

PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Depending on the publication/distribution dates for this edition of the SH & NLS News, you might hopefully be reading this report just before the four days of planned Platinum Jubilee Events. If indeed before then something to really look forward to, but if after, then hopefully the weather was kind and everyone had a great time and really helped celebrate Her Majesty the Queen and her 70 years of reign. Irrespective of it being before or after the Parish Council must say a massive thank you to the organisations, the people and indeed sponsors, who all got together to make the four days a reality and show that when we put our minds to it, together we can make something special happen in our parish.

Something special can also be a phrase used to describe the new hand pump and trough now in place on the small green at the entrance to Church Road. The site of the original village water pump, this new cast iron pump in its resplendent green colour with the new stone trough below, just looks and feels so much more in keeping than the old pump housing it replaced. Whilst financed by the PC much thanks must go to ClIr David Venn and his neighbours for man handling everything into place. The PC would also like to thank Sylvia Drummond for planting the trough with a rather beautiful display of colourful plants.



The Dolphin PH is once again in the news when mysteriously the pub sign to the building frontage was inexplicably removed. Having contacted the current owners, the PC learnt that they knew nothing about its removal but did confirm that the sale is still proceeding but like most property sales the progress is painfully slow.



We must welcome to the Council Craig Champion who put himself forward for the vacant position and was unanimously co-opted onto the council at our April PC meeting. So, we're now back to full strength of 7 councillors. Craig hails from Newton Leys South, so will provide a valuable and important link for this northern part of our Parish.

In the last PC News, we mentioned about the proposal to purchase 3 new solar powered speed signs, to be located at the main entrances to the village, namely Leighton Road, Fenny Road and the Newton Road. Please be assured this has not been forgotten because we do

recognise that speeding in our village is a very important issue to you all. Unfortunately, we're now at the behest of some hidden department within Bucks Highways who have to approve the proposed locations. Despite much chasing we have still not been able to get an answer from this elusive department. Our Ward Councillor Phil Gomm has promised to try and expedite the application upon our behalf.

Just a quick update on progress for our evolving Neighbourhood Plan (NP). We now have two teams within the Steering Group, the Green Team, primarily dealing with Heritage and Green Infrastructure Spaces and the Brown team, dealing with Housing and

Development. Both teams have engaged in meetings with our appointed NP Consultant Neil Homer of ONeill Homer Limited. Neil is advising the teams of the steps and information they need to collect and collate to take us through each stage of putting together the NP. But the NP does require consultation with you our parishioners, and it won't be too long before we will be reaching out to you all for your valued input.

There have been two PC meetings since the last PC News, these being April and May, with the latter being both the Annual Parish (APM) and Annual Parish Council Meeting (APCM). Some struggle to understand the difference between the two, but basically, the APM is an opportunity for parish organisations including the PC to provide a review of their last years activities. Whilst, the APCM is to 'all intents and purposes' a normal monthly Parish Council meeting with a few additional annual items included.

So, to the April PC meeting which was attended by 11 members of the public and our Unitary Ward Councillor Phil Gomm. Unfortunately, both the Chair and Vice Chair were isolating due to Covid, which meant just a team of 4 Councillors, but luckily the first item on the agenda was the co-option of a new Councillor, and as mentioned earlier Craig Champion was duly elected, which at least meant we were now 5 councillors for the evening.



Before Cllr Gomm gave us his normal round up on local council matters, there was the important matter of presenting an award to one of our parishioners. The Proud of Bucks Community Awards celebrate individuals that have demonstrated care, creativity and commitment towards their local community, and Cllr Gomm duly presented our very own Claire Critchlow with the award of Highly Commended Best Adult Contribution which recognised Claire's outstanding achievements

in our community. Well done, Claire.

There were 3 items of planning to be considered, details of which can be found within the 'Planning Section' of this publication. A few other items of interest from the April PC Meeting were:

- As regards Highway matters, it was noted that the potholes (well the largest ones at least) to Tyrells Gardens had at last been filled in, as was the one by the pedestrian crossing. And still on the subject of the crossing, a request has been made to highways about repainting the very faded white lines and upgrading the orange beacon lights to energy efficient LED.
- Cllr Gomm advised that the issue of the school bus in relation to covering Newton Leys South (NLS) had now been resolved and 9 children from NLS who previously had no access to this service now do.
- The Red Maple tree has now been planted on the village green and will be registered as part of the Queen's Green Canopy Campaign running in conjunction with the Platinum Jubilee celebrations.

I'm a mobile Hairdresser working in and around Stoke Hammond • The layby on the Fenny Road and what is happening was a question asked, to which Cllr Gomm advised things were in hand but couldn't give details or a timeframe.

So, forward to the two May meetings, where for the APM, the Chair of the PC Malcolm Newing gave a review of PC activities over the last year, which was followed by similar reports from Buttons PreSchool, St Luke's Church, the Community Association, the Village Show, the Gardening Club, the Book Club and finally Cllr Phil Gomm on behalf of Buckinghamshire Council. Given the number of reports, we were a little behind schedule for starting the APCM, the first order of which was to elect the PC Chair and Vice Chair for the next year, with Cllr Newing and Cllr McNally being both re-elected to their respective Chair and Vice Chair roles. There then followed the agreeing and signing off of annual accounts and other such similar items.

