

RULES FOR TRACTOR PULLS

1. Tractors must be regular stock, single fuel only.
2. Dual tires or chains will not be allowed.
3. Top of draw bar cannot be over 21" from ground.
4. Wheel weights must not exceed 30' from front of tractor frame or wheels.
5. All pulls must start with a tight hook-up,
6. Drawbar pin must be at least 18' back axel center.
7. Operator must stay sitting down.
8. Tractors must stop if front wheels come off the ground more than 12"
9. No implements can be attached
10. Sub-frames of implements will be allowed if they do not exceed 30' in front of the tractor or nine feet wide and are bolted securely, such as a front-end loader
11. Nothing can be added, shifted, or taken off after the tractor and driver have been officially weighed-in
12. Tractors will be allowed a maximum of two weigh-ins
13. After the first weigh-in. the driver may adjust weights and re-weight, at a second weigh-in, driver must accept official weight
14. Tractors may only be entered in one class with one exception, A first place winner of each class, with the consent of the owner, may enter a heavier class.
15. All modified tractors must be equipped with electric safety switches, shatter shield over bell housing, and include safety rules of wheelie bars
16. The unit must be structurally sound, powered by one internal combustion engine 535CID gasoline, 671 Diesel
17. Multi-carburization, turbos or super-charges may be used
18. Total length must not exceed 14' axel to axel
19. Rubber tires to be used with no metal lugs or traction boosters
20. DOT Helmets must be worn when pulling
21. The add-on weights for modified tractors can be only factory weights and weight bars not to exceed 7,000 lbs. No additional type of weights will be used, such as; 50-gallon drums of sand, concrete blocks, etc.
22. These rules are in addition to the Rules and Regulations of the Farm tractor classes
23. The contest will be governed by the judges and all decisions are final
24. The judges have the right to stop/disqualify any contestant or tractor of operating in such a manner that would be considered unsafe
25. The officials of the fair are not responsible for any breakage or accident during the contest
26. All contestants enter at their own risk.
