Dear Fourth Avenue UMC Friends,

Ready or not! The Fall is here. September signals a season of new beginnings as the summer gives way to the fall, school resumes for students, leisure time gives way to greater structure, and church life picks up. I trust you've noticed our attendance at Sunday worship has been strong throughout the summer and the buzz is palpable as we gather on Sundays. I have been very gratified to see this momentum building among us. And so, as I enter this season in my leadership as your pastor, I have been giving a great deal of thought as to priorities for myself and the church for the next nine months. I

would like to share my four priorities with you in this column.

• Awaken and Strengthen Faith in Jesus Christ

The church's core mission is to make disciples of Jesus Christ. This is the main thing. Through this upcoming year, I will be emphasizing the importance of deepening and developing our faith in Jesus and teaching about the practices that grow our faith and make it strong. Beginning October 2, we will commence the *Commitment to Christ* campaign. This will give each of us and our congregation at large an opportunity to rethink our commitment to Christ and grow in our life of faith. Stay tuned for more details this month in worship and the weekly e-newsletter.

• Practice Building Biblical Christian Community

Disciples of Jesus Christ live in community and are obedient to his commands. A strong, vibrant Christian community functions well in accordance with God's design revealed in Scripture. Coming out of the pandemic gives us a great opportunity to build our church family on biblical principles. Toward this end I hope to teach on the "one another" commands in the New Testament, raise up a lay team of persons who can minister to others in need of prayer, and encourage home gatherings. I also want to ask you to participate in the congregational meetings that will be happening monthly with Rev. Susan Nienaber. You can read more about our first gathering on Wednesday, September 21 from our Council Chair, Deb Jindra-Pope, (p. 5) in this edition of the Fourth Teller.

• Develop a Signature Children's Ministry

The call to pass the faith onto succeeding generations is core to the gospel. This has been an area of weakness for some time. We now have an energetic leader in Rebekah Ciesluk we can rally around and a few young families with which we can start a movement. Now is the time! I want to see a team of supporters and co-laborers form to develop this ministry. I believe there are many families with young children in our community who will respond to such an initiative.

• Strengthen the Culture of Leadership

Everything rises and falls on leadership. A congregation can only prosper to the degree its leaders lead. There is a lot expected of our church leaders and riding on them. Toward that end, we need to invest more resources to develop our church's leaders. Coming out of Covid, we will re-institute a three-year cycle of leadership on committees and calling forth new leaders this fall and hold a leadership retreat some time in the coming year.

I hope you will consider these priorities in your thoughts and discussions with one another. And keep praying for God to pour out his Holy Spirit upon our church and energize us as we go into this momentous season of new beginnings.
