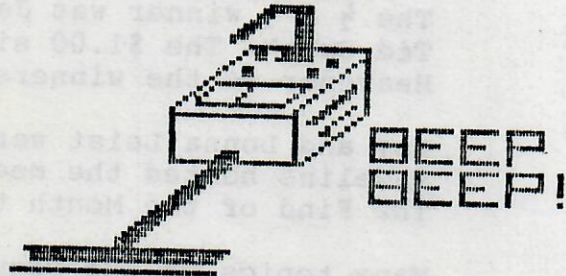

Directions: From the hotel go east on 192 approximately 4 miles then turn left on Boggy Creek Road. Follow Boggy Creek Road to SR 15, all intersections are marked by signs saying Boggy Creek or TO 15... At Narcoosee (SR15) turn left and follow signs to Moss Park. The park is about 45 minutes from the hotel.
