Take a Dip in the Pool of Siloam

Jesus told the man born blind, "Go wash yourself in the pool of Siloam." -John 9:7

Dear Fourth Avenue UMC Friends,

Rebekah and I had a spiritually invigorating and enlightening experience in the Holy Land. Like we have heard from so many pilgrims to Israel across the years, we will never read the Bible the same away again. There are simply insights one gains into the meaning of the biblical text by being aware of the land, its contours, the people and its culture. One of the things we were awakened to the power of archeology, the study of all that is beneath the surface of the land. For underneath the surface, literally, are many clues to what once was. Trust me, I'll be doing my best to unearth these things in my sermons going forward to give a glimpse of what I learned and experienced roughly two weeks ago.

Something we experienced impacts directly our reading of the Gospel of John. For years, many biblical scholars have doubted the historical accuracy of the fourth Gospel, preferring to think of its stories and details as mere myths, creations of an earthly Christian community. But a dip in the pool of Siloam has cured that!

The Gospel of John, Chapter 9 tells the story of Jesus' healing of a man born blind. After telling his disciples that the man's blindness had nothing to do with either the man's sins or those of his parents, Jesus applied mud to the man's eyes and told him to wash it off at the Pool of Siloam.

Nearly from the beginning, the first readers of John's Gospel did not know where the Pool of Siloam was. After the Romans conquered Jerusalem and left it in ruins in 70 AD, the city was hardly recognizable so many scholars began to doubt the veracity of the biblical story.

Since at least the fifth century, Christians had identified a spot in Jerusalem as the Pool of Siloam and the site of the miracle. But it was not until 2004 that archaeologists found what they are certain is the ancient pool of Siloam.

Like so many such finds, it was almost by accident. During construction work to repair a water pipe near the Temple Mount, two Israeli archaeologists found "two ancient stone steps." "Further excavation revealed that they were part of a monumental pool from the Second Temple period, the period in which Jesus lived." The pool was trapezoidal in shape and 225 feet long.

Archeology is working wonders to reveal veracity to the biblical narrative. It's become increasingly clear that the default scholarly position of disbelieving the Bible because it is the Bible is untenable. The discovery of the Pool of Siloam and many other archeological discoveries are showing the truthfulness of the Bible. Our Holy Land pilgrimage impressed upon us that the Bible we have in our hands is reliable record of the mighty acts of God.

And so, we can read the Bible and be assured that it is the Word of the Living God.

May we all grow in our pilgrimage here on earth trusting in the truth of God's Word.






In Sympathy






New Office Staff
