

Being Church in Partial lockdown.

Sunday April 4th Easter

"I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live" (John 11:25).

At Easter time the contrast between Good Friday and Easter Sunday is stark. Sorrow becomes joy; death becomes life; the end becomes the beginning. As one of the early church Fathers, Clement of Alexandria, put it: 'Christ has turned all our sunsets into dawns,' The death and resurrection of Christ brings hope to a lost mankind struggling to make sense of the purpose of life and death.

During the Battle of Inkerman, a badly wounded British soldier managed to crawl back to his tent, where he died. Later, his body was discovered facedown, his bloodied hand resting on an open Bible. The blood had congealed and glued his hand to the page. When the hand was lifted, the letters on the printed page were clearly imprinted upon it: "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live" (John 11:25). The soldier was buried with these words still imprinted on his hand—we hope and trust that they had also been imprinted on his heart!

The gospel rests on the one who is the resurrection and the life. Christ's atoning death on the cross and his victory over the grave are the essential hope of all believers. In fact, the Apostle Paul said: 'If Christ is not risen your faith *is* futile; you are still in your sins!' (1 Corinthians 15:17). Sin has separated men and women from God and brought death and judgement upon us. If Christ has not risen there is no escape from sin's inevitable consequences. There is, however, a greater tragedy than this. The Bible shows clearly that Christ *has* risen, and yet there are those who still reject him and his offer of salvation. After uttering the words that were imprinted on that soldier's hand, the Lord Jesus went on to say: "And whoever lives and believes in me shall never die. Do you believe this?" (John 11:26). None of us know when our lives on earth will come to an end. Surely the wisest thing to do is to make certain of our salvation now through faith in the risen Christ. These words may not be imprinted on our hands, but let us make sure that they are imprinted on our hearts.


