4. Gunmen abducted the Deputy Registrar of the Federal College of Education (Technical) in Lagos State.

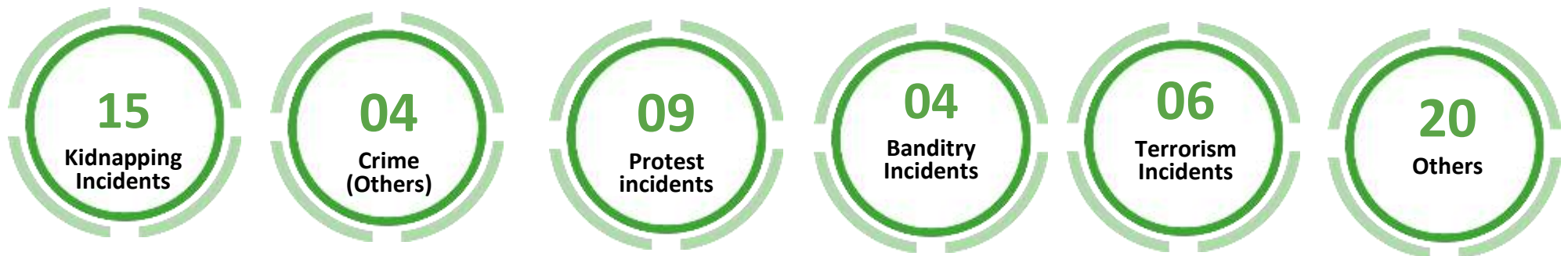


Figure 1. Incident map

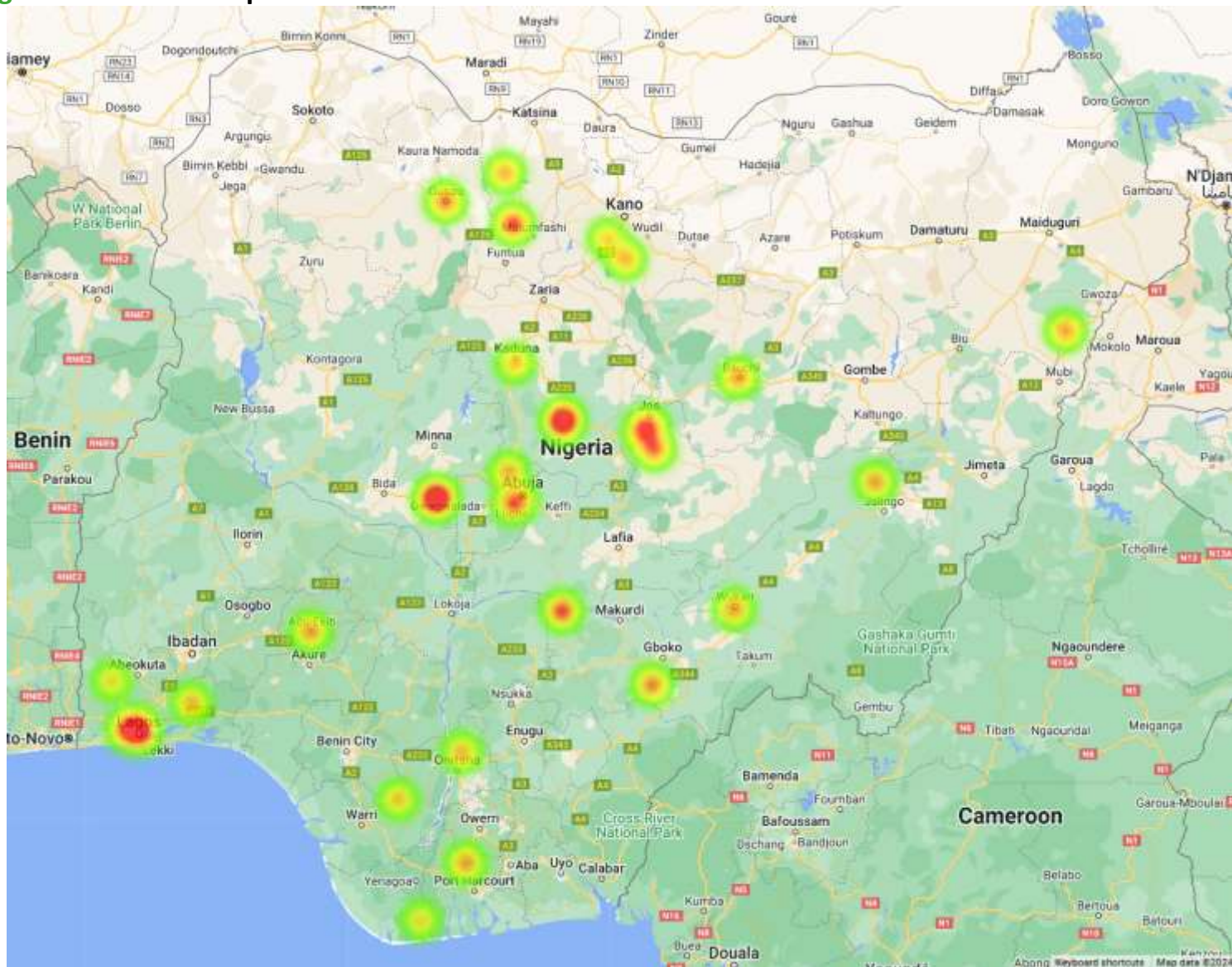
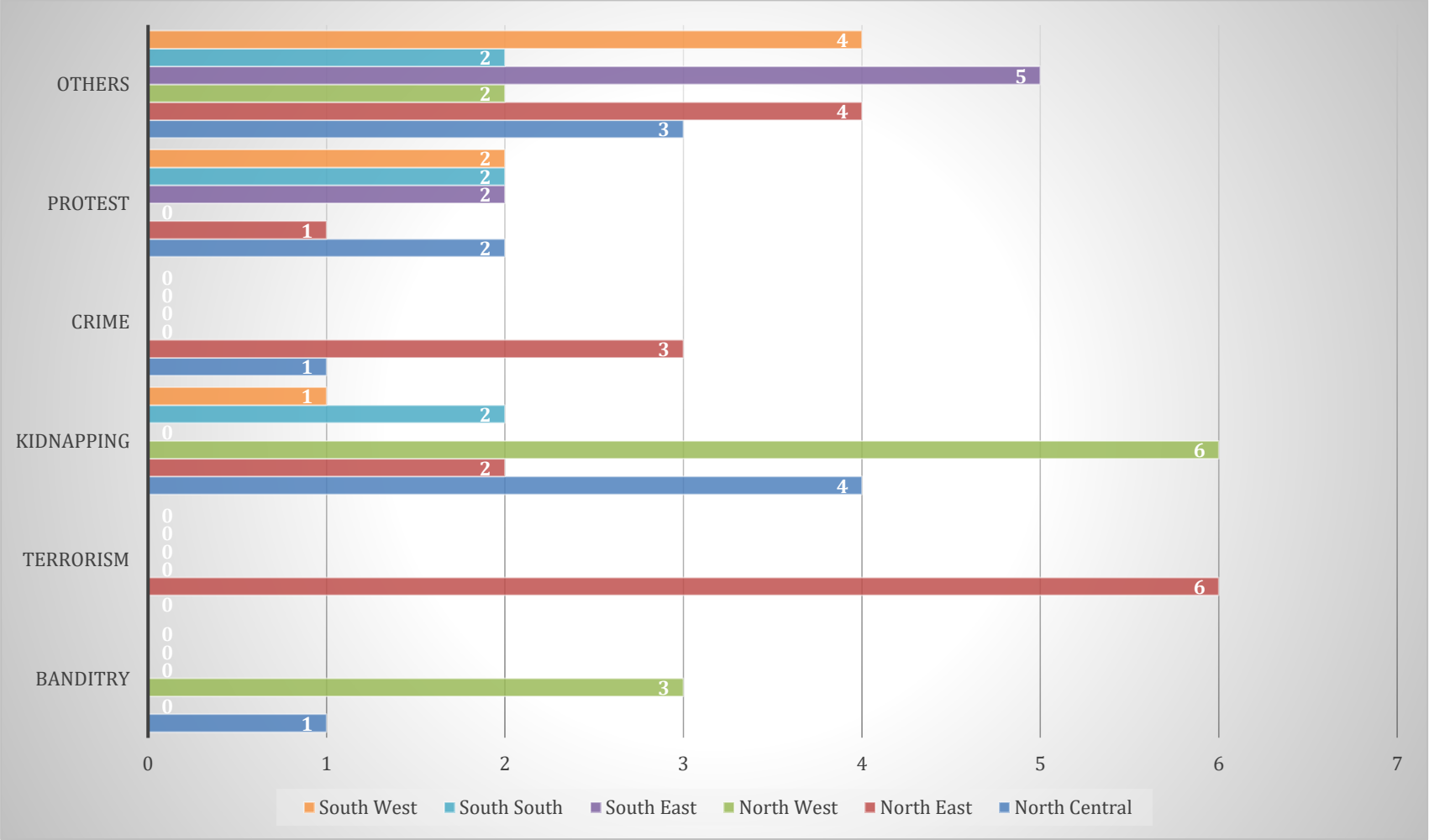


