


Pastoral Transition By Pastor Amy Jo Bur

I am honored by the invitation to preach during the Good Friday worship service at the Cathedral of Our Merciful Saviour.

It is the tradition of Fourth Avenue UMC to receive a special Easter offering in celebration of the resurrection of Christ.This year the Easter offering will be designated 50% to apportionments that support shared ministry in the UMC and 50% to a local mission: Ridgeview Heights, a new affordable and emergency housing development being developed by the Community Action Center. Ridgeview Heights anticipates groundbreaking in 2025 for two emergency housing units and six affordable, market rate housing units.This development responds to urgent community needs for both emergency housing and affordable housing. I encourage you to generously support both of these missions to reach out with Christ's love to those in need.

As Easter approaches, I hope that you will also reflect on the question: "Who needs to know?" Who needs to know about the new life that comes through Jesus Christ? Who needs to know about the power of loving community to overcome isolation? Who needs to know about the unending love of God? As you reflect on this question, perhaps the Holy Spirit will surprise you with some of the answers and prompt you to invite others to join us for Easter worship, as we celebrate the gift of new and eternal life. Happy April! Hope you're all enjoying our winter roller coaster. So amazing how time flies, soon we will welcome our friends home from down South.