There was one planning item to be discussed relating to Rectory Farm, details of which are in the 'Planning Section, but a resident of Lodge Lane wanted to revisit a planning application relating to the erection of a single storey home office and gym at a neighbouring property, namely Stoke Lodge. For although we had considered this application 22/00780/APP at a previous meeting and had 'no objection' to the plan, the resident was adamant that no planning notices had been displayed on the site, and for this reason he missed the deadline for submitting his comments/objections. Cllr Gomm confirmed that if indeed it was proven that planning notices had not been publicly displayed, then the resident would be given extra time to submit his comments, but irrespective of this the PC could not now change their stance/comments as these had already been submitted. A couple of other items of interest from the meeting were:

- Cllr Gomm, made mention that Bucks Council are investigating the possibility of providing a Council Waste/Recycling site in North Bucks to alleviate the ridiculously long journeys that residents in this region have to make to reach our current official sites such as Aylesbury and Aston Clinton.
- Following a request from the Village Show management team, and to assist with the parking issues associated with the popularity of this annual show, the PC agreed that the show organisers could, providing ground conditions are suitable use the PC field adjacent to the Community Centre for car parking purposes.
- It would seem the viability for the possible reinstatement of the Village pond at the top of Church Road is looking less likely, but further clarification is to be sought from a specialist surveyor before any further decisions can be made.

The June PC Meeting will be held at the Community Centre, Bragenham Side on Tuesday 7th June commencing 7.30pm with the July meeting being the same time and place on Tuesday 5th July. Noting, there is no PC Meeting in August, but you're most welcome to visit us on our PC stand at the Village Show on Saturday 6th August.

During the April Parish Council meeting we had another member of the community voted onto the Parish Council, Craig Champion, he is a great asset to the Parish Council and will also help with ensuring Newton leys south has a voice on the Council so welcome Craig!

Hopefully, you will have seen the Jubilee celebration's that will be taking place in Stoke Hammond it has been very well planned and there are lots of events for all ages, as well as beacon lighting and children's entertainments. There were loads on this subject in the last edition of this magazine plus more recently on Facebook, please take a look and please do come along and participate. As part of the celebrations, we have purchased two jubilee benches, one for Stoke Hammond the other for NLs, we are hoping that Taylor Wimpey will assist in placing the concrete slab for the bench in the park on Coleman Road intime for the Jubilee weekend, "fingers crossed". We will then look to install a notice board in the park.

You will have seen the civil engineers beginning to prepare the streets and roads ready for handover to Buckinghamshire Council, I believe this will be in early 2023. Taylor Wimpey has around 5 more private houses to sell near the site office and then the two blocks of flats on the entrance are sold to a Housing Association, so the site is near complete.

The new park on Lansbury finally opened and it seems to be used a lot, it is always full, and people seem to enjoy the new park and play area. There have been a few incidents of young adults using the park at night and leaving rubbish and broken glass in and around the park. We will monitor this going forward.

I hope to see a lot of residents at the Sports Field and Community Centre in Stoke Hammond during the Queens jubilee weekend.



The Grass is Singing - by Doris Lessing

Now for a complete contrast - this novel by a famous author is set in Rhodesia and tracks the tragic life of Mary. In the first few pages we learn that Mary has been murdered on her own veranda which makes you wonder where we go from there but the story takes us back to Mary's younger days and the events leading up to her marriage to Dick Turner, an unsuccessful farmer on a remote farm. She is unable to settle to her life there, has an inbuilt dislike of the local Rhodesian farm hands and servants, and added to this, her husband is full of useless money-making ideas which never work



adding to her despair and frustration. Eventually she makes herself both physically and mentally ill and the tragic outcome is her murder by her one remaining house-boy. Apart from a complaint that it tended to drag a little at the end there was not even a happy ending!

Although we all agreed that the book was beautifully written and reminded us of things, we had heard about concerning the treatment of ethnic workers we seemed to be waiting for something concrete to happen long before it did. It was however described by some of the group as both enjoyable and a brilliant description of real situations and as such should be compulsory reading for 6th form students.

Conclusion: worth reading as a good and true illustration of life in rural Rhodesia and the problems of the white farmers. However, overall, a bit depressing.

PLANNING APPLICATION NEWS & UPDATES APRIL & MAY 2022



In this section you will find details of planning applications received, comments made by your Parish Council, and any updates on previous planning applications.

NEW PLANNING APPLICATIONS:

22/00780/APP Stoke Lodge, Lodge Lane, Stoke Hammond MK17 9BU

Erection of a single storey home office and gym/games building.

This was a redesign and relocation of a previously refused application. Following dialogue with the applicant and viewing comments made by heritage your PC had NO OBJECTION to this new application.

22/00917/APP 10 Harris Close, Bletchley MK3 5QH

Loft conversion with rear and front dormers.

