Lorrie presented Paul Swaney a "Fun Meter" of metal detecting sayings. She also noted that we will have an ice cream social at the August meeting. A list was passed

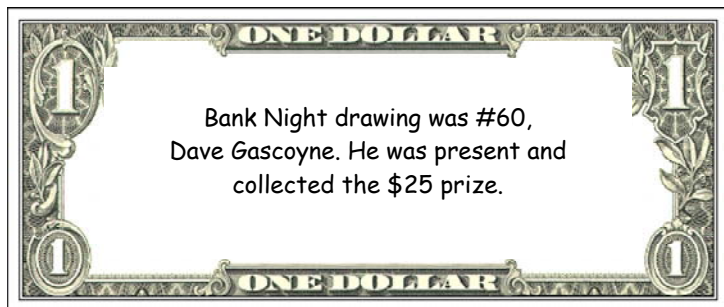
around for suggestions. Lorrie also told a story of finding her first "keeper" diamond ring. It was appraised at \$5400.

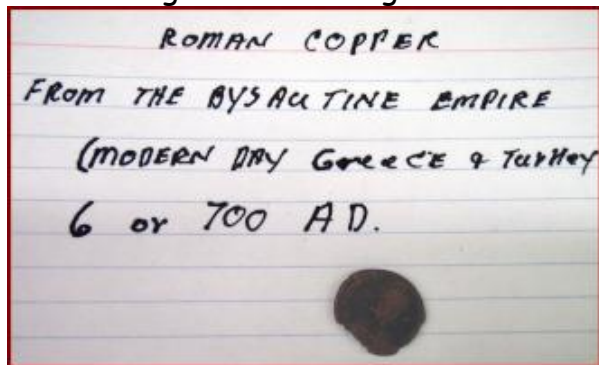
