## What's so great about John Major's Britain?

Major and Prince Charles, who have not experienced living on or near the poverty line or experienced long term unemployment to say we should not "talk Britain down". Mr Heseltine's white paper on the future of the coal industry provides little hope for thousands of min-

ers who will be made redundant over the next few months and join the army of 3 million who are already out of work.
