A Time to Renew My/Our Commitments

.... as for me and my family, we will serve the Lord." -Joshua 24:15

Dear Fourth Avenue UMC Friends,

We have survived three years of whiplash! Let me explain. When I think about the last three years, I see three major crises have collided to disrupt our church's life and relationships with each other.

First, our *denominational* stress. The United Methodist Church's longstanding contentious debates about theology, and in particular, the issue of human sexuality was not satisfactorily resolved by the specially called General Conference 2019. Now, the prospect of a denominational divide has caused angst among members of our church family. People we know well and love deeply simply have different views.

Second, *the pandemic and its aftershocks*. The Covid crisis made it impossible to worship together and gather socially in person and put distance into our relationships with each other. The longer the crisis lingered, the more our faith in God took a hit and our bond with each other loosened. Our spiritual muscles have atrophied, and it requires a significant effort to get back into shape spiritually and relationally.

Third, *as your pastor I suffered a personal crisis*. Beginning in the fall of 2019, my personal life was turned upside down as I experienced a failing marriage and a divorce. I felt like I was treading water to stay afloat. My personal grief over the situation negatively impacted my passion, sapped my energy for ministry and diminished the relational bond between the church family and myself. I simply had to pull away to seek healing for myself. I will always be grateful for the way that you stuck by me and showed your support.

In addition to these three factors, there were many events, issues and forces in our country making the whole situation worse. It was the perfect storm, but we leaned into our faith and the Lord has seen us through.

We are survivors! God has sustained us through this incredibly challenging season and we are coming back. The Church is now fully open and there is life and well-being among us. There is joy in the house as we gather to worship, reconnect with each other and welcome newcomers into our midst. The cobwebs in our faith are clearing and a breath of new life is animating our body. The specter of Covid lingers in the background, yet it no longer is the dominating concern. Our attendance continues to rise and is getting stronger.

My personal sadness has given way to great joy and contentment with my courtship and marriage to Rebekah. She has brought new life to me and the church with her infectious personality, personable nature and the ministry she offers. Recently, the Church Council made the decision to put a pause on any discussion about our church's trajectory with regards to the denominational divide so that we can unite, grow in faith, deepen our bonds as a family in Christ, embrace the newness of life God is bringing and learn new skills, try new things and pray big bold prayers. God is with us and for us and has promised a future with hope as we daily lift up in our church's Breakthrough Prayer.

And so, we stand at a crossroads. I/we have a choice to make. To lean into our common faith and move forward in confidence and optimism or shrink back in fear and discouragement. When I arrived in 2017, I believed the remainder of my ministry would be here among you. Now, in 2022, with fresh eyes, I see my life in Faribault for a long time. I am renewing my commitment to serve among you as pastor for the foreseeable future. I am committing myself to be a pastor to our entire church family regardless of our differing viewpoints. And I am committing myself to do my part to rebuild our pastor/people bond. And I invite you to commit yourself anew to God, to me and to one another. I believe God will bless this commitment. I believe *the time is now* to pray for a stronger future and work together to build a vibrant Christian community.

By God's grace, we have survived. By God's grace, we will thrive.

Are YOU Ready to Serve?

One of the current priorities of the Ad Council is to reinstate the Nominating Committee which had dissolved over the past couple years due to the pandemic.

During the last couple of months, a plan has been set in place and soon the Nominating Committee will gather to identify possible volunteers for our committees. As fall approaches, someone from the Nominating Committee may be contacting you to serve. We will post the names of the Nominating Committee in an upcoming newsletter.

To you current committee members, many of you may have served the standard three years but will be asked to remain on your committee as we get on track with the protocol of replacing only part of the committee each year.

To all of you committee members, thank you for your willingness to serve your church.

Meeting with Rev. Susan Nienaber

On July 13 Rev. Susan Nienaber, Director of Church Vitality for the Minnesota Conference, visited our church to provide an opportunity for the congregation to learn more about the current status of the UMC regarding the conflict over the question of human sexuality. The meeting was well attended by our congregation.

Rev. Nienaber provided a brief history of what has led up to the current schism within the UMC denomination. She then listened to comments from those in attendance and answered questions that had been submitted prior to the meeting. She highlighted 3 questions that most congregations ask:

1) Will a church be required to accept an LGBT pastor? The answer is no. The leadership team will work with the congregation to determine what would be best for their church and will not be obligated to accept an LGBT pastor.

2) Will a pastor be required to perform a same sex wedding ceremony if his/her theological belief is contrary to that marriage? The answer is no. Pastors will not be required to perform a same sex wedding ceremony.

3) Will a congregation have to allow for same sex marriage ceremonies to be held in their church? The answer is no. Congregations can work together to determine if they will or will not allow same sex marriage ceremonies to be held in their building.

Another question she addressed that has been asked within our congregations is "Why have we not voted whether to stay in the UMC or disaffiliate (leave) while other congregations have decided?" Susan provided 3 examples of why some churches have already voted:

1) A church in Barnum, MN has a congregation which is and has been, as a whole, traditional. They have known it is best for their congregation to disaffiliate and were able to vote.


2) A church in White Bear Lake, MN has a congregation which is not so traditional in their belief and knew they would stay within the UMC.

3) A church outside of Rice, MN is a church with a divided viewpoint on the issue at hand. They are a growing church, that serves a broad area and brings in many young families. Although they have differing views they have decided rather than have the issue be a catalyst for division, they would focus on who they are, what the mission of their church is and how best they can serve their community. They will also remain in the UMC at this time.

Each of these churches were able to come to a consensus of where they want to be. As noted in a recent letter sent to you, the leadership team of FAUMC was not able to determine if there was a clear path for our congregation at this time and a vote now would cause more harm than good. We are a church with various viewpoints and to avoid a division within our congregation felt it wiser to step back and take time while we identify who we are as a whole congregation, what our mission is and how we can best serve our community. We will be working with Rev. Nienaber to accomplish this. Please note she is also a licensed mediator and consultant so is well qualified to provide guidance on our journey. There will be more information sent out in the next few weeks on how the congregation will be invited to share in this process. Continued from previous page

Please note there were other questions/concerns submitted in the box that Rev. Nienaber did not have time to address. Those are under review and we plan to address them in future newsletters. They have not gone unheard.


Do you like to take pictures on your
