Dear Fourth Avenue UMC Friends,

OFFICE HOURS

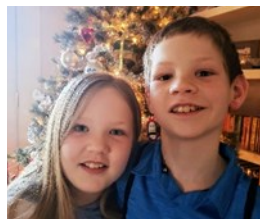

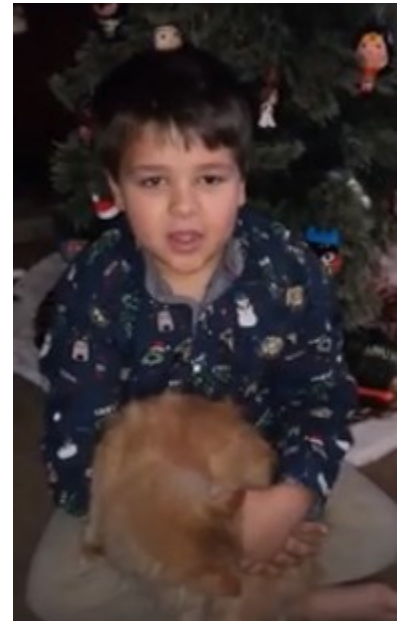
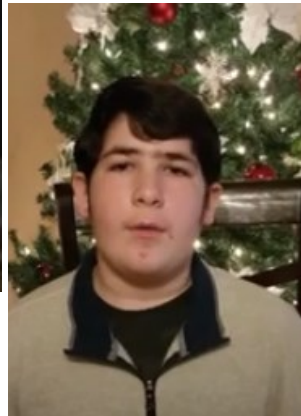


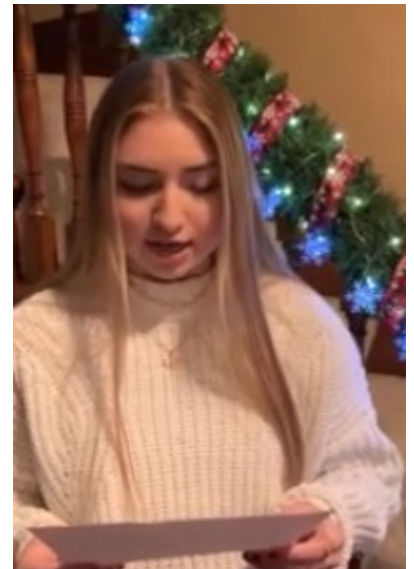
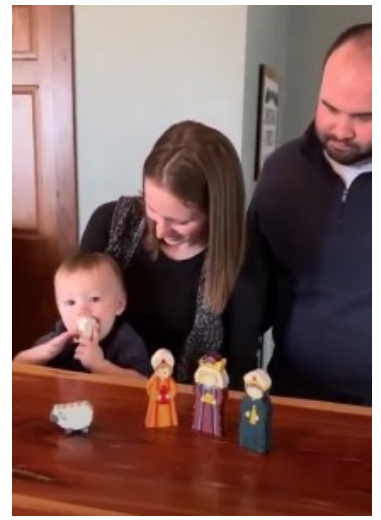
A MESSAGE FROM ANNETTE DAY & FAMILY

Two of his children were married during his time in Faribault and the family remains thankful for the hospitality shown the family. Rev.