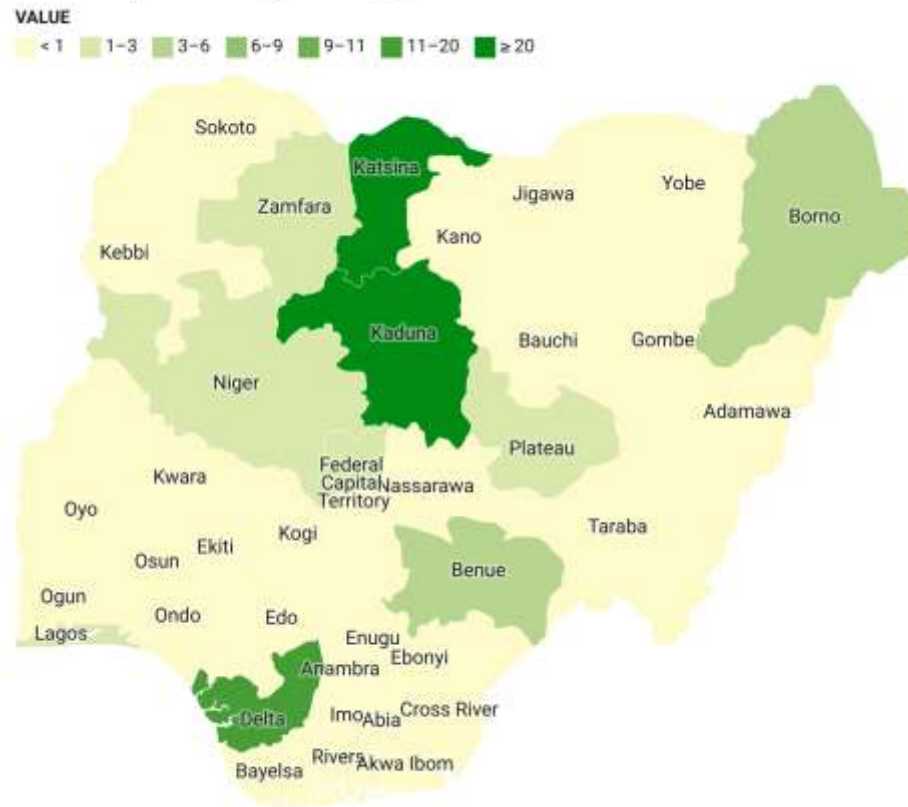
Figure 2. Graph portraying incident types per region

