December 24, 1931: New York City construction workers, at the future site of

Rockefeller Center, dragged in a 12-foot Christmas tree and ecorated it with tin cans and paper. The first official Rockefeller Center tree, with 700 blue and white lights, appeared two years later.

Electric Christmas tree lights were first used in 1895. The idea for using electric Christmas lights came from an American, Ralph E. Morris. The new lights proved safer than the traditional candles.








C.F.M.D.C. HALL OF FAME


