Heaven and Nature Sings—300 Years of "Joy to the World"

Make a joyful noise to the LORD, all the earth; break forth into joyous song and sing praises. Sing praises to the LORD with the lyre, with the lyre and the sound of melody. With trumpets and the sound of the horn make a joyful noise before the King, the LORD. -Psalm 98:4-6



Dear Faribault: Fourth Avenue UMC Friends,

This year marks the 300th anniversary of the penning of the lyrics to a treasured song we love to sing at Christmas "Joy to the World." The beloved Christmas classic was written by the English composer, poet, and pastor Isaac Watts (1674-

1748). You'll find several well-known hymns written by Watts in our church's hymnal. His works are still being printed in books, downloaded online, projected onto screens, and sung by Christians throughout the world.

The inspiration for Watts' hymn comes his interpretation of Psalm 98:4-6 and 96:11-12 and Genesis 3:17-18 which point to the second coming of Christ when "the Savior reigns" and "He rules the world with truth and grace" and "God's blessings flow far as the curse is found." It gives voice to our longing for that glorious final day when the "nations will prove the glories of His righteousness and wonders of His love."

Some interesting background. Watts was raised in a deeply religious family, the son of a pastor. His parents saw to it that their love for Christ and His word were passed on to their son. Isaac showed promise as a poet at a very young age with a propensity for rhyme, much to his father's chagrin. As he grew, he became increasingly unhappy with the hymns that he sang in church each week (sound familiar?). When at 18 years of age, he criticized the hymns of the church. His father said, "If you don't like the hymns we sing, then write a better one!" And so, Isaac did just that. He began preparing a new hymn every Sunday for his father's church, single-handedly revolutionizing the congregational singing habits of the English Churches. Eventually he wrote the Christmas classic that Christians have now been singing all over the world for three centuries.

Our worship themes for the Advent and Christmas seasons will be based on phrases from Watts' well-known lyrics. You will find the sermon titles and

accompanying scriptures on p. 4 in this Fourth Teller. Let me encourage you to include these weekly scripture readings and the lyrics of Joy to the World in your daily pattern of prayer and meditation upon God's Word.

Watts invites us to sing a new song and it is a powerful cosmic performance of all creation being renewed and freed. Rather than "joy" being yet another word for happiness, we discover that the depths of joy can be found especially in the midst of suffering, the work of justice, and the presence of compassion-all part of the coming of Jesus to this world and a message that we and our world so desperately need.

Though Watts likely never envisioned his song being sung at Christmas, it's adoption into the collection of carols is a wonderful tribute to its power in the lives of people. Indeed, the humble coming of Jesus as a baby is a glimpse of his majestic coming again. Christ's birth as well as his promised return are "good news of great joy that will be for all the people." This we proclaim as we sing one of the most exuberant, beloved, and popular songs of the season.

For a season filled with joyful singing in our hearts, in God's Church, and in the world God so loved that he gave his only Son, I am sincerely yours,


