

Dear Resident,

I'd like to start by wishing you a very Happy New Year. I know that Christmas has been hard for many people this year and plans have been disrupted for those who've had to isolate and who have been ill with Covid. I do hope that most of you have still be able to enjoy something of a more 'normal' festive season than we all endured last year.



The new year is always a good opportunity to look forward. I know we all face a lot of uncertainty, but life goes on, as does planning for the future. As a Council, and like others across the country, we are busy setting our budgets for 2022/23 and I'd like to start by letting you know more about what we're proposing.

This week, the Council's Cabinet approved our budget and spending plans for 2022/23. It goes without saying that we're operating in a very challenging environment; Covid has created extra demand on our services and a huge amount of uncertainty, at a time when councils up and down the country are already facing major financial pressures. That said, I am very proud that we are a strong and financially prudent Council and we are in a much better position than many other local authorities. It means that we're able to propose continued spending on the areas that matter most to our residents. The budget has taken into account the feedback we received from residents during our budget consultation and I'm pleased that in 2022/23 we can budget to:

- Continue investing more than £100 million in a comprehensive programme of road and pavement improvements.
- Spend nearly £120 million overall on strategic highways improvements over the next four years, including flood prevention and street lighting.
- Again next year, clean out every one of the 85,000 gullies in the county to prevent flooding and to improve the local environment.
- Fight Climate Change on a number of fronts including planting half a million new trees in Bucks – one for every resident.
- Hopefully open another of our local Household Recycling Centres which are so popular with residents.

For me, it's essential that we have a budget that proposes spending money on what matters most to residents – we are spending this money – your money – on your behalf. It does mean we've had to make some difficult choices to balance the books and allocate money to these projects however. We are choosing to dip into our General Fund (unallocated) Reserves to use £1.36 million on a one-off basis, as we would rather use these funds than cut frontline services. We have to raise Council Tax again this year to cover our overall costs and to pay for essential frontline services. We will therefore be proposing a general increase of 1.99% to cover inflation (currently around 5%). Alongside that we will implement the Government's proposal for a 2% increase solely to cover the large increase in social care costs. Social care alone is projected to cost us nearly £300 million in 2022/23. In total this means we are proposing an overall rise in Council Tax of 3.99% - which equates to a rise of £1.23 per week for the average Band D home.

I really do know how much pressure households are under with the rising costs of living and we don't take these decisions lightly. There is no wriggle room in council budgets, especially if we want to spend money in areas like roads improvements which residents have asked us to prioritise and which we know is crucial here in Bucks with the level of traffic and vastly increased numbers of HGV movements due to HS2 and East West Rail construction.

### Give us your feedback on these spending plans

The next stage of the budget process is called 'scrutiny' – it starts next week and allows residents to actively take part and give feedback on the budget proposals. You can view the full budget plans <u>here</u> and please look at the topics being discussed at each 'scrutiny select committee' session next week <u>on our online calendar here</u> – you can also watch the sessions live online as they happen.

### **Covid update**

Infection rates of Covid in Buckinghamshire are the highest they have been at any point in the pandemic, as is the case across the whole country. The current wave is being driven by the highly infectious Omicron variant. As we know, Omicron does appear to cause less severe illness but the pressures created by the sheer number of cases cannot be understated. Our NHS services locally are under significant strain caused as much by staff absence as by patient numbers and our local ambulance service is

currently being supported by the army to keep being able to respond to emergencies appropriately.

One particular concern here in Bucks is a rise in cases amongst older age groups (60+ years) and whether that will lead to more people becoming more seriously ill with Omicron given the risk from Covid is higher the older you are.

Overall, as ever, our individual actions and choices will all play a part in the collective fight. As individuals, we can still all do our bit to protect ourselves and others – overall aiming to reduce the impact of Omicron where possible to help get us through this very difficult winter period.

- Keep testing, immediately before and after meeting others.
- Try to meet outdoors and keep inside areas ventilated. I know we're going through a cold snap at the moment but opening windows for just 5 minutes each hour will help refresh the air.
- Get vaccinated it's safe and it offers the best possible protection against the virus, especially once you've had your booster. There is lots of local capacity and it's really easy to book and go along a fantastic army of volunteers is staffing our vaccine centres and there are plenty of health experts on site to answer any questions you've got. Book via the <a href="MHS National Booking System">MHS National Booking System</a>. This includes pregnant women if you're pregnant or trying to conceive and have questions about the vaccine then experts at the vaccine centres can explain the facts.

You will also probably be aware that the rules around how long to isolate following a positive test have changed – if you test negative with a lateral flow device on days 6 and 7 (where day 1 is the day after symptoms start, or the day after you took a positive test if you had no symptoms) you can end your isolation period on day 7. Please familiarise yourself with all the <u>latest advice on the Government's website</u>, which includes limiting close contact with people outside your household until day 10 if you are able to end isolation early.

