Agenda Items/Presentation

1. A Moment of Silence for Annie Vinson:

 Annie was a dedicated member of our community and our coalition who recently passed away. She will be greatly missed.

2. Lauretta Compton and Jenniffer Masters on Future Leaders of Wakulla:

- Future Leaders of Wakulla gives youth the opportunity to network within the community and find growth in communication, networking, and developing organizational skills. They are finding ways to give youth in our community more safe spaces and activities by working on community projects and events.
- As a community project, FLOW will be collecting hygiene items to be given to our middle schoolers in Wakulla Co. The project name is "Fresh 'N Shine." Supplies being collected will include: shampoo, body wash, deodorant, combs, toothbrushes, toothpaste, etc. Budgets and lists are still being compiled and then we will open collection efforts up to the community to contribute.

3. Karen Zak on Drug-Free Communities Grant:

- CADCA: Community Anti-Drug Coalitions of America We are in the process of joining their membership of coalitions
- Social Norms Poster #2 Distribution: 10 posters at COAST Charter, 3 posters at DISC Village, and others were distributed during the meeting to the agencies represented
- Parent Information Kiosk Update at Wakulla Co Public Library: December is "National Impaired Driving Prevention Month." Information is centered around the dangers of driving under the influence and how to talk to your kids about alcohol, and marijuana. "National Grief Awareness Week" is Dec 2-8. We are in talks with the DOH to install a kiosk at their location.
- Chamber of Commerce Business Excellence Awards: WCCY was nominated for a Business Excellence Award in the non-profit category!
- Future Leaders of Wakulla: FLOW hosted their first "teen science café" event focusing on recycling. Youth leader Caden Gruebel organized the event by creating flyers, scheduling speakers, planning the interactive activity, organizing a podcast to promote the discussion of recycling, and with the help of other FLOW members, they created YouTube videos to market the event. Steven Sanabria spoke to the audience about what it means to be a leader in our community when it comes to recycling and the importance of upcycling.

• Fundraising Committee: We would like to start a fundraising committee in January as we begin thinking about the sustainability of our coalition in the future.

Lt. Aaron Taylor (Florida Army National Guard): Supplied with Deterra deactivation kits to distribute

Regina McQueen (Mobile Response Unit at Apalachee Center): Supports community with mental health services – "Same Day Access" program allows citizens to register online from home for mental health services (medication support, therapy support, etc). 1-800-342-0774 is the Mobile Response Team 24/7 mental health helpline.
