Nonprogrammed Decisions. ..

- Most of the decisions made by top managers involving strategy and organization design are nonprogrammed.
- Decisions about mergers, acquisitions and takeovers, new facilities, new products, labor contracts and legal issues are nonprogrammed decisions.
- Managers faced with nonprogrammed decisions must treat each one as unique, investing great amounts of time, energy and resources into exploring the situation from all views.
- Intuition and experience are major factors in these decisions.

Types of Decision Making

- *Programmed Decisions:* routine, almost automatic process.
 - Managers have made decision many times before.
 - There are rules or guidelines to follow.
 - *Example: Deciding to reorder office supplies.*
- *Non-programmed Decisions:* unusual situations that have not been often addressed.
 - No rules to follow since the decision is new.
 - These decisions are made based on information, and a manger’s intuition, and judgment.
 - *Example: Should the firm invest in a new technology?*

Programmed decisions are those that are repeated over time and for which an existing set of rules can be developed to guide the process. For programmed decisions, managers often develop heuristics, or mental shortcuts, to help reach a decision. Who makes non programmed decision? If, despite all this, profits are declining, it requires immediate decision-making and such decisions are non-programmed decisions. These decisions are taken by top-level managers. As we move up the organisational hierarchy, the need for taking non-programmed decisions increases. (4) Problem-solving decisions.

Non-programmed decisions

- Non programmed decisions are used for non- routine matters of an organization.
- They are unique in nature and every situation requires special attention.
- Non- programmed decisions are those decisions that are relatively unstructured and occurs much less often than a programmed decisions.

They are taken in the context of changing, dynamic environmental conditions. What is a non-programmed modern technique of decision making? What are unstructured non programmable decisions? Non-Programmed Decisions: These decisions are taken in unstructured situations which reflect novel, ill-defined and complex problems . The problems are non-recurring or exceptional in nature. Since they have not occurred before, they require extensive brainstorming. How does manager make programmed decisions? When making a business-related programmed decision, a manager takes only a short time to reach a conclusion because the situation is not new. Thus, programmed decisions help managers make consistently efficient choices. Managers make programmed decisions on a regular basis. What does nonprogrammed mean? Non-Programmed Decision. Programmed decisions usually relate to structured problems while non-programmed decisions are taken to solve unstructured problems. It is also to be noted that the programmed decisions are taken at the lowest level whereas the non-programmed decisions are taken at the highest level of the organization hierarchy. What makes bad decisions? All "bad" decisions are nothing more than those made from a place of contracted awareness. This type of thinking leaves us victim to the reactive mind.