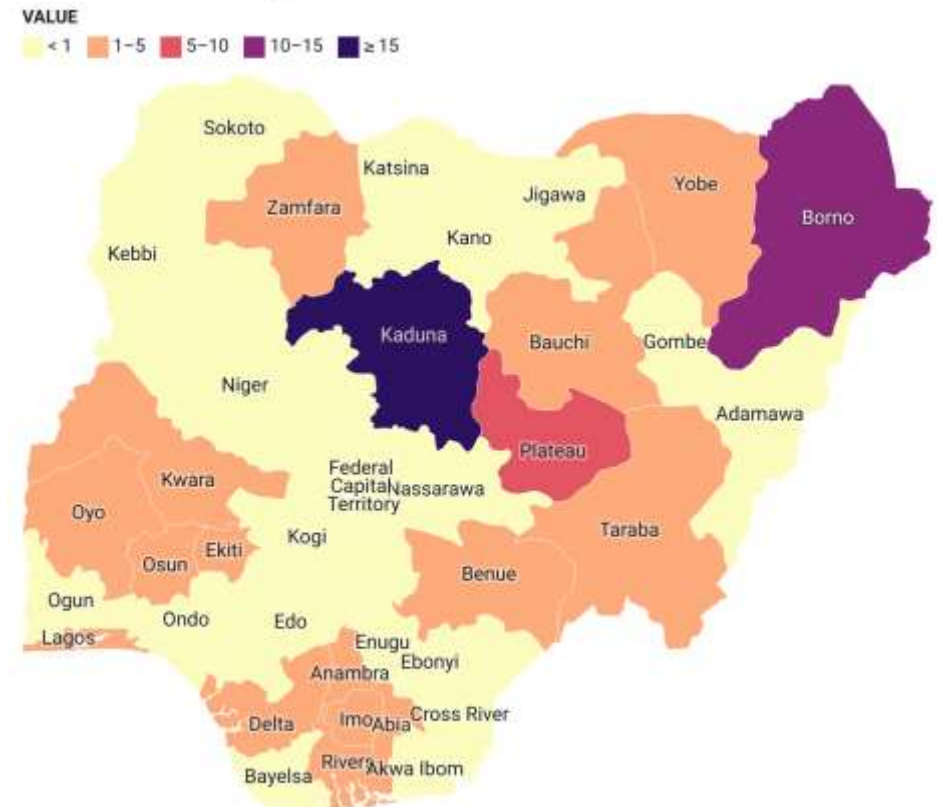

Regional fatalities/kidnapped victims

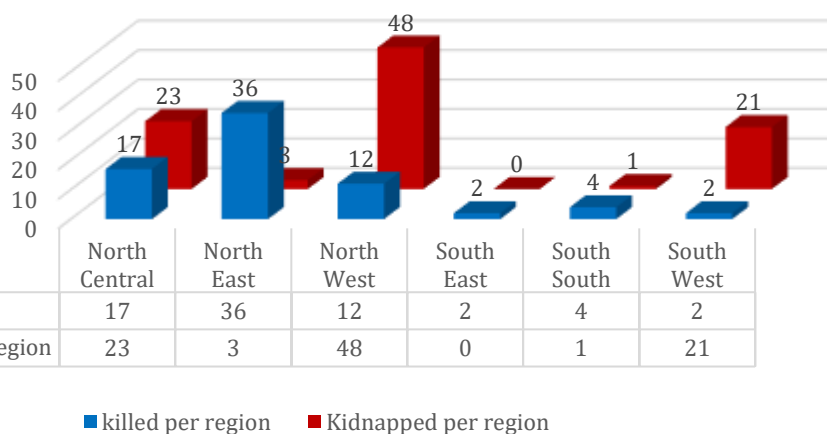
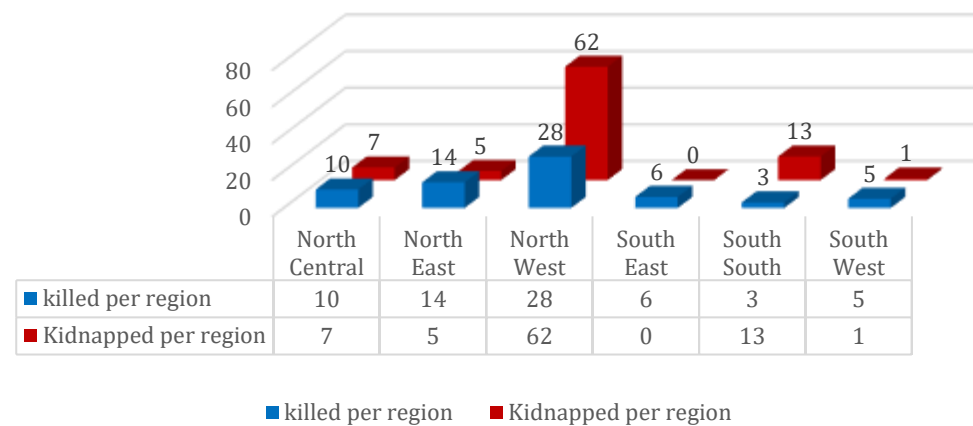


