The Name Above All Other Names: Jesus, the God Who Saves



Dear Fourth Avenue UMC Friends,

Jesus. There's just something about that name. A name that comes with ease to the lips of one of his disciples in devotion and prayer and in conversation with other believers. The name, as Charles Wesley writes in his famous hymn, "charms our fears and bids our sorrows cease, 'tis music in the sinner's ears, 'tis life and health and peace." The only name, the evangelist Luke says in Acts 4:12, under heaven given among [humanity] by which we must be saved." "The name," the Apostle Paul, writes in his letter to the Philippians 2, "above all other names." There's just something about the name of Jesus.

In the nativity narratives of the Gospels of Matthew and Luke were first introduced to the name of Jesus. In the Annunciation, the angel Gabriel speaks to the Virgin Mary of her conception by the Holy Spirit and carrying in pregnancy to the birth of the Messiah. *You will become pregnant and have a son, and you are to name him Jesus*. (Luke 1:31) Joseph, the betrothed of Mary, encounters an angel in a dream directing him to go ahead with his marriage to Mary and assuring him that the Child is not from infidelity but of the Holy Spirit and says, "And she will have a son, and you are to name him Jesus, before he will save his people from their sins." (Matthew 1:21) On the night of his birth, angels proclaimed to lowly shepherds the purpose of the Child, "I bring you good news of great joy for everyone! The Savior – yes, the Messiah, the Lord – has been born tonight in Bethlehem, the city of David! (Luke 2:10-11)

And in obedience to the word of the Lord to both Mary and Joseph independently, the newborn baby in Bethlehem's manger is brought to the Temple to be circumcised and is given the name Jesus, translated from the Latin, "Yeshua" or Joshua in Hebrew. The name Jesus in that era was a very common name for Jewish boys and in true biblical fashion the name of Jesus holds great meaning for the life purpose and character of the person who bears the name. Like the man raised up to succeed Moses and lead the children of Israel to the Promised Land, Jesus is the new "Joshua" who comes to lead his people into the fullness of the Promised Land of heaven, eternal life, and human flourishing. Yeshua means "God saves." In the very conception, birth and naming of Jesus, the Son of God, he is proclaimed as Savior.

As we begin a new year, calling upon the name of Jesus, we can know God's very present saving help in all of life's circumstances. In Jesus Christ, we have One who has come to lead us from where we are in as pilgrims in this world, sojourners in the wilderness to the land of Promise, to life in the kingdom of God, eternal life, and human flourishing in the here and now. On this path, even death is not ultimately a foe to fight against, but a friend to embrace when our time comes. We can know we are never alone. We are God's beloved child and we are surrounded by brothers and sisters as companions on the journey. By his sacrificial death on the cross, we are freed from any condemnation we may feel, any guilt that gnaws away at our spirits. We know our sins are forgiven. With his grace, we can amend our life and make amends to those we have wronged. We are set free to love a new life.

And we can take a risk and dare to try something new and learn something new without being held captive by the fear of failure. We just may not succeed, but our lives won't be diminished. We can embrace life knowing God is with us and for us and his plans are for our good, for a future and hope, and invite God to lead us into the new year on an adventure. As we enter 2023, claiming Jesus as Savior is a game changer.

Christian author and pastor Max Lucado penned these words years ago and they bear our meditation:

If our greatest need had been information, God would have sent us an educator.

If our greatest need had been technology, God would have sent us a scientist.

If our greatest need had been money, God would have sent us an economist.

If our greatest need had been pleasure, God would have sent us an entertainer.

But our greatest need was forgiveness, so God sent us a Savior.

YOU made a difference in so many young peoples' lives in our community. Thank you all for your generosity!


Yeti Mugs

Thank you to the Bequest and Gift/ Mission Committees for funding this project.






Rice County's Emergency Foster Care Program
