

A man was disgusted with his lawn and wondered if he should dig it up and start all over. His lawn was the worst in the entire neighborhood. It was loaded with dandelions, crab grass, and bare, browned spots. He called a professional lawn service to come to the rescue, but the pros declined to take his lawn on! Before he threw up his hands and started over, he sought advice from a farmer. The farmer surveyed the lawn and delivered a pearl of wisdom, "Don't focus on the lawn's imperfections. Focus on growing grass." Over the next three years, the man put this wisdom into practice, planting grass seed, nourishing the soil with special nutrients, keeping it watered, and his lawn was transformed from the neighborhood's worst into one of its best.

This is Jesus' message to us in the Parable of the Wheat and Weeds (Matthew 13:24-30, 36-43). In this world, good and evil grows side by side. This will bother us more than God. We will be tempted to take decisive action and pull the weeds of imperfection, but there's a great risk. We will likely do great harm in our attempt to remove what is bad. Jesus teaches us to celebrate and nourish what is good, to watch it grow, expand, and flourish. We can trust God to unmask and root out evil on God's timetable. We are to "focus on growing grass."

We long for a peaceful world... a prosperous country... a pure church... and productive lives. We see imperfection in every direction. The vision we cherish and long for collides with reality. We struggle to accept this dissonance and our natural reaction is to take quick, decisive action to remove what offends us. Jesus warns us that our judgment in these situations will be amiss and our "solutions" will result in unforeseen, unfortunate damage.

Several years back, our nation acted to remove foreign dictators and fight terrorists. A noble aim. Yet, the cost in blood and treasure was great and that part of the world is still chaotic and the threat is still strong. Recent events in Afghanistan have horrified us. Our nation has many domestic problems and our leaders are deeply divided and distrustful of one another and distracted by politics. Life in the USA feels very unstable.

Our concern also extends to our churches where problems are aplenty, resources are scarce, power is lacking, and willing people are few. We even turn on ourselves, kicking ourselves for our weaknesses, trying to remove our shortcomings and coming up short. A Cherokee Indian once spoke to his grandson about the two wolves that lived within him. One was good marked by joy, peace, love, and a spirit of service. The other one was evil marked by anger, resentment, greed, and selfishness. "Which one wins?" the grandson asked. The wise grandfather replied, "The one that I feed." What grows in our lives, our churches, our country, and the world is what we feed.

What do we see when we look at our congregation? From one angle, we may see an aging family, weary leadership, and our small crop of children and youth growing up quickly and fading from the scene. We see our denomination embroiled in conflict and headed for division and that painful conflict will be faced by us locally. But look what else is happening. New babies are born. We have a part in a growing mission in Liberia. A faithful group is gathering each week to plan One Grand Night for children and envision future efforts in Christian education. The Annex/ Berean Room updates are creating new spaces for fellowship. We've made advancements in technology and communication efforts. Little pockets of spiritual energy are bubbling up. Each of these developments is positive, noteworthy, and occasions us to focus on growing grass.

So, celebrate what is good and nourish it. Accept life's imperfections and do not let them dominate your mind. Invite God to work and trust him to bring evil to its knees. Focus on growing grass and see what God does.