Figure 6. Week 28

Risk map showing killed victims

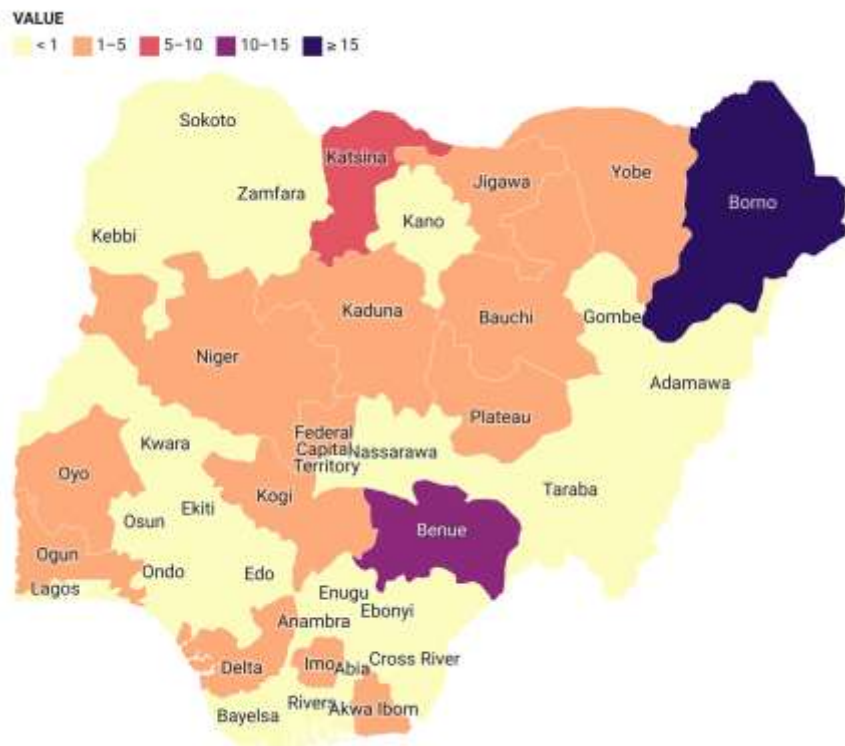
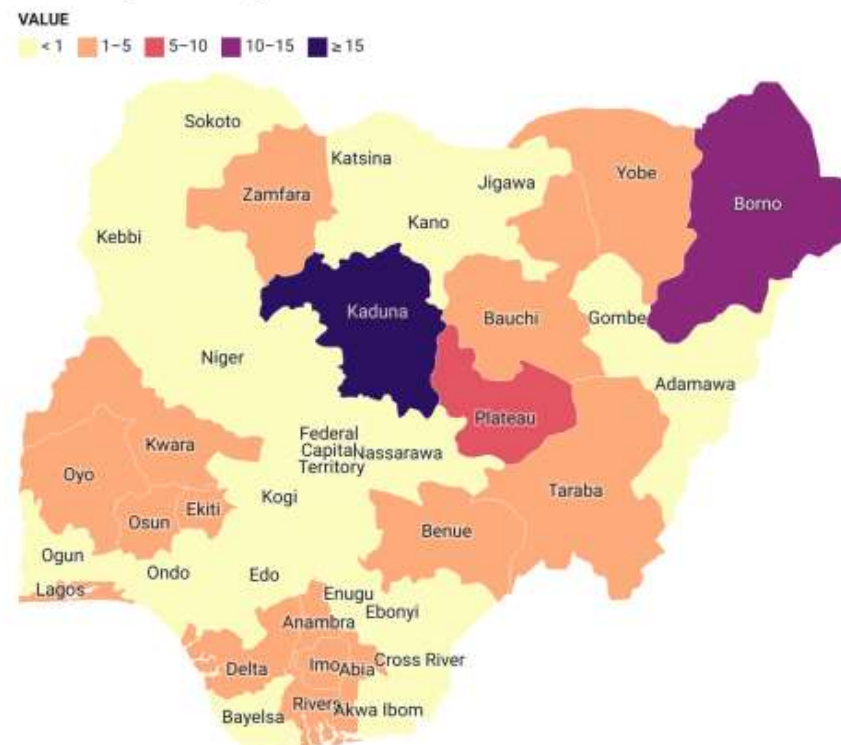


Figure 8. Week 28

The above figure shows a risk map contrasting areas where fatalities occurred in the country. The contrast between week 27 and week 28 helps spot the progression of conflict-related fatalities and shows areas where fatalities occurred the most and least. The color intensity and lightness depict areas with the least and most fatalities. Based on the above map, there was an overall increase in fatalities, with Borno and Kaduna states having the most fatalities nationwide.

