Dear Fourth Avenue UMC Friends,

It was a truly blessed day! One of the most joyful and significant days of my life. On Saturday, June 11, my beloved Rebekah and I were united in marriage before the altar in our church's sanctuary before an overflow crowd of witnesses. The worship space was decorated lovingly, simply and elegantly with lit candelabras, new wedding banners, a newly minted and hemmed white cloth on the communion table, and a handcrafted kneeling bench for the nuptial celebration. The presence of God was deeply felt and devotion to God was palpable throughout the prayerful celebration.

We were literally surrounded by the love of family and friends as the worship space was filled to overflowing in every section. The instrumental music from the Koopmann family from Motley, MN lifted the spirits of the gathered body and accompanied our collective voice raised in song rejoicing in God's goodness and faithfulness to the glory of God. As the newly married couple, Rebekah and I walked joyfully down the aisle to Handel's *Hallelujah* amidst voices that broke out in the lyrics of the classic work. And as we left the Sanctuary for the front steps, we were serenaded by the carillon bells as wedding photos were taken with our church's historic, stately Greek columned building as the fitting backdrop. For Rebekah and me, the worshipful wedding celebration in our church's sanctuary was the fulfillment of our highest hopes for our wedding day.

And there's more. My dear friend, seminary classmate, and Christian brother Bill Ivins, pastor at St. Paul UMC in Amarillo, TX, presided over the worship celebration with the perfect balance of faith, humor, joy, dignity and truth. His sermon entitled, "*A Divine Design*" was a masterpiece in the application of God's Word from Ephesians 5:21-33 and his leadership over the rituals and celebration of Holy Communion was nourishing to all. Before the wedding, a men's prayer gathering was held in our church's chapel. Christian men from near and far who have walked with and supported me along my life's journey gathered to shower me with powerful, heartfelt, Word-centered, Holy Spirit drenched prayers as I knelt before the communion rail. As the meeting closed in ample time for the wedding proper, my 83-year-old father addressed the men assembled, "*This was a profound experience!*"



At the rehearsal dinner the night before, wedding participants and out of town guests gathered for a sweet evening. Rebekah and I were able to go around the room and briefly introduce each person and share a bit of our relationship with the guests. My brother and sisters presented me a very special gift - a framed black and white photo from the collection of my parents wedding photos from August 25, 1962. This particular one of my parents in the car carrying them from the church has been among our family's favorites for years. Tearfully, I went around and shared it with all the guests noting that had my mother been alive, my parents would have celebrated their 60th anniversary this coming August. Inspired by that gift, Rebekah and I staged a similar photo the next day in the Cadillac that had carried Rebekah to the church and would carry us from the church to our formal reception.

And then, there was a joyful reception in our Church's Fellowship Hall. Many joined in decorating the hall in Rebekah's favorite colors and accents and assisted in serving the voluminous gathering of guests. What a diverse gathering of our two families and friends, fellow Rotarians (where Rebekah and I met), church friends from FAUMC and River Valley, people from my past congregations, fellow clergy and spouses, and other community members. The Lakelanders Barbershop Chorus (with whom I sing) were there in full force to entertain delightfully. There was a wonderful buzz in that room as a diverse gathering of dear people mingled and swapped stories with one another.

It was a most blessed day, the culmination of an incredibly beautiful and healing season in my life. The flowering of a special and unexpected friendship, a joy-filled courtship and engagement, a season of becoming acquainted with one another's family, the integration of Rebekah into our church family, and our beautiful wedding day gathering with so many beautiful, loving, and precious people from different places and walks of life. I am so grateful for your faithful walking with me through a personally challenging season and Rebekah and I are so grateful to God for the ways you have showered us with love, kindness and prayer throughout our journey. We covet your ongoing prayers as we adjust to one another and grow and mature in our marital life and love.