It was felt that this conversion would be overbearing in size and be out of character to the rest of the building with privacy concerns for neighbouring properties, and for these reasons the PC OPPOSED this application.

21/04404/ADP Land to the East of Fenny Road, Stoke Hammond

Variation of condition for already approved planning for 64 new dwellings. As this application was for minor alterations to the design and landscaping for the already approved development, your PC felt there was no reason to oppose, so they had NO OBJECTION to this application.

22/01251/APP Rectory Farm, Newton Road, Stoke Hammond MK17 0EB

Erection of 336 sq. m. agricultural building to cover an existing silage clamp. It was noted from the application documents that this type of agricultural building would normally fall under permitted development, but because the siting of the building was less than 25 metres from a trunk or classified road, this is why planning permission had to be sought. Whilst the PC had NO OBJECTION in principle to the application, they wanted it noted that no slurry from this building should run towards the road.

PLANNING UPDATES:

21/00143/APP Three Locks Golf Club, Great Brickhill MK17 9BH Change of use for siting of 119 Lodge Style caravans.

Not actually in Stoke Hammond but something that would have a dramatic effect on the area. Not really an update, other then to say, since originally been submitted on the 14th January 2021, it is still awaiting a decision.

Dear Resident,

I am sure the increasing cost of living is impacting most of you reading this in some way. We have all noticed the rise in energy bills, fuel, food costs and the price of other essentials. For many people, this means revisiting household budgets, changing spending habits and generally tightening our belts. Sadly, for some households in Buckinghamshire, it's pushing them into a more serious financial situation.

We recognise this is probably the most important issue facing the people of Buckinghamshire at the moment so we have brought forward a package of measures with the aim of providing direct support for those who need it most, alongside more universal help to offset the general rise in living costs.

- We have begun paying the £150 national council tax rebates for householders in Band A-D homes, putting in place a scheme which allows us to do this as quickly as possible where other council areas are facing delays.
- If you live in a Band A-D property and pay by direct debit, you will be getting the £150 paid direct back into your bank if you don't pay by direct debit we will make contact with you directly to process the rebate.

We wanted to go beyond the national support with extra help too, so have introduced our own additional schemes for Buckinghamshire residents:

- We are making £150 payments to some households in Bands E-H in receipt of benefits such as Employment and Support Allowance.
- Under a further strand of Buckinghamshire Council help, the council is also topping up payments under both schemes through our Helping Hand programme, meaning some residents will also be eligible for an extra £25 payment on top of the other payments.

We have also agreed this week how an extra £2.4 million of vital funding for Buckinghamshire households in financial hardship will be spent. Use of the money will again be coordinated through our <u>Helping Hand service</u>, which is there to help families and individuals in the county who are struggling to afford food, clothing and other essentials.

Residents struggling with these costs can contact the council's Helping Hand service which can:

- Help with energy, cooking, lighting and water bills.
- Support with food costs through vouchers.
- Pay for household essentials such as sanitary products, boiler servicing, warm clothing.
- Help you find the right support that works for your circumstances.

£880,000 of the funding from the government's Household Support Fund has been allocated to provide food vouchers to families in need, including covering children's meals during school holidays if they are eligible for free school meals during term time. These digital food vouchers will also be available for Afghan and Ukrainian families who've arrived in Buckinghamshire as a package of wider support for these families under Helping Hand.

Our aim is to get support to people who need it as quickly as possible, so we've aimed to be pragmatic and practical, to try to provide support as widely as possible while at the same time getting help to the people who need it most.

Welcoming our new arrivals from Ukraine

The response from Buckinghamshire has been phenomenal and I'm so proud of how the people of our county have come forward to welcome families from Ukraine who've temporarily fled the conflict. We've seen among the highest numbers of visa applications under the Homes for Ukraine scheme of any area in the country.

The council has set up a new team to provide all support needed to help these families settle into life in Buckinghamshire, from finding suitable schooling and employment and providing practical and emotional support. So far, nearly 150 families have arrived in the county with more to follow and they are being supported by our Helping Hand for Ukraine scheme, which brings together all the strands of help mentioned above. We've got more than 100 staff volunteers also supporting this effort.

Bible verse of the month: *Mat 9: v 36-38:* ³⁶ When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. ³⁷ Then he said to his disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. ³⁸ Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.'

What does it mean?: This quote is about Jesus' life. Between his baptism and death he travelled through towns and villages in Judea



and Galilee teaching in synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing people's disease and illness. The disciples travelled with him to help and learn. There were always plenty of people who needed help, so Jesus told them they should "ask the Lord of the harvest to send out workers". The Lord of the harvest is God and whenever we need something – "harvesters for the fields" (the harvesters are those that preach and convert people, the harvest is people for God's kingdom) - we can ask God in prayer and he'll provide what we need.

Funeral information: You may wish to know that the Rector can conduct a funeral service at a local crematorium if your loved one prefers cremation. New rules mean that crematoria are now no longer offering a religious service by default: it has to be specifically requested by the family. Also, any resident of the village is entitled to have their ashes buried in the churchyard (for a small fee) if they wish.
