#### NEW DETECTOR FACT SHEET

The White's Sierra Super Trac (SST)

Developed by Jimmy Sierra and White's Electronics

Operates at 15 kHz

Weighs approximately 4 lbs.

10" elliptical DD coil comes standard. Uses all M6/MXT Pro/V series coils

Uses the body, screen display and 7-tone ID of the M6 series

Uses the same GAIN as the MXT

Uses the GMT Ground Balance system

No ability to control discrimination. Runs in a discrimination mode set at minimum (at about ALL METAL), so all 7 tones will be heard when using the detector

Only currently available through dealers in the Western states of Utah, Nevada, Arizona, California and Hawaii

Designed as a coin, ring and relic hunter in mineralized soils and on beaches


