Heaven's Gates are Opened Wide

"O death, where is your victory?
O death, where is your sting?"
For sin is the sting that results in death,
and the law gives sin its power.
But thank God! He gives us victory over sin and death
through our Lord Jesus Christ.
-1 Corinthians 15:55-57

Dear Fourth Avenue UMC,

On Easter Sunday, we rejoiced in Jesus' triumph over death. The bloodied cross of crucifixion could not defeat him. The borrowed grave could not hold his lifeless body. When the women came to care for the body of their friend on that Sunday morning, the stone covering the tomb was rolled away and the tomb was empty. Angelic messengers proclaimed the unfathomable, "he is not here. He is risen as he

said." Jesus was alive and word was spreading on the streets that he was alive and appearing to all sorts of people all over the place. The gospels attest to these appearances until he ascended into heaven to return to his Father.

The resurrection of Jesus Christ is the source of the great Christian hope. Since Jesus Christ has triumphed over evil and sin, disease and death, we need not be overwhelmed by the threat of death nor riddled with fear over our mortality. We believe those who pit their faith in Christ and die in the Lord's friendship will live forever with Jesus in heaven and all his saints.

As a young child, I remember being deeply afraid of death. I wondered what would happen after I died. When my maternal grandmother died suddenly when I was ten years old, I wondered about her for a long time. Where was she? Was she safe? Would I ever see her again? Would my sadness over her passing ever ease?

As a churched kid, I was somewhat familiar with the promise of life after death and the idea of heaven as an eternal gathering place. I can tell you that I wasn't satisfied with heaven as a quaint idea. I wanted to know that heaven was for real. I wanted to make sure I would go there when I died. I was obsessed with the question and knowing for sure. Eventually, through the eyes of faith, I came to believe that heaven was indeed real and I knew by his grace at work in me I had saving faith in Jesus Christ. I came to believe my name was written in the Lamb's book of life. With this deep knowing, my fears and anxieties about death (and most everything else) dissipated greatly. And a confidence began to swell within me.

I can tell you this knowledge has brought great comfort over the years as loved ones died. Shortly after Easter 2015, my own mother was diagnosed with Stage 4 lung cancer. It was a bitter pill to swallow as there would be no cure. In fact, my mother died within six weeks of her diagnosis. My mother had been a lifelong Christian, was very invested in her personal faith and served with great commitment in her community and local church. Those six weeks were short, but it was an amazing time that my family will always cherish. Please ask me as I would love to tell you more about

that experience. Two days before my mother died, my father, my siblings and her grandchildren gathered around her bedside to pray with her pastor leading us. In a diminished state, my mother spoke these words, "I have lived a good life." She was at peace trusting in the victory promised by the Savior. My mother's passing brought great sorrow to our hearts, but we were greatly comforted because we knew where she was going and believed we would see her again. What a difference faith in Christ makes in the presence of death.

None of us will get out of here alive. We're all on borrowed time. Our day will come. And that day will come for those we love. And it will sting. But thank God, we are a people of hope. Easter hope. A hope centered on the resurrection of our Lord. A robust hope that death is not the end for those who believe, but the gateway to endless love and light and life with our Risen Lord and the company of the faithful.

So, let us rely on the grace of God and rest on the promises of God and renew our hope that death is not the end, but only the gate to a new and glorious and never-ending life in the presence of our God.



Bruce David Christie (83) died in his sleep on the 23rd of March 2022 in Fort Collins, Colorado, following a long struggle with Alzheimer's. We extend our sympathy to his wife, Judith, children Wenona and Heather and all of his extended family.

Bruce was born in Faribault, Minnesota on the 17th of February 1939 to Earl and Elsie (Wilkowske) Christie, the youngest of four boys. He attended

Garfield Elementary School, and then the Faribault Junior-Senior High School, graduating in 1957. While in Junior-Senior High School, Bruce was active in the marching band, student council, theatre, student newspaper, jazz band and as the only male cheerleader on the cheerleading squad!

Bruce started his 33-year career with the Minnesota Conference of the United Methodist Church (UMC) in 1969. **He was born and raised in the Fourth Avenue UMC of Faribault**. During his career with the Minnesota Conference of the UMC, in addition to working in the Minneapolis and St. Paul urban parishes, Bruce worked for the Morristown-Blooming Grove parish from 1976-1979, Holy Trinity UMC in Prior Lake from 1981-1985, First UMC of South St Paul from 1985-1992, and retired following his tenure at Sunrise UMC in Moundsview from 1992-2002.

In the mid-2000's, Bruce was diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease. This illness slowly took him away from those who loved him, first with his personality change, and finally with his physical demise. Bruce was a person who thoroughly loved life, people, new experiences and all that went with it. This was a part of him which never completely disappeared, even towards the very end.
