Agenda Items/Presentation

1. Jennifer Phillips on Vice President Nominations:

- James Lewis was nominated by Bonnie Wertenberger and Emily Kohler seconded the nomination. No further nominations were made.
 - A motion was made by Karen Zak to vote on the nomination and the motion was seconded by Lottie Roy.
 - Voting was conducted by in-person raise of hand/Zoom chat. The vote was as follows: 16 in favor and 0 opposed. James Lewis received all 16 votes and was unanimously elected as VP of WCCY. James accepted the position and will assume the office effective immediately.

2. Caden Gruebel on Future Leaders of Wakulla:

- FLOW is coordinating with DOH for a youth bubble run on May 3rd, "Burst Out of Your Bubble."
- FLOW is also hosting a "safe space" dance for ages 11-16 on May 17th from 6-9 PM at the Extension office, "Dance Into the Decades."

3. Karen Zak on Drug-Free Communities Grant:

- WCCY represented at Wakulla Wonderful and handed out 15 R&R guides and had three parents sign up to receive our emails.
- Submitted our proposal for the STOP Act grant (Sober Truth on Preventing Underage Drinking Act) on March 17th. The STOP Act is only awarded to DFC grantees and focuses on the prevention and reduction of alcohol use among youth, as well as focuses on capacity building activities – less about our implementations and more about equipping people in our community to do the work.
- Teaching 'Too Good For Drugs' to 4th and 5th graders at COAST and currently on Lesson 6 of 10.
- Parent Information kiosk at the Library: April is Alcohol Awareness Month with NIAAA and so the information available will surround the topic of how parents can talk to their teens about alcohol as well as information for youth on why alcohol is dangerous/why it's important to avoid it and ways to say no.
- Poster #6 is ready for distribution and will be displayed until May 7th.

Partner Reports

Amber Volano (211 Big Bend/Help Me Grow): Provides free screenings to children 0-8 years old for behavioral and developmental concerns.

Lottie Roy (LWREA): Dahlia Hunt, a 5th-grade student at Shadeville Elementary, earned 1st place in the annual Florida Retired Educators Foundation essay competition. This year's theme invited students to share something meaningful they learned from a grandparent or grandparent-like figure. Dahlia's winning essay, titled "Golf Cart Perseverance," which reflected the life lessons she gained from her Papa. She was awarded a \$100 prize, and her teacher is Mr. Wallis.

James Lewis (Wakulla DOH): Wakulla County participated in the Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) conducted by Tallahassee Memorial Hospital (TMH), with focused efforts to boost local response rates. Approximately 220 surveys were completed by Wakulla residents, making up about 20% of total responses during the final weekend alone. TMH has confirmed these responses are specific to Wakulla County. In exchange for our support in promoting the survey, TMH will provide access to Wakulla-specific data. This information will be incorporated into our own Wakulla County Community Health Assessment, which is expected to be completed by year-end 2025.