Risk map showing kidnapped victims

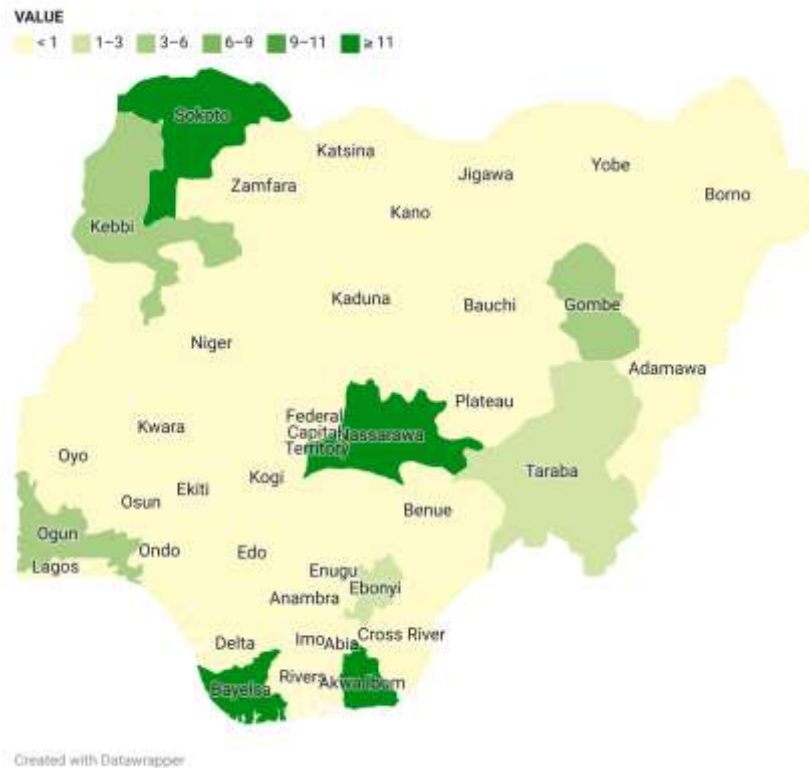
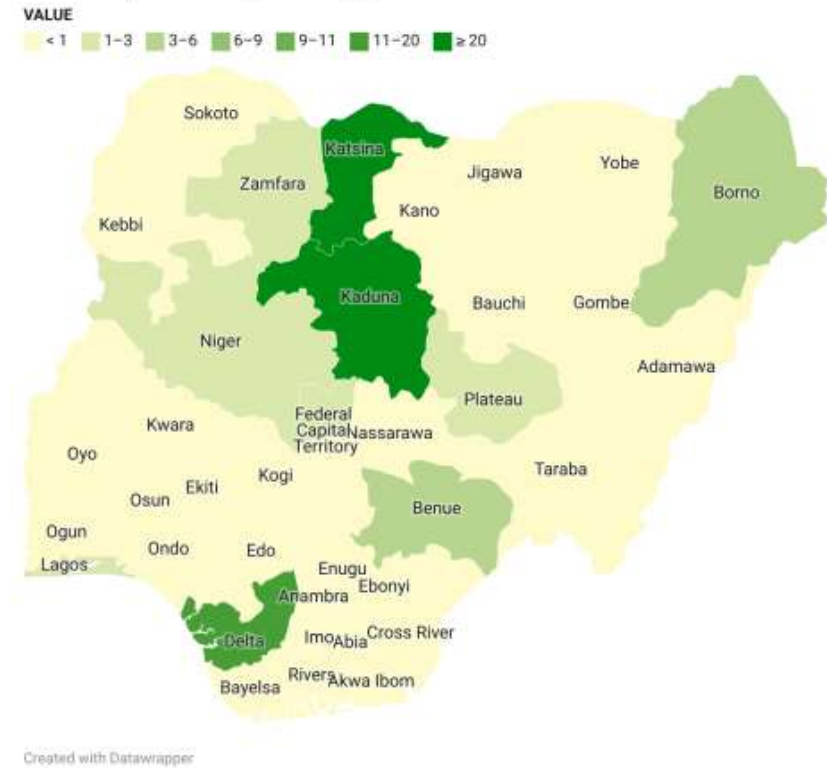


Figure 10. Week 28

The above figure captures areas where victims fall into kidnapping threats the most or least. In week 28, most kidnapped victims were from Katsina, Kaduna, and Delta states. This is most likely because kidnap incidents were underreported in other states during the week.

Regional Summary/Incident list

NORTH CENTRAL (NC) - Summary

Analysis – During the week, the number of fatalities decreased slightly with 10 fatalities recorded, while the count of kidnapping victims decreased significantly, with over 7 victims.

The North Central region experienced a slight decrease in reported incidents, from 12 the previous week to 11 this week. Key threats like herdsmen attacks, kidnappings, criminal activities, and protests remain significant concerns. Kidnapping incidents were prevalent in the reported period, with several high-profile cases. On 11 July 2024, Dr. Emmanuel Barki, the acting rector of Benue Polytechnic, and three staff members were kidnapped by gunmen while returning from an official assignment in Makurdi to Ugbokolo, Benue State. Another significant kidnapping occurred on 07 July 2024, when a former Chairman of the Nigerian Labour Congress (NLC) was abducted by unidentified armed individuals in the Gwarimpa area of Abuja. Additionally, on 06 July 2024, bandits attacked the Garam community in Tafa LGA, Niger State, and abducted at least five people, including a man, his pregnant wife, and their child. These incidents underscore the widespread issue of kidnapping across different states and the variety of targets, from educational staff to former labor union leaders and ordinary citizens.

The reporting period also witnessed numerous armed attacks resulting in fatalities and injuries. On 10 July 2024, an immigration officer attached to the military task force Operation Safe Haven (OPSH) was killed in a clash with suspected cattle rustlers in Fan community, Barikin LGA, Plateau State. On 08 July 2024, three persons were killed by yet-to-be-identified armed individuals in the Ikpele community, Agatu LGA, Benue State, with several others injured. On the same day, three more people were killed in renewed clashes in Maiyanga District, Bassa LGA, Plateau State.

On 09 July 2024, members of the Action Alliance (AA) protested at the office of the Kwara State Independent Electoral Commission (KWSIEC) in Oko Erin, Asa LGA, Kwara State, over the imposition of a nomination form fee for the upcoming election. Similarly, on the same day, members of the Non-Academic Staff Union (NASU) and Senior Staff Association of Nigerian Universities (SSANU) protested outside the University of Abuja school gates in Gwagwalada Area Council over unpaid salary arrears. These protests highlight the ongoing dissatisfaction among various groups regarding electoral processes and other socio-economic issues.

NORTH CENTRAL (NC) – Incident List

11 July 2024 – The acting rector of Benue Polytechnic, Ugbokolo, Benue State, Dr Emmanuel Barki, and three staff members of the institution have been kidnapped by gunmen. They were reportedly kidnapped on their way to Ugbokolo after an official assignment in Makurdi, Benue state.

