Dear Fourth Avenue UMC Friends,

I texted the good news to Rebekah and she texted me an exuberant "Hallelujah!" I keep checking my balance every couple of hours to make sure nothing has changed. And with each time I check, the joy and gratitude is renewed.

As wonderful as the restoration of a bank account is, we celebrate every Sunday and live in a new reality every day that is far better than the good news of a restored bank account. We celebrate and live in the reality of the good news of a restored life, an abundant life, and an eternal life in Jesus Christ. God has looked upon us, his beloved children, caught in the vice grip of sin, and delivered us from sin's dominion and power over us. Our identity as the children of God and our eternal destiny of eternal life in God, once stolen by the corrosive power of sin and the deception and wiles of the devil, has been returned to us. God in his mercy has acted in a decisive way through the death and resurrection of his Son, rescued us from the kingdom of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of God's marvelous light. By God's sheer, unmerited and undeserved grace, we have been saved through faith. And he has dug us out of the quicksand where we were sinking deep in sin and set our feet down on solid ground of Christ's righteousness. And God continues to lavish his love and grace upon us day after day after day.

And now, we live in the abundance of God's choicest blessings and in the confidence of God's loving and eternal care. And the only way that you and I know this is to be true and live in this new reality is because of the ministry of the Church where this good, life-changing and eternity-altering news is proclaimed. On Wednesday, October 12th the second meeting with Susan Nienaber, designed to enrich our communication skills, was held. The focus of the meeting was values and behaviors and how one impacts or supports the other. Those attending were divided into groups and asked to list how/what do we, the FAUMC congregation, spend most of our time and/or resources. We then were asked to identify how our specific behaviors reflect our values. An example of how values determine behaviors is we care about fellowship so therefore we offer coffee in a relaxed and inviting setting before and after worship. Or a congregation values the importance of ensuring a younger generation has the opportunity to learn about Jesus so they support projects that will provide scholarships to send young people to church camps.

Value conflict can occur when our behaviors don't reflect what we claim is important. An example would be we say we're friendly and welcoming but when someone new attends our service we just hand them a bulletin then continue with the conversation we were having with another church member.

It is important for a church to identify their congregational values so even during times of conflict they can focus on the values that unite them. We should not make the mistake in thinking everyone has the same values, however congregational values should be those that are shared by all, whether they are a young person or a senior.

After the discussion we enjoyed birthday cake and ice cream provided by Irene Eiler in celebration of her recent 95th birthday. Our next meeting will be held on **Tuesday, November 29th at 7 pm.** This is a day earlier than previously announced, and the change is to accommodate those who are now involved with confirmation on Wednesdays. Anyone who has not attended the previous meetings are still welcome to come earlier, at 6:30 pm, and Susan will be there to review with you the information to date.

FAUMC Annual Community Christmas Dinner Discontinued

Several years ago FAUMC felt moved to provide a Christmas dinner on Christmas Eve or Day to people in the community who had no place to go or family to be with for the Christmas holiday. After awhile it became difficult to get workers away from their own holiday plans so the dinner was moved to a Sunday before Christmas, and has continued on that schedule for several years.

The funding for the Christmas dinner was sponsored in large by Bequest and Gifts. After reviewing how the Christmas Dinner has evolved since it's inception several years ago Bequest and Gifts felt it no longer served the group of people it was originally intended for. As they looked out at the community, they found other areas that would better benefit from the money that had been used for the Community Christmas Dinner. The committee proposed to the Ad Council to redirect the funds to another project.

Upon further discussion at the recent Ad Council meeting, it was agreed to approve the new project and forego hosting a Christmas Dinner. Factors which contributed to the decision were the cost, difficulty of getting workers so close to Christmas and the fact the project no longer served the original targeted group of people. Additionally, with the work involved in having the upcoming soup lunches it was felt the congregation would be overwhelmed to plan a large community meal so soon after working those three lunches.

Thank you to all who have participated in the Christmas Dinner over the years. We know times and circumstances change and it can be sad to say goodbye to a beloved tradition, but it was felt it was time to make this change. There will be further information regarding the new project in a separate article.
