## RECYCLABLES & TOWNSHIP INFO RECYCLABLES PICK-UP DATES:

May 12 & Saturday, May 31

If the recyclable date falls on a Monday holiday, the pickup will be on the following Saturday. Recyclables should be put out the night before, after 4:30 PM. In the Gettysburgs, please place them in the walkway between the cars near the street and keep them outside, rain or shine. If recyclables are not picked up, call (800) 488-6242.

## Please follow these rules: <u>DO NOT PUT RECYCLABLES IN PLASTIC</u> <u>BAGS. USE YOUR RECYCLE BINS.</u>

RECYCLE ONLY: Aluminum cans, clean glass bottles and jars, steel and tin cans, plastic bottles with a #1 or #2 on the bottom, newspapers, corrugated cardboard (boxes must be flattened and tied), and mixed paper (magazines, paper, and junk mail).

ITEMS NOT FOR RECYCLING: PIZZA BOXES, STYROFOAM, ELECTRONICS OR BATTERIES, SHREDDED PAPER, CERAMICS/DISHWARE, PAINT, POTS & PANS, OR PLASTIC BAGS.

Recyclable buckets can be purchased at the Old Bridge Town Center for \$10.00. New residents (within a year of occupancy) can get them free, if available.

Do not put recyclables in the garbage as there are strict rules about this from the State EPA. Garbage collectors are not allowed to pick up recyclables so please be aware of this.

White Appliances (microwaves, refrigerators, dishwashers, or stoves): Schedule pick up for these items at Old Bridge Recycling (732) 721-5600 Ext. 6107 and they will advise of the pickup date, cost, and procedure.

#### GARBAGE PICKUP INFORMATION

The garbage pickup days are **TUESDAYS** and **FRIDAYS**. If either day falls on a holiday, then garbage will be picked up on the following pickup day.

Garbage: Must be in the green receptacle. Overflow should be on top of receptacle. Bulk pickup: Call Suburban Disposal, Inc. (973) 227-7020 or email Notifysdimc@gmail.com for further information. Please note there is a charge for this service.

#### **IMPORTANT UPDATE**

MAINTENANCE FEE: Effective July 1, 2025, the maintenance fee will be \$215. It is due the first of each month. No statement is sent unless it has not been paid by the 15<sup>th</sup>, at which time a \$30. late fee is charged. The check must be <u>received in the Office by the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month to avoid the late fee</u>. Do not post-date your check.

If you are still writing a check for the maintenance fee, please make sure your unit address is on the check and print the amount very carefully.

Call the office and leave a message if you are having difficulty in paying your monthly maintenance fee.

#### \*\* BE MINDFUL OF OTHERS \*\*

Please be considerate of your neighbors and turn down the volume of your TVs, stereos, and radios.

Don't park your cars in the fire lanes too long hindering others from passing or dropping off at their condos.

# Footsteps in History By CVA Trustee James Nolan Episode 23 – May 2025 – Winston Churchill – Walking With Destiny

Sir Winston Leonard Spencer Churchill (1874-1965) was a British Statesman, military officer, writer, and was Prime Minister of The United Kingdom from 1940-1945. His determination during WW II to resist Adolph Hitler, and defend Democracy against fascism, enabled the freedoms and liberties that we cherish today in the free world.

Churchill had a habit of walking at night in St. James Park with his bodyguard, Walter H. Thompson, often while the German Luftwaffe was bombing London. One night, after leaving the park and about to enter his residence Annex #10, there was a large explosion caused by a German bomb landing in the park they had just left. Thompson said to Churchill, "I hope that will dissuade you from making these walks?" Churchill responded, "Someone up there is looking after me besides you!" Thompson said, "Do you mean Sergeant Davis?" referring to his assistant. "No," said Churchill, and pointing to the sky, he said, "I have a mission to perform and that person intends to see that it is performed!" Of note here, unexpected aid often arrives when our intentions are grounded in truth and honesty.

#### **FROM THE BOARD**

#### SEWER BACKUP PROBLEMS

If there is a backup in the toilet in your unit, it is the policy of the Cheesequake Village Association that you **first call the office** – or the emergency number after hours --- (732) 425-2011.

We have a full-time Maintenance Staff and someone is on call 24-7.

A member of the Maintenance Staff will try to clear the obstruction. If the obstruction is in the main sewer line, the staff member will call someone such as A-General to clear the obstruction and the Association will pay for the expense. If you, as a homeowner, call a plumber without allowing the Association to try to resolve the problem, the Association will not pay for that cost.

This applies only to toilet backups, not sink or washing machines. Nothing but toilet paper goes down the toilet, that is: NO GREASE, NO WIPES OF ANY KIND, NO RAGS, NO PAPER TOWELS OR KLEENEX AND NO DIAPERS. If it is determined that any of these items come from your condo, you will be responsible for the repair costs.

Do not use baking soda and vinegar in your drains. It has been proven to cake up similar to powdered detergents. ZEP and PEQUA, available at Home Depot, are the alternatives to use.

Please be patient after making a work order request to the Office. Our Maintenance Staff takes care of emergencies first and all other work is done in a timely manner.



