Dear Fellow Villagers:

With the arrival of May, the Village is coming back to life. Benches have been placed throughout the community for residents and friends to enjoy the warmer weather.

The Flea Market will take place on Sunday, May 3, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Table fees are \$15 for one table, \$25 for two tables, and \$30 for three tables.

The Pool Opening Party is scheduled for May 23 and will include a barbecue and live music. The cost of the party is \$20. per person. In the event of rain, the party will be rescheduled for May 24 or May 25. Tickets will be available for purchase at the office. Please note that no one under 18 years of age is permitted in the pool or pool area.

A new landscaping company has been hired and has begun seasonal cleanup. The company will provide weekly service at an approximate cost of \$85,000 for the season. Residents are reminded not to discard cigarette butts or litter on the grounds, to clean up after their dogs, and to place all garbage bags inside the green containers.

Concrete repairs are scheduled to begin shortly, and the Board is in the process of hiring a company to line and number the parking lots. Additional road work will be completed in preparation for striping.

The next Board meeting will be held on Thursday, May 21 at 7:00 p.m. The new 2026-2027 budget will be discussed at that meeting.

RECYCLABLES & TOWNSHIP INFO

RECYCLABLES PICK-UP DATES:

May 11 & May 30

If the recyclable date falls on a Monday holiday, the pickup will be on the following Saturday. Recyclables should be put out the night before, after 6:30 PM. In the Gettysburgs, please place them in the walkway between the cars near the street **and keep them outside, rain or shine.** If recyclables are not picked up, call (800) 488-6242.

Please follow these rules:

DO NOT PUT RECYCLABLES IN PLASTIC BAGS. USE YOUR RECYCLE BINS.

RECYCLE ONLY: Aluminum cans, clean glass bottles and jars, steel and tin cans, plastic bottles with a #1, #2 & #5 on the bottom, newspapers, corrugated cardboard (boxes must be flattened and tied), and mixed paper (magazines, paper, and junk mail).

ITEMS NOT FOR RECYCLING: PIZZA BOXES, STYROFOAM, ELECTRONICS OR BATTERIES, SHREDDED PAPER, CERAMICS/DISHWARE, PAINT, POTS & PANS, OR PLASTIC BAGS.

Recyclable buckets can be purchased at the Old Bridge Town Center for \$10.00. New residents (within a year of occupancy) can get them free, if available.

Do not put recyclables in the garbage as there are strict rules about this from the State EPA. Garbage collectors are not allowed to pick up recyclables so please be aware of this.

White Appliances (microwaves, refrigerators, dishwashers, or stoves):
Schedule pick up for these items at Old Bridge Recycling (732) 721-5600 Ext. 6107 and they will advise of the pickup date, cost, and procedure.

IMPORTANT UPDATE

MAINTENANCE FEE: Since July 1, 2025, the maintenance fee is **\$215**. It is due on the first of each month. No statement is sent unless it has not been paid by the 15th, at which time a \$25. late fee is charged. The check must be **received in the Office by the 15th of the month to avoid the late fee.** Do not post-date your check.

If you are still writing a check for the maintenance fee, please make sure your unit address is on the check and print the amount very carefully.

Call the office and leave a message if you are having difficulty in paying your monthly maintenance fee.

GARBAGE PICKUP INFORMATION

The garbage pickup days are **TUESDAYS** and **FRIDAYS**. If either day falls on a holiday, then garbage will be picked up on the following pickup day.

Americans began to recognize Memorial Day in 1868, and the country established it as a federal holiday in 1971. Originally known as "Decoration Day," the holiday started with communities coming together to decorate the graves of those who died during service.

A discovery made by a Yale University professor at a Harvard archive suggest the earliest observance of Memorial Day was held by a group of formerly enslaved people in Charlestown, South Carolina, in 1865. Records show that the group transformed a racetrack that had once served as a prison for Union captives into a proper burial site.

On May 1, 1865, thousands gathered for a procession led by 3,000 school children carrying flowers and singing patriotic songs.

Many service members, veterans, and others in the military community spend Memorial Day mourning those they've lost. They think about their fallen brothers and sisters, and find their own ways to remember and honor them.

"Memorial Day is important to me because I honor those who have sacrificed their lives and their family's lives in pursuit of freedom for our nation," said Army veteran Edwin Martinez. "What greater gift can one man or woman sacrifice to keep the U.S. free and maintain our way of life?"

U.S. Marine Corps veteran David Daly also holds Memorial Day close to his heart. He recognizes that many look forward to the long weekend, but encourages us all to look beyond the day off and remember the bravery of the men and women who served.

"For me, the day reminds me of friends lost and the horrors of war," David said. "At the same time, it reminds us all that while the day-to-day events of the world often paint a picture of gloom and doom, we still live in a place where heroines are among us. While these brave souls have passed in service, their memory is honored on Memorial Day to remind that we had the privilege of existing on the same plane as them, even if it was only for a moment."

**Footsteps in History by
CVA Trustee James Nolan
Episode 32 – May 2026 –
Abraham Lincoln and “The Pause”**

Abraham Lincoln had a quiet habit that saved him from many regrets. Whenever he felt offended, misunderstood, or treated unfairly, he would immediately sit down and write a letter. He wrote bluntly. He wrote honestly, no filters, no restraint, but here was the discipline: He never sent it! He would fold the paper, place it in a drawer, and walk away.

