The Problem of Practical Atheism



"And He did not do many miracles there because of their unbelief."

Matthew 13:58

Dear Fourth Avenue UMC Friends,

The Christian Church in America is plagued with the problem of *practical atheism*. Let me explain such a provocative statement. It goes without saying that we believe in God. But what kind of god do we believe in? Do we really believe that God can move mountains? Do we believe that God is still working miracles? Does God still raise the dead and heal the sick? Does Jesus Christ change hearts and save souls? Open doors that have been deadbolted shut? With all our technological and medical advances and material prosperity and declining moral character and cultural assault on apostolic biblical Christianity, it seems that our faith has taken a hit. For all intense purposes we have lost a robust faith in God, at least in the one true God revealed in the Bible and proclaimed by the Christian Church for 2000 years. Practical atheism.

Jesus encountered the same kind of anemic faith in his day, too. Matthew reports in his gospel (13:53-58) that when Jesus went to his hometown to teach, his wonder-working power could not be on full display because of the lack of faith among the people. What a sad scenario. They were astonished by his words, but they did not respond in obedience and faith. Their lives could have been radically changed for the better. Their community could have been radically changed. However, no positive changes occurred in the people or the town of Nazareth. Why? Matthew gives the reason, "Because of their unbelief."

Unbelief shuts the door on the transformational power of Jesus. Faith opens the floodgates to that same transformational power. In contrast to this passage of Scripture are countless others where Jesus worked miracles in response to the faith present in the lives of people. (Read Matthew 9:2; 9:22; 15:28; Mark 10:52; Luke 8:48)

What is the state of our personal faith? When Jesus looks at our lives what does He find? Does he find a posture of believing faith? Or does he unearth a latent unbelief below a veneer of general belief?

And what about the faith of our congregation? Do we believe Jesus can do a work of renewal and revitalization in our church? Do we believe He desires to do so? Does he have the power to make something good and holy happen? Do we believe enough to pour out our souls to him with reckless abandon trusting him to hear us and respond by showing us a move of his hand? Honest assessment must precede true progress.

Today, God is confronting our practical atheism and calling us to bold, believing, biblical faith. And I believe that God is not through with us or our church. I believe that God is calling us to a deeper and stronger faith through the *40 Days of Prayer*. A faithful prayer that we might begin to pray is, "I do believe, Lord. Help me overcome my unbelief." (Mark 9:24) If we pond in humility to recognize that our faith needs a lifting and shoring up, we can confess the sin of unbelief and ask God to restore and build us up in faith. I am confident that God will draw near to us. God will surely honor that prayer and answer it with an awakening and strengthening of faith for God rewards those who sincerely seek him (Hebrews 11:6). Together, let us seek God for a renewed faith and revitalized Church.

ASH CROSSES

With Covid concerns this year, we found a creative way to administer ashes for Ash Wednesday. For those who attended the in-person worship service that day, we provided burlap squares etched in the sign of the cross in ash. Burlap and ashes are reminiscent of the wearing of sackcloth and ashes in the Old Testament to denote a sorrow for sin. Ashes remind us of the words spoken to penitents as they approach for the imposition of ashes, "Remember you are dust and to dust you will return" and are created through the burning of palm branches from Passion/Palm Sunday from the previous year.

The burlap squares with ash were created by Sharon Nelson, Tena Harren, Jan Barbo, and Pastor Greg. If you did not receive one, you may pick one up in the Annex on an upcoming Sunday or at the church office during office hours Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday.

LIVE STREAMING PROJECT

Jim Heyer, Kathy DuChene, Grant and Lauri Lammin and David Goebel have been studying, researching and heavily involved in this project. Websites from other churches were reviewed as well as contacts made with other churches for questions and to receive their suggestions, guidance, etc.

Our first step was to change over our existing phone and internet provider from Century Link to Spectrum. Ethernet cable has been run from the janitor's room in the lower level to the church office and to the sanctuary. New routers have been purchased as well as a new camera and laptop. The proper licensing is being put in place.

Work continues on the project. Our goal and end result will enable us to "live stream" worship services, funerals, etc. You will be able to watch online and see the same thing the sanctuary worshippers see and hear--at the same time. You will be able to see the service from where ever you might be--on vacation, out of state, etc. as long as you have an internet connection.










Memorials



Our sympathy to Bonnie Hammer and Family on the death of her husband, **Dr. Robert E. Hammer.** Bob was born August 7, 1931 and died on February 17, 2021 at Milestone Senior Living in Faribault at the age of 89. He enlisted in the USAF in 1950 and received an Honorable Discharge in 1953. He earned his Bachelor and Master's Degrees from the University of Houston, Houston, Texas and his PhD Degree from the University of Iowa, Iowa City, Iowa. He worked for 32 years as Chief Psychologist at a state psychiatric hospital in Iowa. In addition to his clinical work, he maintained a private clinical and counseling practice.

Bob was very active in each community he resided. Some of those activities included Red Cross Instructor, 4H dog obedience and showmanship, Adult Education Ballroom Dancing classes, volunteer firefighter and so many more.

He served on the Board of Directors of District One Hospital, Faribault Area Senior Center and North Grove Cemetery Association as well as being a member of several professional psychological associations. INFO FROM THE TRUSTEES

In December, the Trustees had an indoor air quality evaluation and testing process completed in the annex and sanctuary at Fourth Avenue. Jim Heyer worked with Field Environmental Consulting in Savage, MN.

The results of the laboratory testing indicate:

"No Indoor Air Quality concern identified."

"All indoor fungal species within the sanctuary were similar to and in lower concentrations than the outdoor comparison. Results indicate no airborne fungal concern at the time of the testing."

"Reported allergen levels were low in concentration and are likely not to cause adverse health effects or produce symptoms."

"No Indoor Air Quality, mold or allergen concern identified for the sanctuary."

The complete 15 page report is available in the church office for review.