#### **VICTORY GARDEN**

The Victory Garden will again be offered to all residents for planting their vegetables behind Minnesota Dr. Each participant will be allocated a space so it is necessary to contact the Office to sign up before planting. However, all plots are taken. You will now be put on a waiting list.

Now is the time to clean our outside areas that are the responsibility of each unit owner. In addition, all four residents in a Gettysburg are responsible for maintaining the cleanliness in and under the stairwells.

That is, no leaves, newspapers, flyers, loose bottles, cans, recycling containers, and no children's toys, etc., should be cluttering our stairwells, balconies, and backs of our units. Bicycles and folding lawn chairs are admissible.

Back patios and enclosed rooms CANNOT be used for storage.

Failure to cooperate will result in a fine. Also, check your furnace filter – it may need to be replaced or cleaned.

#### **KEYS IN THE OFFICE!**

It is important to keep a set of your house keys or your security keypad code at the office in case of an emergency where entry into your unit is necessary. The keys are kept in a secure file cabinet in the office. If entry is needed, only a Board Member and a Maintenance member would enter.



## CAN YOU GET IN TROUBLE FOR NOT PICKING UP DOG POOP?

Yes, absolutely! Failing to pick up your dog's poop is not just a matter of courtesy; it's often a violation of the law that can lead to fines and other penalties. Commonly known as "Pooper-Scooper Laws," these laws mandate that all pet owners must remove and properly dispose of their dog's fecal waste from public and private property. This includes, but is not limited to, sidewalks, parks, neighbor's yards, school grounds, and, of course, the common grounds in our Village!

What are "Pooper-Scooper Laws"? These are local ordinances designed to ensure public hygiene and sanitation. They essentially state that dog owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pets. The wording may vary from place to place, but the core message is consistent: you must remove your dog's poop.

What Happens If You Violate These Laws? The consequences for not picking up dog poop can vary. They may include:

- Fines: Most municipalities impose monetary penalties for failing to comply with pooper-scooper laws. These fines can range from a few dollars to hundreds of dollars depending on the jurisdiction and the frequency of the violation.
- Warnings: In some cases, especially for first-time offenders, a verbal or written warning may be issued. However, continued non-compliance usually leads to fines.
- Civil Lawsuits: If your dog's waste causes damage or health issues on a neighbor's property, you could potentially face a civil lawsuit for damages.

 Increased Enforcement: Repeated offenses might result in heightened monitoring from animal control or local authorities.

Dog feces are a breeding ground for various pathogens that can cause disease in humans and other animals:

- Bacteria: Harmful bacteria such as E. coli, Salmonella, and Campylobacter can survive in dog waste, potentially leading to severe gastrointestinal illnesses.
- Parasites: Roundworms, hookworms, and whipworms are common parasites found in dog feces that can infect humans, especially children who might play in contaminated areas.
- Viruses: Dog waste can carry viruses harmful to other dogs, putting them at risk of diseases.
- Environmental Issues: Dog poop is not a fertilizer; it pollutes waterways, can contribute to excessive algae growth and carries harmful bacteria into local water sources, impacting our ecosystem.

Dangers of Not Picking Up! Dog waste attracts rodents and insects, leading to pest infestations. Also, the accumulation of waste can result in unpleasant odors and damage to your lawn, causing grass to burn due to the high nitrogen content in feces.

Be a Responsible Pet Owner! Always carry poop bags with you whenever you take your dog for a walk. Even in your own yard, try to keep a consistent schedule of clean-up. It is simply a part of pet ownership and one of our responsibilities to others as well as our dogs and the health of the environment.

#### REMINDERS

**SELLING YOUR UNIT:** If you are selling your unit, it is **mandatory** that you contact the office to inform us of the sale. There is paperwork that needs to be completed and the unit's files in the office need to be updated.

ALTERATION FORMS: It is imperative that Alteration forms be submitted to the Office for any renovations to the unit. We are required to keep updated records on all units in the Village. Alteration forms will NOT be accepted for electrical or plumbing projects without a copy of the electrician's or plumber's valid license and insurance attached

PARKING PERMIT STICKERS: Every car parked in the Village MUST have a parking sticker. Bring your car to the Office with your license and registration. This is mandatory. If you receive a letter about getting a permit, you must reply within 10 days, or you will be fined.

<u>DOGS ON EXTENDED LEASHES:</u> Please be mindful of other people when using extended leashes for your dogs or cats. Your neighbors can easily trip on them. Better yet, try not using them at all because Old Bridge rule allows for only 6 foot long leashes!!

FIBERGLASS BALCONIES: No rugs or any form of carpeting on the new fiberglass balconies or patios. These coverings cause the deterioration of the cement as well as the new fiberglass.

DOG & CAT OWNERS: Dog droppings are still an issue. By law, you must pick up after your pet. If you are observed not picking up after your pet, you will be fined. Please do not walk your pet behind or on the side of other units since you are intruding on the privacy of other residents. CHANGES IN UNITS: As equipment has been changed (Ex: Furnaces, air conditioners, windows), new situations have arisen. When contractors add or change equipment, be advised that these changes created by your contractor are your responsibility and must be maintained by you and be added to your insurance policy. You must apply for an alteration permit from the CVA and from Old Bridge Township before making changes to your unit. Failure to do so will generate a fine.
