CFMDC Meeting Notes

The January 2011 meeting of the Central Florida Metal Detecting Club was called order at 7:30 p.m. by club president Alan James. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Bill Green.

Secretary report - read and accepted.

Treasurer report - read and accepted.

<u>Alan James - Old business from the floor:</u>

- <u>Cruise update</u> David Gray The September 3, 2010 reservation deadline passed without enough deposits received, and the deposit is currently \$250. For a double occupancy ocean view room the fee is currently \$1,514. If there is a tropical storm the ship will adjust its route. The port parking fee is payable by credit card or cash only. If you have an overnight stay the evening before, there are three hotels near the port that will transport you to the port for boarding and you will receive free parking for your vehicle while you are on the cruise.
