Read Genesis 45

The reconciliation. I suppose one of the most moving stories in the bible is the story of Joseph's reconciliation with his brothers. After his brothers had sold him into slavery he had risen to the second most important person in the land. Now through a famine his brothers had come to Egypt to buy grain. They met Joseph but he chose not to reveal himself to them. God, through Joseph, was testing them to bring in circumstances to change them from a dysfunctional family to a covenant family that would become a great nation and herald in the Messiah.



When Joseph **finally reveals** himself to them, they draw near to him at his request (45:4), and he tells the story of God's work in his life, the story of Joseph from a divine perspective (45:4-15).

They had sold him into slavery, **but God had planned it** so that Joseph could go ahead and preserve their lives in the midst of the famine. God had a plan all along, and it was for the **salvation of His people**. It came because the party that was **sinned against was Joseph** who was willing to forgive his brothers.

Reconciliation involves two parties.

Joseph took the initiative as God takes the initiative when we are reconciled to Him.

"All this is from God, who reconciled us to Himself through Christ and gave us the **ministry of reconciliation**: that God was reconciling the world to Himself in Christ, not counting men's sins against them. And He has committed to us the message of reconciliation." **2 Corinthians 5v18-19**

The fact that we needed reconciliation means that our relationship with God was broken. Since God is holy, we were the ones to blame.

Our sin alienated us from Him. Romans 5:10 says that we were enemies of God:

"For if, when we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to Him through the death of His Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through His life!"

The brothers were alienated to each other. They had arguments with each other **thoughts of murder** which ended up with Joseph being **sold into Slavery.**

But because of the initiative of Joseph, they were able to be reconciled.

With such Grace (Unmerited favour) it was irresistible to refuse. Brothers condition was fear. For years they had come to realise they had done wrong. All they had strived for on their own had been smashed. The best they could hope for at the sight of this Prince of Egypt was Slavery or even a quick death.

God's irrestable grace, effectual grace.

The Brothers could have resisted, Joseph's call to come and be reconciled but although shocked they embraced the one who they had sold into slavery.

RC Sproul says

God's grace is so powerful that it has the capacity to overcome our natural resistance to it.

However, the idea of irresistibility conjures up the idea that

one cannot possibly offer any resistance to the grace of God. . Irresistible grace does not mean that God's grace is incapable of being resisted. It is not that the Holy Spirit drags people kicking and screaming to Christ against their wills.

The Holy Spirit changes **the inclination of our wills**, so that whereas we were previously unwilling to embrace Christ, now we are willing, and more than willing.

Indeed, we aren't dragged to Christ, we run to Christ, and we embrace Him joyfully because the Spirit has changed our hearts.

The brothers embraced Joseph, and the life they were to enjoy. At this time it would be a better life in Egypt than Canaan. After the Hebrews became slaves the reverse would be true.

This Covenant family God **guided to Egypt** and through **God's providence** was putting the whole family through circumstances that would lead to this point.

About ourselves

By God's regenerating work of the Holy Spirit, we no longer have hearts of stone that are impervious to the commands of God and to the invitations of the gospel.

God melts the hardness of our hearts as He did with the brothers. Joseph could see the change and they were reconciled.

By that **regenerating work** He makes us **new creatures**. The Holy Spirit resurrects us from spiritual death, so that we come to Christ **because we want to come to Christ**.

The reason we want to come to Christ is because God has already done a work of grace in our souls. Without that work, we would never have any desire to come to Christ. That's why we say that regeneration precedes faith.

Summary

Joseph is a type of Christ.

Joseph was enslaved by the hand of his brothers, but it ended up with the Salvation of his brothers. Jesus suffered that we might be saved. It was Jesus who under God's providence, gave His life that we might be rescued from our sins. Jesus was crucified by the hand of men but was really and truly crucified according to the plan of God for the salvation of all who believe?

This Jesus, welcomes and encourages us, too, and envelopes us with His love and embrace as we come to Him with repentant faith.

We believe, that the work of regeneration, conversion, sanctification and faith, is not an act of man's free will and power, but of the mighty, efficacious and irresistible grace of God.