10 July 2024 – An immigration officer attached to the military task force Operation Safe Haven (OPSH) was killed in a clash with suspected cattle rustlers while trying to recover rustled cattle IVO Fan community, Fan District, Barikin LGA, Plateau state.

09 July 2024 – Members of the Action Alliance (AA) held a protest at the office of the Kwara State Independent Electoral Commission (KWSIEC), Oko Erin, Asa LGA, Kwara State over the imposition of a nomination form fee for the upcoming election.

09 July 2024 – Members of the Non-Academic Staff Union (NASU) and Senior Staff Association of Nigerian Universities (SSANU) held a protest outside the University of Abuja school gates, Gwagwalada Area Council, over unpaid salary arrears.

08 July 2024 – Information from sources confirmed three persons were killed by yet-to-be-identified armed individuals in the Ikpele community, Agatu LGA, Benue state. Further reports confirmed that several people were also injured during the attack. Meanwhile, the circumstances surrounding the attack were yet to be ascertained.

08 July 2024 – Unidentified armed individuals killed three persons in renewed clashes in Maiyanga District in Bassa Local Government Area, Plateau State. The reports revealed the perpetrators stealthily attacked with machetes to avoid attracting the attention of SF stationed in the area.

07 July 2024 – Two suspected kidnappers were killed by irate youths when they stormed a police station in the Shiya community, Baruten LGA of Kwara state, and overpowered the officers on duty. Reports indicate that one of the suspects had been arrested by the police at a POS point while trying to deposit a ransom they collected, while the other suspect was arrested in the course of the investigation.

07 July 2024 – A group of unidentified armed individuals reportedly kidnapped a former Chairman of the Nigerian Labour Congress (NLC) in Abuja, FCT IVO Gwarimpa area of Abuja, in the early hours of the day.

06 July 2024 – Bandits attacked the Garam community in Tafa LGA, Niger state, and, abducted at least five people including a man, his pregnant wife, and their child.

06 July 2024 – Armed men abducted one person from his shop at Anguwan Hauawa in Bokkos LGA, Plateau state.

06 July 2024 – Armed individuals attacked and killed a woman in Kulias village, Bokkos LGA, Plateau state. The information further revealed that the HG security forces were trailing the perpetrators.

NORTH EAST (NE) - Summary

Analysis – There was an overall decrease in the number of fatalities as 14 persons were killed while kidnapped victims increased slightly to 5 victims as compared to the previous month.

The region experienced 16 major incidents this week, which is an increase, compared to the previous week. Patterns of incidents include terrorist attacks, murder, kidnapping, protests, and criminal incidents. Numerous armed terrorist attacks and clashes occurred, resulting in casualties and heightened insecurity. On 10 July 2024, suspected ISWAP fighters killed an individual in his residence near the College of Agriculture, Gujba LGA, Yobe State. On 09 July 2024, an explosion from an RPIED occurred near Mairari, along the Monguno-Maiduguri Road, Guzamala LGA, Borno State. Additionally, on 06 July 2024, ISWAP elements killed a community leader in Mahadiya Community, Gujba LGA, Yobe State. The same day, ISWAP and Bakoura fighters clashed in Shuwari, Kukawa LGA, Borno State, with unspecified casualties. These incidents reflect the ongoing violence perpetrated by these insurgent groups, contributing to the region's instability.

Despite the persistent threats caused by these attacks, operations by security personnel continue to significantly decrease the rate of these attacks. On 10 July 2024, a CJTF team arrested four suspects for breaking into residences and shops in Musari and Dubai communities, MMC, Borno State. Troops of Operation “HADIN KAI” supported by CJTF members engaged JAS insurgents in a firefight in Bula Dalo village, Bama LGA, Borno State. Four insurgents were killed, and weapons and ammunition were recovered. Meanwhile, members of the NASU and SSANU unions protested over unpaid salary arrears at the entrance of Abubakar Tafawa Balewa University (ATBU), Bauchi LGA, Bauchi State, on 09 July 2024.

The period saw a significant number of kidnapping incidents, particularly by insurgent groups. On 10 July 2024, AOG insurgents abducted two people traveling along the Maiduguri-Dikwa Road in Dikwa LGA, Borno State, and stole two vehicles. The same day, ex-JAS Shekau fighters kidnapped two individuals at their vehicle checkpoint (IVCP) on the Maiduguri-Dikwa Road in Bama LGA, Borno State, also carjacking two vehicles loaded with commodities. Additionally, on 06 July 2024, ISWAP fighters kidnapped three adult males gathering firewood near Awulari village, Bama LGA, Borno State, later demanding ₦1 million ransom each from their families.

NORTH EAST (NE) – Incident List

10 July 2024 – AOG insurgents abducted two people who were in transit along the Maiduguri-Dikwa Road, Dikwa LGA, Borno state. The insurgents also stole two vehicles.

10 July 2024 – A group of ex-JAS Shekau fighters abducted two people at their IVCP along the Maiduguri – Dikwa Road, Bama LGA, Borno state. The group also carjacked two vehicles loaded with commodities before withdrawing. They had yet to contact anyone about the victims.

10 July 2024 – A CJTF team arrested four suspects who broke into people's residences and shops in Musari and Dubai communities in MMC, Borno state, and handed them over to the police.

10 July 2024 – Suspected ISWAP fighters on foot attacked and killed an individual in his residence on the outskirts of the College of Agriculture, Gujba LGA, Yobe state. The reasons for the killing were unknown.

09 July 2024 – Members of the NASU and SSANU unions held a protest at the entrance of the Abubakar Tafawa Balewa University (ATBU) in Bauchi LGA, Bauchi state over unpaid salary arrears.

