

In our United Methodist tradition, the lay people of the church are empowered to lead in these ministries of Christ's outreaching love. As we anticipate a pastoral transition this summer, I encourage the people of Fourth Avenue UMC to continue our momentum for mission, knowing that our new pastor will be excited to join in with us, bringing new strengths of leadership. Strong lay leadership is one of the wonderful parts

of the United Methodist tradition, growing out of a history where one pastor had a circuit of many churches where they administered the sacraments, and lay leaders moved forward the mission of the church in the day-to-day.

As we think about the pastoral transition, it is good to remember some of the strengths of the United Methodist tradition of itinerant clergy. Within our itinerant clergy system, the bishop and Conference Superintendent are able to consider the leadership needs of each congregation and match the pastoral appointment with clergy whose gifts and experience are helpful in that specific context. The SPRC committee meets with the Conference Superintendent to share our congregation's profile, which helps to inform the process. During the appointment process, I will be praying for our Conference Superintendent and bishop. I encourage you to join me in those prayers. May the Spirit of God continue to bless us and empower us for mission together.

On behalf of SPRC, information regarding Pastor Amy Jo's new appointment was communicated to the congregation. While this news is unfortunate for 4th Ave UMC, it serves to us all that God is constantly working in a wide variety of ways. The phrase "God works in mysterious ways" is a reflection on the nature of divine action. This idea is rooted in faith, inviting believers to trust in God's ultimate plan, even when it seems unclear or unfortunate. What might seem like an unfortunate event may, in hindsight, be seen as a step toward personal growth, spiritual awakening, or a greater good that was not initially apparent. It is in this trust that believers find peace, knowing that whatever happens is part of a greater design, even when the reasons remain hidden from view.

Rest assured the SPRC team will be working with DS Michelle Hargrave on the appointment process to identify another appointee for 4th Ave UMC. The timing of this situation is in line on the calendar for the overall appointment process within the UMC conference which opens up all candidates to our congregation. Lastly, Amy Jo is not leaving until June and will remain our pastor in providing our faith leadership and spiritual growing.

I am attaching a note for clarification:

It is the intention of Bishop Lanette Plambeck to appoint me to Centenary United Methodist Church, and I affirm this decision. The appointment will be a very good match for my spiritual gifts, training, and experience. I will complete my pastoral leadership in Faribault during June and begin the new appointment on July 1. I give thanks for the ministry and love for mission of Fourth Avenue UMC— it has been inspiring to be your pastor while you have reached out to others with the love of Christ. I encourage us all to pray for our congregation, Conference Superintendent, and bishop during this time of pastoral transition. Please join me in a spirit of prayer: Almighty God, we pray for the church, here in Faribault and around the world. Fill us with your spirit and empower us to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. During this time of transition, we pray for the next pastor whose heart you are already preparing for pastoral leadership in Faribault. Bless them and fill them with your wisdom, strength, compassion, and joy.

We pray also for our Conference Superintendent, Rev. Hargrave, and Bishop Plambeck— bless and guide their ministry as they appoint clergy to serve in Minnesota. Amen.

Mission Team:




Let's continue to be the hearts and hands of Jesus this Lenten season and every day. Thank you, everyone!
