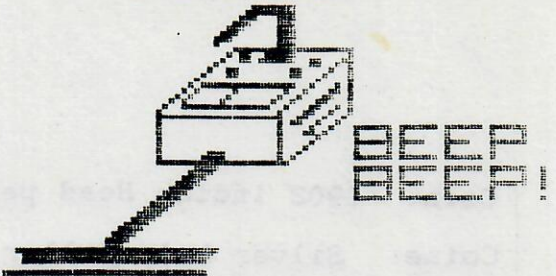

Artifact: Cast iron Journal cover from turn of century train found near Church Street Station area in Orlando by Jim Stoll.

Artifacts: No Entry. Handful of nails would have won it.

Odd: Rosewood/gold cigarette lighter found in St. Petersburg area by George Livingston.

Ends: Boy scout emblems, fishing weight, ring of keys, two pair of clippers, cigarette lighter, toy car found at various elementary schools by Bob Stackhouse.

FLORIDA TREASURE SITES

In 1848, Aaron Jernigan built a log house that served as a stockade during Indian uprisings somewhere along the shores of Lake Holden. W.H. Holden later purchased the house and it remained occupied to the 1930's. The Old Tampa Trail once ran alongside the section line of this property.

There was once a ferry stop at "Montgomery's Crossing" on the Wekiwa River. It's research time to find this one.

On Lake Osceola in Winter Park, a wharf & boathouse were built for the S.S. Capen at the foot of Canton Avenue during the 1890's.

An old hotel once stood near the Highland Park Landing, west of Deland, between the 1830's & 1840's.

Silver and gold coins have been washing up on the beaches opposite the Venice Airport. It seems a Spanish Nao wrecked offshore and the coins are thought to come off this wreck. I'll be down there at the time you receive this newsletter and if I find anything it'll be on the Find of the Month table for sure.