09 July 2024 – A vehicle detonated an RPIED resulting in an explosion in the vicinity of Mairari, along the Monguno-Maiduguri Road, Guzamala LGA, Borno state. No further details.

09 July 2024 – A tipper truck with laborers went to load sand IVO Wala A, approximately five km NE of the UN HH in Gwoza LGA, Borno state but was attacked by ex-JAS Shekau fighters. One person was killed while others escaped.

08 July 2024 – Suspected armed thugs attacked and killed a 60-year-old woman in Yelwa Ward, Toro LGA, Bauchi state. The victim was confirmed dead at a medical facility from injuries sustained during the incident.

08 July 2024 – Unidentified persons burgled a raw food store, during nighttime, in the Banki IDP Camp, opposite an INGO office, Bama LGA, Borno state, and stole an unspecified quantity of food items. The incident was reported to the HG Police.

07 July 2024 – Armed robbers broke into an apartment along Digil Road, IVO Bellohussain Pure Water Factory, Mubi North LGA, Adamawa state, injured two persons, and robbed the occupants of their valuables. The victims were taken to hospital for medical attention.

07 July 2024 – HG security forces carried out a coordinated raid on armed individuals' hideout IVO Ikaiyo Forest in Chonku Ward, Wukari LGA, Taraba state, and killed one suspect. Reportedly, one AK-47 rifle and a magazine loaded with 39 rounds of 7.62mm special ammunition were recovered.

06 July 2024 – ISWAP elements reportedly attacked the Mahadiya Community around the College of Agriculture and killed one person (the community leader) in his residence. Mahadiya Community is about 20km South of Damaturu town in Gujba lga, Yobe state.

06 July 2024 – ISWAP armed fighters kidnapped three adult males who were gathering firewood around Awulari village, about 5 km North of Bama lga, Borno State. The kidnappers later contacted the victims' families demanding ₦1 million ransom each.

06 July 2024 – Troops of Operation “HADIN KAI” supported by CJTF members engaged JAS insurgents in a firefight in Bula Dalo village, Bama LGA, Borno State. Four insurgents were killed, and weapons and ammunition were recovered.

06 July 2024 – ISWAP and Bakoura fighters clashed in the Shuwari area of Kukawa LGA, Borno State. Details of casualties on both sides were not available.

06 July 2024 – There was a firefight between ISWAP and JAS insurgents (Buduma faction) in Kukawa LGA, Borno state. An unspecified number of insurgents were killed and injured.

NORTH WEST (NW) - Summary

Analysis – The number of fatalities increased significantly, with 28 persons killed, while kidnapped individuals decreased significantly with over 5 victims during the week.

Between July 06 and July 12, 2024, numerous violent incidents and security operations occurred in the North West region. Kidnappings and abductions were notably frequent during this period, with several incidents involving armed individuals and organized criminal groups (OCGs). On 10 July 2024, members of an OCG invaded Akwando Village in Awon ward, Kachia LGA, Kaduna State, killing a 10-year-old child and two adults while abducting 24 people, mostly women and children. Another incident on 09 July 2024 involved an OCG attack in Dagwarga, Gumel ward, Kachia LGA, Kaduna State, where two people were killed and one person was abducted. On 07 July 2024, unidentified armed persons in hijabs kidnapped 26 people, mainly women and children, from the Runka community in Safana LGA, Katsina State. These incidents highlight the severe kidnapping crisis affecting various states of the region, with victims ranging from children to adults, and the involvement of both local and organized criminal elements.

Armed attacks and violent clashes also marked the period, resulting in numerous casualties and heightened insecurity. On 10 July 2024, suspected ISWAP fighters killed an individual at his residence near the College of Agriculture, Gujba LGA, Yobe State. On the same day, OCG members killed two people and abducted one person in Dagwarga, Gumel ward, Kachia LGA, Kaduna State. On 06 July 2024, an IVCP set up by suspected armed individuals along Shinkafi Road, Zamfara State, resulted in the deaths of two people and injuries to two others, including a young boy.

Several protests and incidents of civil unrest were reported. On 09 July 2024, different groups clashed at the disbanded emir's palace in Rano LGA, Kano State, forcing local government officials and representatives to flee until police restored order. On 09 July 2024, members of NASU and SSANU unions protested at the entrance of Abubakar Tafawa Balewa University (ATBU) in Bauchi LGA, Bauchi State, over unpaid salary arrears. Meanwhile, on 07 July 2024, armed robbers broke into an apartment along Digil Road, near Bellohussain Pure Water Factory, Mubi North LGA, Adamawa State, injuring two persons and robbing the occupants. These events underscore the diverse range of civil unrest, from labor protests to violent clashes over local disputes.

NORTH WEST (NW) – Incident List

10 July 2024 – A 10-year-old child and two adults were killed when members of an OCG invaded Akwando Village in Awon ward of Kachia LGA, Kaduna state 24 people mostly women and children were also abducted. A police investigation is ongoing.

09 July 2024 – Different groups of people clashed at the disbanded emir's palace in Rano Local Government Area of Kano State. The situation escalated, forcing the interim chairman of the local government council, and the representative of the reinstated 16th Emir of Kano to flee. The Police had restored law and order.

09 July 2024 – Armed individuals linked to OCG attacked Dagwarga in the Gumel ward of Kachia LGA, Kaduna state killed two people, and abducted one person before fleeing the area.

07 July 2024 – Unidentified armed individuals have invaded a community where they opened fire and wounded one person. The attackers also rustled an unspecified number of livestock in Kwace Huru Ward of Tangaza LGA, Sokoto state. A police investigation is in progress.

