# A Message From Our Club President

The Month of May puts the Central Florida Metal Detecting Club just a little closer to our Easter Seals Hunt Series to be held at Camp Challenge in Sorrento.

We will be holding hunts each Wed during the four week camper's sessions on 6/13/12, 6/20/12, 6/27/12, and July 5<sup>th</sup>. (July 5<sup>th</sup> is Thursday). On each of these days we will be holding three hunts per day. This will provide approx 200 kids & young adults with the opportunity to use a metal detector possibly for the first time. A great many of the campers at the Easter Seal Camp Challenge are physically or mentally challenged to varying degrees. These challenges may require CFMDC members to work one on one with each camper.

A major requirement from each participating club member will be the willingness to adapt as necessary to changing events as they unfold. We need to be ready to do whatever it takes to be certain the kids each have a great time.

Please consider signing up to be involved in as many of these Wednesday hunting events as possible. In addition, we will need to use our members personal Ace 150's or Ace 250's. We want all the campers to be using the same machine during the hunt. We will need a total of approx 15-20 detectors for this event. Please let me know if you have a detector

to loan during these hunts.

Don't forget that we are actively collecting items which can be buried as finds for this June/July hunt. Please keep in mind that these young hunters will be unearthing items for the first time and we want them to be excited with their new found treasures. Items such as toy cars, rings, foreign coins, etc would be very welcome.

On Saturday May 12<sup>th</sup>, we have been asked to assist in another evidence search. This is the day after our normal club meeting so I will have all the details at the meeting.

On Saturday May 19<sup>th</sup>, we will be hosting a club hunt at Lake Sylvan Park. This hunt has been opened to several of the surrounding metal detecting clubs. The start time for this hunt is 8:00 AM and it will end at about 10:00 AM. Cost for this hunt is only \$5.00 / each hunter. Our is intended to be a rather short hunt because it will take place prior to a Kellyco/Minelab event to be held the same day beginning at 10:00 AM until 4:00 PM.

## Website Of The Month

This month, we will look at another popular forum for metal detectorists on the web. Forums are a meeting place for detectorists from around the world to ask for advice, share ideas, and sometimes, argue the fine points of our hobby.

In addition to Treasurenet, another forum with a high level of activity is "www.Findmall.com." This forum is also free to join, but you must make a certain number of posts before you are allowed to sell items in their Classified Section.

One of the standout elements of this forum is how they have detector specific forums. Do you use a Minelab X-Terra? There is a specific forum just for X-Terra users. Do you want to research the Garrett AT-Pro? Then just go to the AT-Pro forum. For those who are curious about buying a unit, seeing how others are setting their machines, or seeing if others are having the same problems they are, this forum may be prove to be a great resource for information.

#### Treasure In The News!

On Friday, May 4, 2012, the last Canadian penny ever to be manufactured came down the chute and into a small glass bowl at the Royal Canadian Mint, marking the end of an era for the one cent coin.

Finance Minister Jim Flaherty joked that the copper colored coin was falling out of favor even when he was a child, and said that he remembered trying to throw a penny away because he could not buy anything with it.

Flaherty announced in March that the penny, which cost 1.6 cents to make, would be phased out, which would save Canada \$11 Million a year.

The existing coins will remain legal tender and must be accepted in transactions. Credit and debit transactions will still go down to a penny's value, but in cash transactions, retailers will start rounding up or down the tax-included price of items to the nearest five cents. Customers charged \$1.01-\$1.02 will pay \$1.00, while those purchases coming in at \$1.03-\$1.04 will pay \$1.05.

Other countries that have done away with their pennies include Australia, New Zealand, Brazil, Israel, and South Africa.