When he reread his writing days later with a clear mind, he often realized sending or saying it would cause irreparable harm. He would then destroy the letter. Not because he lacked courage, but because he understood this simple truth: “Emotion demands an instant release, wisdom requires a pause.”

Lincoln refused to let a passing impulse decide his future. He gave clarity to this final action. There is a powerful lesson in this: not every thought needs to be spoken. A quick reply may feel strong in the moment, but it can cost far more later. The pause is where self-control becomes real strength. Wise people are not silent out of fear. They are silent by choice. The operative phrase here is: “pause when agitated or doubtful and ask for the right thought or action.”

FROM THE BOARD

SEWER BACKUP PROBLEMS

If you experience a toilet backup in your unit, Cheesequake Village Association policy requires that you **contact the office first**—or use the emergency number after hours:

(732) 425-2011.

Our Maintenance Staff is available full-time, with someone on call 24/7. A staff member will attempt to clear the blockage. If it's found in the main sewer line, the staff will call a company like A-General to resolve the issue, and the Association will cover the cost. **However, if you hire a plumber before giving the Association a chance to address the problem, you will be responsible for the bill.**

This procedure applies only to toilet backups, not to kitchen sinks or washing machines. Only toilet paper should be flushed; do **not** flush grease, wipes of any kind, rags, paper towels, tissues, or diapers. If any of these items are traced back to your unit, you will be held liable for repair costs.

Do not use baking soda and vinegar in your drains, as they can form clogs similar to those caused by powdered detergents. Instead, use products like ZEP or PEQUA, which are available at Home Depot.

- WIPES
- PLASTIC BAGS
- ADULT DIAPERS
- PAPER TOWELS
- TISSUES
- RAGS
- DOG FECES

Now is the time to clean our outside areas that are the responsibility of each unit owner. In addition, all four residents in a Gettysburg are responsible for maintaining the cleanliness in and under the stairwells.

That is, no leaves, newspapers, flyers, loose bottles, cans, recycling containers, and no children's toys, etc., should be cluttering our stairwells, balconies, and backs of our units. Bicycles and folding lawn chairs are admissible.

Back patios and enclosed rooms **CANNOT** be used for storage.

Failure to cooperate will result in a fine.

Also, check your furnace filter – it may need to be replaced or cleaned.

CLUBHOUSE RENTAL FEE

Beginning January 1, 2026, clubhouse rental is \$200. Event insurance is required; contact us for insurance information if needed.

NO PARKING AREA



Parking is **NOT** allowed in front of the office and library where the curb cut is used by wheelchairs, walkers, and people who are unable to maneuver regular curbs. Please be considerate and leave this area clear of vehicles.

REMINDERS

SELLING YOUR UNIT: If you are selling your unit, it is **mandatory** that you contact the office to inform us of the sale. There is paperwork that needs to be completed and the unit's files in the office need to be updated.

ALTERATION FORMS: It is imperative that Alteration forms be submitted to the Office for any renovations to the unit. We are required to keep updated records on all units in the Village. Alteration forms will NOT be accepted for electrical or plumbing projects without a copy of the electrician's or plumber's valid license and insurance attached.

PARKING PERMIT STICKERS: Every car parked in the Village **MUST** have a parking sticker. Bring your car to the Office with your license and registration. This is mandatory. If you receive a letter about getting a permit, you must reply within 10 days, or you will be fined.

DOGS ON EXTENDED LEASHES: Please be mindful of other people when using extended leashes for your dogs or cats. Your neighbors can easily trip on them. Better yet, try not using them at all because Old Bridge rule allows for only 6-foot-long leashes!!

DOG & CAT OWNERS: Dog droppings are still an issue. By law, you must pick up after your pet. If you are observed not picking up after your pet, you will be fined. Please do not walk your pet behind or on the side of other units since you are intruding on the privacy of other residents. **PICK UP AFTER YOUR PET—IT'S THE LAW -- DON'T DISPOSE OF THE BAG IN THE SEWER OR SOMEONE'S TRASH BIN**

VISITING CHILDREN: Children are not allowed to play in the streets. No bikes or skateboards allowed. Visiting children should be respectful and not disturb neighbors living in the vicinity.



WORK ORDER REQUEST

Please be patient after making a work order request to the Office. Our Maintenance Staff takes care of emergencies first and all other work is done in a timely manner.

COMPLAINTS & GRIEVANCES: If you have a complaint or problem with your unit, you must call the Office. If you have a grievance, please submit it in writing to the Office, attention Grievance Committee. It must include your name and address, or it will not be considered for action. Or you can email Maureen Doloughy at Maureen13Hawaii@yahoo.com

CHANGES IN UNITS: As equipment has been changed (Ex: Furnaces, air conditioners, windows), new situations have arisen. When contractors add or change equipment, be advised that these changes created by your contractor are your responsibility and must be maintained by you and be added to your insurance policy. You must apply for an alteration permit from the CVA and from Old Bridge Township before making changes to your unit. Failure to do so will generate a fine.

STREETLIGHT & POWER OUTAGES:

Call JCP&L at **1-888-544-4877** to report the outage with the street name and the cross street. **DO NOT CALL THE OFFICE FOR POWER OUTAGES.**



KEYS IN THE OFFICE!

It is important to keep a set of your house keys or your security keypad code at the office in case of an emergency where entry into your unit is necessary. The keys are kept in a secure file cabinet in the office. If entry is needed, only a Board Member and a Maintenance member would enter.
