

## Use of Bouncy Castles

Bouncy castles, are permitted, and if to be used INSIDE the Community Centre they must be of a design/construction suitable for indoor use (maximum height 2.8m and with protective matting). The Community Association does not provide any insurance for the use of bouncy castles or any other form of inflatable or similar play equipment and cannot accept any responsibility whatsoever in the event of any accident. It is the responsibility of the hirer to make sure that the supplier has public liability insurance.

When booking, the hirer must state on the booking form that they intend to have a bouncy castle or similar inflatable play equipment, and the hirer must provide the Management Committee with the name and details of the supplier before the hire date. The Management Committee reserves the right to prohibit the use of the bouncy castle and or other play equipment, or to cancel the booking if appropriate evidence is not provided on request.

Should any damage be caused to the Community Centre fixture and fittings (ie: flooring, lights etc.) by the use of a Bouncy Castle or similar play equipment, the cost of damage will be retained from the hirers deposit and if greater than the deposit the balance will be sought from the hirer.

Should a hirer wish to place a bouncy castle or other play equipment on the land immediately to the rear of the centre, the hirer must indicate this on the booking form. All conditions regarding provision of the name and details of the equipment supplier/s are still applicable, as are recompense to the Community Association should any damage be caused to the land and or external features of the Community Centre.

It is the hirers responsibility to ensure that:

- The bouncy castle/inflatable/play equipment is inflated/erected by the supplier
- All guidance and instructions given by the supplier must be followed at all times
- A supervising adult must be in attendance throughout its use to monitor the children
- The number of children using the bouncy castle and or play equipment must be limited to the number recommended in the HireCompany's safety instructions.
- All children must be made to remove footwear, hard or sharp objects such as jewellery, buckles, pens and other similar pocket contents.
- Eating and drinking while bouncing or performing acrobatics must not be allowed.
