Agenda Items/Presentation

1. Karen Zak on Drug-Free Communities Grant:

- Submitted our proposal for the STOP Act grant (Sober Truth on Preventing Underage Drinking Act) on March 17th. The STOP Act is only awarded to DFC grantees and focuses on the prevention and reduction of alcohol use among youth, as well as focuses on capacity building activities – less about our implementations and more about equipping people in our community to do the work.
- Year 2 of the DFC grant comes to an end September 30th, but our reporting of activities goes through the end of July. We have two more months to make our number goals.
 - Each year our goal is to teach the Too Good For Drugs curriculum to 200 students and we are currently at 53 students after the completion of 10 lessons at COAST Charter's 4th and 5th grade students. We are partnering with 4H and Sun Chaser Fitness again this summer to teach TGFD to students at their Teen Fit camps, so we will be able to add to our number.
 - After meeting with Superintendent Myhre at the end of March, we learned that WCSO will teach TGFD through the LEAD program to 8th grade students next year. We've spoken to Captain Yarbrough about possible ways we can work together next year to reach both of our goals.
- Poster #7 in our Join the Crowd social norms campaign is available and will be our last poster in this series. We are currently formulating a new social norms campaign for this fall.
- "Dancing into the Decades" safe space dance is happening 5/17 from 6-9 PM for youth aged 11-16 y/o at the Extension office (84 Cedar Ave). Kids are encouraged to dress up according to their favorite decade. All adults chaperones are level 2 screened. Contact kzak@fsu.edu for more information.
