THE LINCOLN PENNY

First introduced in 1909

The current penny weighs 2.5 grams and is .75 inches in width.

In 1943 the pennies were composed of steel due to the need for copper in World War II.

The heads side was designed by Victor David Brenner.

The current reverse in use since 2010 is the Union shield and was designed by Lyndall Bass.

From 1909-1942; 1944-1982 the penny was made of 95% copper.

Since 1982 they have been 97.5% zinc with 2.5% copper plating.