Up to date local Covid data is on our website at the Covid dashboard.

### Welcome back schools

I just want to say a few words to welcome back all students, teachers and support staff across all of our schools, doing a sterling job during this challenging time. I want to thank all school staff for the efforts they're going to managing the extra pressures and logistics being caused by Covid. Again, everyone is going the extra mile to keep lessons and learning going in the face of rising staff absences and all the extra measures and testing. Thank you to secondary school students too for wearing your face coverings for long spells in the classroom. We are closely monitoring the situation around staffing and case numbers in schools and are closely supporting all schools in the county.



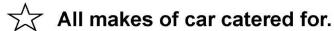

### **NEWS FROM NEWTON LEYS SOUTH (NLS)**

Well, a Happy New Year to you all and I hope you all had a great Christmas, it was a little like Las Vegas on the development during the festive period, it was great to see that so many houses went to so much effort to celebrate Christmas after the rather different two years that we have all endured. Hopefully 2022 will be better for us all.

There were another 78 houses built in 2021, on the development, this produces money available to the local PC so please take a moment to read the Parish Council News report which will explain how the precepts are set and how they were calculated this year. From the Parish Council there will be no raise but the expectation is that Buckinghamshire Council will raise the Council Tax this year. It seems all household bills are rising.

The Neighbourhood plan is being developed by the Parish Council and this includes Newton Leys and any potential development sites that could be built on locally.

It was a bit of a loss that the landfill was given the green light to extend the licence for 15 years, it would have been a great prospect to see this turned back into local parkland and places for the children to play, MK Council are going through a process to see if it is worth the investment to appeal, but it does seem likely that this will be fruitless.

One of the Parish Councillors is leaving soon, so there will be a position available on the Parish Council. It would be good to get another local Newton Leys resident onto the council if possible. Further information will be advertised in the coming weeks.

With money raised from the Stoke Hammond Village Show in August, the organisers have decided to provide funding to locate a defibrillator in Newton Leys South, we are working with the developers to find a suitable location. We would also like to install a community noticeboard somewhere in or near to the park on Missenden Street.

Finally, there will be lots of information on the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations included in this month's magazine, hopefully we will see lots of Newton Leys residents at the events.



The Familiars - by Stacy Halls

This was certainly a 'different' book. Set in the seventeenth century the main character 'Fleetwood Shuttleworth' is 17 years old, married and pregnant for the 4th time. She has miscarried 3 times and felt pressure from her husband who was desperate for a child as heir to Gawthorpe Hall in Lancashire. It was a time of belief in witchcraft for both good and evil and she befriends a young woman Alice Gray who is said to be a sort of midwife and who promises to help her through her pregnancy. Fleetwood has seen a letter which she thinks says she will not survive another

pregnancy and she feels that Alice will help her to live and have a healthy baby. Her husband has a friend, Roger, who is involved in searching out witches and who turns out to be both friend and foe to Fleetwood particularly in her support and reliance on Alice who is implicated in witchcraft. The story surrounds the strange times that prevail and centres around the Pendle witch trials of 1612 when ten women were put to death accused of witchcraft.

Everyone found it an interesting book historically as much research had been done by the author and it was an unusual story which held your attention and created the atmosphere of the times. We all warmed to the character of Fleetwood with her determination to do everything possible to save Alice. The story gradually gathered momentum and the many characters were complex but unfortunately most of us found that after so much detail the last 50 pages were something of an anti-climax.

Conclusion: certainly worth a read, particularly for anyone interested in that period of history.

### Coffin Road - by Peter May

A man is washed up on a deserted beach on the island of Harris in the outer Hebrides - he is hypothermic and completely disoriented and he has no memory of who he is or indeed anything about himself. The plot goes on to include a remote road with secrets, a book which he is supposed to be writing, neighbouring islands which he visits and a dead body on one of them. It becomes very complicated introducing innumerable characters as he endeavours to work out who he is and what his life is all about. As the story progresses it is surprising to find that the main theme



was very topical (save the planet!) with several stories unfolding at once holding the reader is suspense if confused.

Each of our group enjoyed the book in various ways. It was described as an easy read, a holiday read, enjoyable, wonderful descriptions of the Scottish islands and in some cases a 'quick read'. It was acknowledged that it was full of unexpected turns although some of us guessed a few outcomes. Thinking back about it, several of us had questions on parts they found hard to believe but it certainly kept everyone's attention until, as in so many cases, it did seem to fizzle out at the end. I still feel I need some answers!

Conclusion: definitely worth reading (perhaps twice !) as although very complex, a page turner.
