

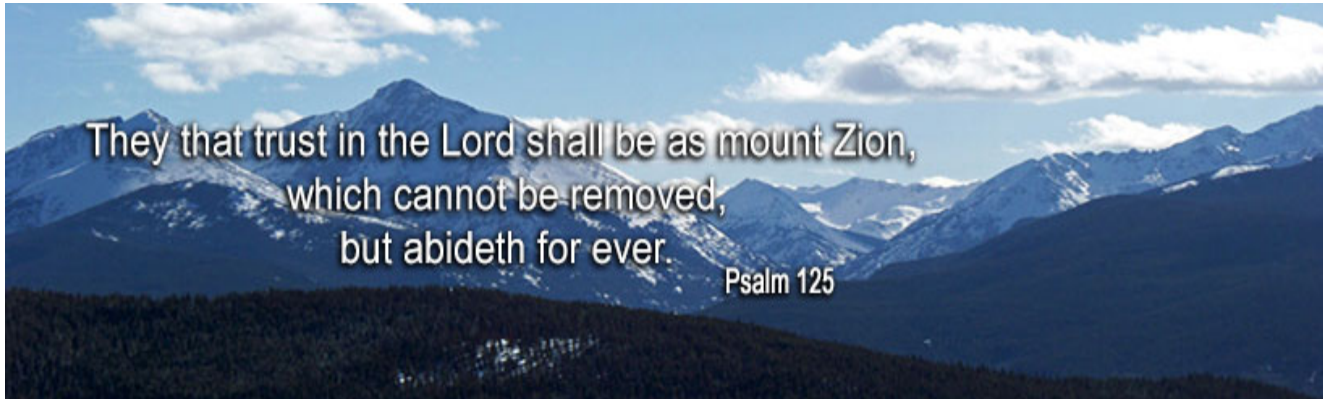

A believing Community that finds security in the Lord (Psalm 125v1-2)

The true people of God who believe in the Covenant God are likened to Mount Zion.

To trust the God of Zion is to be eternally secure.

Who do you know that is trustworthy? To have someone who is truly trustworthy means that you have a particular bond with that person. You can't trust a thief or a liar. But you can trust someone who has a track record of integrity, honesty, faithfulness, etc. So, in a very real sense, trust is only as good as the one you put it in.

God is trustworthy. These verses speak about those who trust God

The Lord is always with us. While we sleep, the Lord is awake.

In these days of uncertainty though we cannot see the path ahead of us with all its blessings and troubles, the Lord sees it and guides us through it with His love.

As Sovereign He rules the past and the present and we know He will rule the future.

Verse 1 describes the stability we have when we as Christians are trusting the Lord.

As Augustine said 'Trust the mercy of God. The present to His love and the future to His providence..

In verse 2 The people of God are assured of His protection.

Jerusalem is on a mountain surrounded by mountains. This gives a measure of security from attack. Jerusalem because of her strategic position was difficult to attack although over the centuries it was conquered. It is only when there is the 'New' Jerusalem (Revelation 21) will there be that complete protection for the Lord's people .

In the Old Testament under the Covenant of Moses Israel was promised protection as long as the children of Israel were obedient to the covenant. God promised them various material and physical blessings—on their crops, livestock, children, etc. Deut 28

The Old Covenant was very much concerned with earthly blessings, and physical protection was among them. Throughout the Old Testament, we see God protecting His people in order to bring His plans to pass.

It is important to understand that we are under the New Testament. God does not always promise to keep believers in Christ from all *physical* harm.

Yes there are times when the Lord in His mercy does protect us. In the Acts of the Apostles we read that Paul and Luke were saved from drowning off Malta. (Acts 27) There are certainly times when He does mercifully shield us from situations where we would sustain injury or loss. But today the emphasis in the New Testament is on God's promises to believers and these usually refer to *spiritual* protection.

God does a work in our lives, He quickens us and gives New Life and Saving Faith. We believe in Jesus Christ for salvation, with the Holy Spirit entering our lives. We are sealed for eternity and brought under God's spiritual protection from that moment on.

Our future is secure. We will have setbacks, maybe even backslide but this will in time make our lives miserable. But regardless of our future sins, or the schemes of Satan, we will never lose the salvation God has granted 2 Timothy 1v12.

There is nothing that can ever separate us from God's love. Romans 8v38-39

In addition, we are given freedom from the dominion of sin—we are no longer slaves to sinful thoughts, desires, and actions, but are born into a new life of holiness. Romans 6v22

God's promises

- To guard our hearts and our minds in Christ (Phil4v7)
- To provide strength and perseverance through difficult times. (Galatians 5 v22-23)
- Spiritual tools to fend off the devil's attacks. (Ephesians 6 10-17)

It is right and proper that we do pray for protection and healing from our loving God, as long as we realize that we are under His sovereignty.



We do not know what Paul's 'Thorn in the flesh' was but there are clues:

"To keep me from becoming conceited because of these surpassingly great revelations." So, God's goal in allowing the thorn in the flesh was to keep Paul humble. Anyone who had encountered Jesus and was commissioned personally by Him (Acts 2v8-9) would, in his natural state, become "puffed up."

Paul also says that the affliction came from or by a "messenger of Satan." Just as God allowed Satan to torment Job (Job 1v1-12 God allowed Satan to torment Paul for God's own good purpose.

Paul sought the Lord three times to remove this 'thorn' from him (2 Corinthians 2v8). But the Lord was more concerned with building Paul's character and preventing pride. Instead of removing the problem, whatever it was, God gave Paul more overwhelming grace and more compensating strength. Paul learned that God's "power is made perfect in weakness" (verse 9).

He knows we are strengthened by the trials that come our way, and in each physical trial, we are assured of His spiritual protection. So, rather than seeking complete physical protection from God, we can agree with James when he says,


"Consider it pure joy, my brothers, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance"

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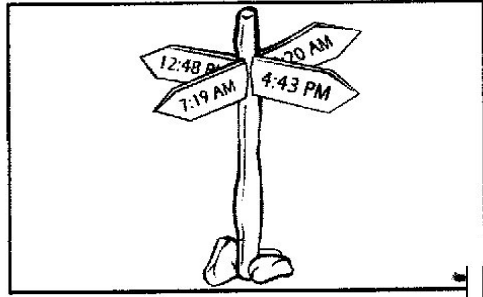
