
The Word

Pastor's

I have been reading, studying the Psalms and a recurring theme is about how God is David's, and our, refuge. As I have been contemplating and reading through the 41 times refuge is used in the Psalms I have come to the conclusion that being a refuge is so much more than being protected from an onslaught of a storm that is raging although it is that.

The original thought of refuge dates back to ships on the high seas and a storm or squall would come up. The captain of the ship would seek a harbor, a safe port or refuge from the storm. When it passed the ship would continue its voyage.

Again, while we know we can go to God in times of trouble. Psalm 46:1, "God is our **refuge** and strength; A very present help in trouble." As a refuge He not only protects us when a storm or squall comes into our lives but He also protects as we move forward into perilous times of trouble. <u>Psalm 18:2</u>, "The Lord is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer, My God, my rock, in whom I take **refuge**; My shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold."

I think this is so important to think about due to the perilous days Christians live in today. The society around us is no longer defining their lives, their businesses or their families by the values God has set forth in His Word and in a relationship with Him. We are being challenged on every side to change our values, exchanging truth for a lie, a lie formulated by man's thinking or lies created by Satan.

<u>Psalm 18:30</u>, "As for God, His way is blameless; The word of the Lord is tried; He is a shield to all who take **refuge** in Him.

I heard a preacher once ask the question that if you take a fish out of the ocean which is incredibly salty, how is it that you have to put salt on the fish after it is cooked. How was its flesh protected even though it spent its entire life in salt water? The fish was designed by God with thick skin and scales that protected it from the salt water it was immersed in.

Conversely even though we live in a society whose values are increasingly impure, we stay pure and protected as we move, live and have our being in God, our refuge. Acts 17:8.

<u>Psalm 31:19</u>, "How great is Your goodness, which You have stored up for those who fear You, which You have wrought for those who take **refuge** in You, before the sons of men!

<u>Psalm 34:8</u>, "O taste and see that the Lord is good; How blessed is the man who takes **refuge** in Him!"

WCC Board News

Wiggins Community Church had their monthly board meeting on April 9, 2019. The call to order was made at 6:41 and all were present minus trustee Donna Stahley. To start the meeting, a devotional was provided by Pastor Darrel. He brought Ephesians 4:11-13 into the center of focus. Darrel led discussion with the board that we are wanting to help the newer members of our Church get connected, find new volunteers, but also move the more Church-centered focus outward so people have fellowship outside the building as well. We want to know what kinds of gifts each person brings to the table and truly focus on a kingdom culture. John Lough provided a Sunday School and Youth Group financial report to reflect that financially, things have been on a positive trend the past year. The Youth Group account is at nearly \$1200 and the Sunday School account at \$1082.72. There was also discussion about the completed scholarship applications and how to divvy out the award money. It was determined that due to the amount of applications and where they are coming from, that it may be best to re-evaluate the process, revise it, and then make new guidance for flexibility within the scholarship committee. Two \$500 HS scholarships will be awarded this year. Attendance is on the rise again, averaging well over 100 for March. Discussion was had on the Treasurer's report on the Fifth Sunday donations, as a reminder that the food bank does currently receive the cash donations. However, the decision was made to move that donation this time around to the Youth Camp account as the food bank is doing well. The Christian Ed report showcased continued growth with the youth, this time having a youth group surpassing 20 youth on a Sunday night, 11 confirmands, and getting ready for what should be an exciting Confirmation dinner and ceremony at the end of April. Kingdom Kidz is wrapping up as well for the year. The board also motioned and approved conditional on a hard bid for \$5000 to install an air conditioner downstairs that would also feed to the choir room, cry room, and balcony. It was also discussed as new business the potential for Balcony Construction to help with seating as the Church continues to grow. The remaining funds needed for Youth Camp were also approved to be coming from the local missions account. The WCC Board will meet next on May 7th, 2019. The Buildings and Grounds committee is asked to attend


