
# The Word From Wiggins Community Church Volume 11 • Number 1 • January 2020



Pastor's Well, 2020 is here. I was talking with someone the other  $\mathit{votes}$  day and they, like I, always felt like 2020 was such a futuristic sounding year. I guess we are now in the future. In Philippians 3:13 Paul said he does not look at what lies

behind but strains to see what lies in front of him. In context he is talking about what he was compared to who he gets to be in Christ. I think the same can be true about the church as well. The past is...well, past. But the future is bright and full of all kinds of opportunities!

I thought it might be good though to take a quick look at 2019 before we examine some things that lie before us in 2020.

In 2019 we celebrated as 10 individuals made a statement of faith and were baptized and

we added 29 new members to the church roles. While I don't place a lot of value on increasing the number of people on the role of the church (placing them on the role in heaven is much more important) I do place value on what God is doing here and the fact that so many people see God at work here too. Plus I believe these 29 people have the great opportunity to grow in their knowledge and faith in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Over the course of 2019 we watched as our weekly attendance continued to grow as well. We have averaged 106 people in our weekly service. So far this year our Kingdom Kidz program, a ministry to the young adults age 3yr,-5<sup>th</sup> grade grew as well. An average of 60 children participated each Wednesday night along with many youth and adult leaders.

With sadness but with an eye towards heaven, we saw 9 of our members move from the bounds of earth to their forever home in heaven.

As 2020 unfolds we have great expectations for our youth. Our Sunday night youth program saw 27 at times and an average around 15-18 each week. We are looking forward to taking many of them to serve again at non-profits in the summer in Austin TX and Denver. Fund raising is a big part of what the youth need to do to help offset the cost of these trips.

Mark your calendar for VBS in 2020. It is scheduled for June 1<sup>st</sup>-4<sup>th</sup>. A trip in September to Peru is being discussed as well as many other mission opportunities locally and regionally.

As you think about Wiggins Community Church, please be praying about how God would have you support His mission through your time, your talents and your treasure. There are many ways to serve God's Kingdom. One of the strongest ways I would ask is for each of us to step up our prayers. Prayers for blessing but also prayers for protection. Satan's modus operandi has always been to kill, steal and destroy anything that God is doing on earth. It is no different for the church. Because we are seeing God's kingdom grow here and throughout the Wiggins area, Satan most assuredly will try and target us. But greater is He that is in us than He that is in the world. Prayers in this regard make all the difference. They bind Satan and pour out God's blessings upon the church. I would also ask that you pray for me, your Pastor, that I may teach the word as God lays it upon my heart, that I may minister to those in need, that I may disciple and lead the flock in a manner that is pleasing to the Lord.

Through my eyes, 2020 is looking very futuristic indeed. Great things are in store for us as we keep our eyes on the prize of knowing and lifting us Jesus.

#### **WCC Board News**

The WCC Board met for its monthly meeting on December 3rd. Joan Wilson and Donna Oleari were absent. The meeting was called to order by Giddeon Oleari at 6:36 PM. Pastor Darrel provided a short lesson for the board related to Growing in Godly Character. God calls us to be holy in all of our conduct as God is holy. The reference is from 1st Peter 1:15. Anger is growing around us, both nationally and locally. We need to know how to redeem the anger we have. We need to think about the praise we can give and dwell on those things. What do we think about in our minds? Speech is really important, the things that we say. What we take in plays a role. If all we take in is the world and not the Lord, then we can fall into an evil trap. We need wisdom, but what comes from Heaven. That will carry the good fruit that we need. The board compared what Godly wisdom vs. Ungodly wisdom looks like. Are we producing true wisdom through being with Christ?

Financial Secretary and Treasurer's Reports were provided by Sharon Ruyle. It was a good month overall as we averaged 108 attendance in the month, averaging 106 for the year. We brought in a total of \$12,892.76 for the month, including \$9980 in pledge and \$200 for the food bank. The profit/loss statement was also provided and we had a net income for the month of \$4301.78. The expense report showed a modest expenditure for the month, totaling \$7144.21 to

New business for the month included agreeing to a cash management system through the bank for control and access of the accounts. Also, pastor evaluations were discussed to show items that were considered of most importance to the board and congregation.
