Pastor's Notes I was reading the great theologian Charles Schultz a few weeks ago. The strip was dedicated to Snoopy and his views on life. As Snoopy was contemplating his life he thought, "What a beautiful sky." He then laid down on top of his

doghouse and let out a big sigh. "I must admit that I have a pretty good life...I have a nice home and I live in a nice neighborhood in a good country in the best of all possible worlds...and of course this is the time of day that I really like...SUPPERTIME!"

In walks Charlie Brown carrying Snoopy's supper bowl. Off to the side is Snoopy doing his favorite dance, the one pictured here, and he is singing, "Oh, it's suppertime! It's suppertime!"

At this point Charlie comments, "I'm sorry about this Snoopy, we're all out of dog food so I borrowed some cat food from the people next door." Snoopy looks at his dish with exasperation and in the next frame he is lying on his doghouse looking dejected and saying, "What a stupid life."

From the heights of contentment and happiness to the depths of rejection and despair in a matter of seconds. I thought Charles Schulz summed up very well how most people respond when unfavorable circumstances come into their lives. Why the dramatic change in one's outlook on life? Because peace and contentment in their lives is determined by their outward circumstances. Whatever is going on, good or bad, it is this that sets the barometer of happiness in their life.

This is in contrast to Paul who said, "I have learned be content in whatever circumstances I am in. I know how to get along with humble means and I know how to live in prosperity; in any and every circumstance I have learned the secret of being filled and going hungry, both of having abundance and suffering need. I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me." (Philippians 4:11-13) Pretty strong statement from a guy who is sitting in jail!

Throughout this letter to the saints in Philippi Paul constantly tells of the joy he has and not only this but he writes an encouraging letter to them while sitting in a cold, damp jail cell. How many of us could say that while hard circumstances are bearing down on us we still have joy and can even be an encouragement to those around us? I think we might tend to identify closer to Snoopy who becomes totally deflated by his physical circumstances.

What was Paul's secret to a joyful abundant life no matter what his physical circumstances? Christ. Knowing Christ, getting to know Christ and obeying Christ. In chapter three Paul says everything else in his life is but "garbage" compared to gaining more of an understanding and love of Christ. Christ was his source of strength and his source of joy.

I am not completely there yet myself. I do not always consider it joy when difficult circumstances come into my life (James 1:2). But I am getting stronger and more joyful in all circumstances and I know this comes as I continue to seek the Lord for He is the source of my joy. I hope you too are seeking Him because in this world we live in tough times will happen but in the midst of those times we can exclaim, "Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say again; Rejoice!" We can because we know Christ and He is our joy.

WCC Board News

The WCC Board Meeting took place on February 19th. New board members Glen Gray and Sharon Ruyle were present. The board approved both a new moderator, Giddeon Oleari, and a new vice moderator, Steve Sorenson. Board discussion about the continued growth of the Church. We have seen a lot of people step up and serve, and the need has been there. For example, we have 11 potential confirmands this year! Pastor Darrel reminded us to keep in prayer and always be searching for more ways to serve and grow God's kingdom. The Missions Committee visited the board and provided a presentation on 2018 happenings and future 2019 plans, including the potential for classroom bags for students, doing an adoption shower, and continuing the welcome bags for new visitors at the Church. This goes along with several successful activities in 2018. The Financial Secretary reported that in January, we had 479 attendants, averaged 120 for the month. Plate offering was \$1079.92 and the pledge so far is \$8036. We are also well up on income in comparison to January 2018 and hope for that trend to continue. Christian Education reported that January was a good month for Sunday School classes, the youth group had 16 participants in January, and Kingdom Kidz is back and still averaging 40. There was also an approved extension of maximum monthly hours for the director, and 50% down payment for a Youth Bible Camp. The board also reviewed and approved who will oversee bank accounts and be potential signers for all committee accounts. The next board meeting will be March 12, 2019. The Christian Ed committee is asked to attend the March meeting.