07 July 2024 – According to reports, armed individuals suspected to be members of OCG invaded Mararaban Walijo in Kachia LGA, Kaduna state, and abducted 19 persons. The local vigilantes mobilized and repelled further attacks, killing two of the assailants. An investigation is ongoing by the police.

07 July 2024 – Suspected armed persons invaded a family home in the Kofar Jange area of Gusau LGA, Zamfara state where they opened fire, killed two security guards, and subsequently, abducted one person. A police investigation is in progress.

07 July 2024 – Unidentified armed persons dressed in a “Hijab” women's robe, kidnapped 26 persons mostly women and children in an attack on the Runka community of Safana LGA, Katsina State. A police investigation is ongoing.

06 July 2024 – Suspected armed persons mounted an IVCP along Kwanar Jalof between Birnin Yero and Jangeru towns axis of Shinkafi road, Zamfara state. They opened small arms fire, killed two persons, and injured two others, including a young boy. The injured were receiving treatment in General Hospital, Shinkafi. A police investigation is ongoing.

06 July 2024 – There was a violent clash between members of the “Eiye” and the “Vikings” cult gangs in Dutse town, Dutse LGA, Jigawa State. An unspecified number of people were injured.

06 July 2024 – Armed individuals suspected to be members of OCG attacked the Danhonu community IVO Millenium City in Chikun LGA, Kaduna State, and abducted two journalists with some members of their families to an unknown destination. An investigation is ongoing by the police.

06 July 2024 – Armed men fired indiscriminately in Danhonu community, Millennium City, Chikun LGA, Kaduna State. Six people including two journalists, their wives, and two children were abducted.

SOUTH EAST (SE) – Summary

Analysis – The number of fatalities increased slightly, with 06 killed victims while kidnap victims stayed the same with no recorded victims during the week.

Cult-related violence was a significant concern during this period, with several incidents leading to fatalities. On 11 July 2024, a violent clash between the “Vikings” and the “Aye” cult gangs in Umukwa, Awka South LGA, Anambra State, resulted in one death. Similarly, on 07 July 2024, cult gang members killed a rival gang member at Amuzukwu in Umuahia North LGA, Abia State. The same day, another clash between the “Vikings” and “Aye” cult gangs in Amaikwo, Ayamelum LGA, Anambra State, led to the death of one individual.

There were several protests and instances of civil unrest during this period. On 10 July 2024, members of the Umuguma community held a protest at the Owerri Capital Department Authority (OCDA) office along Port Harcourt Road in Owerri West LGA, Imo State, over government encroachment on their land without adequate compensation or negotiation. On 09 July 2024, members of the NASU and SSANU unions protested at Abia State University (ABSU) in Isuikwuato LGA, Abia State, over unpaid salary arrears. These protests underscore ongoing dissatisfaction with government actions and labor disputes.

SOUTH EAST (SE) – Incident List

11 July 2024 - There was a violent clash between members of the “Vikings” and the “Aye” cult gangs in Umukwa, Awka South LGA, Anambra state. One person was killed.

10 July 2024 - Members of the Umuguma community held a protest at the Owerri Capital Department Authority (OCD) office along Port Harcourt Road in Owerri West LGA, Imo state over government encroachment of their land without adequate compensation or negotiation.

09 July 2024 - Members of the NASU and SSANU unions held a protest at the Abia State University (ABSU) in Isuikwuato LGA, Abia state over unpaid salary arrears.

07 July 2024 - Cult gang members killed a rival cult gang member at Amuzukwu in Umuahia North LGA, Abia state.

07 July 2024 - Unidentified armed men shot and killed three vigilantes in Umuaka community, Njaba LGA, Imo state.

07 July 2024 - Members of the “Vikings” cult gang killed a member of the “Aye” cult gang in Amaikwo, Ayamelum LGA, Anambra State.

06 July 2024 - Gunmen shot and killed a man in Umunoha, Mbaitoli LGA, Imo state.

SOUTH SOUTH (SS) – Summary

Analysis – The number of fatalities decreased this week with 03 victims captured, while over 13 individuals were kidnapped during the reporting week, which is an increase compared to the previous week.

Two kidnapping incidents were reported, reflecting ongoing security challenges. On 08 July 2024, unidentified armed individuals, suspected to be herdsmen, killed a 55-year-old farmer and kidnapped his wife in Ika South LGA, Delta State. The kidnappers demanded a ransom for the wife's release. Additionally, on 06 July 2024, gunmen attacked the Egbo community in Ughelli South LGA, Delta State, abducting at least 12 people, including a chief priestess and five followers.

Various protests occurred, driven by environmental, security, and socio-economic issues. On 12 July 2024, women from the Nembe Community in Bayelsa State protested over an oil spill by Aiteo Eastern and Production Company, demanding relief materials and compensation, and issuing a two-week ultimatum to the company. On 09 July 2024, the Ofuoma community in Ughelli LGA, Delta State, protested against increased herder attacks, blocking roads within the community. These protests reflect the communities' frustration and demand for justice and improved security.

On 10 July 2024, a member of a local vigilante group, OSPAC, was killed in Ikwere LGA, Rivers State, highlighting the risks faced by local security personnel. On 06 July 2024, special anti-kidnapping operatives of the police killed a suspected kidnapper and arrested three others in Ughelli LGA, Delta State, recovering an AK-47 variant rifle. On the same day, gunmen attacked the Egbo community in Ughelli South LGA, Delta State, abducting 12 people. These incidents reveal the ongoing violence and the efforts of security forces to combat criminal activities.

SOUTH SOUTH (SS) – Incident List

12 July 2024 - Women from the Nembe Community protested in Nembe Local Government Area, Bayelsa state over an oil spillage by Aiteo Eastern and Production Company and demanded relief materials and payment of compensation. Reports indicate the protesters gave the company 2 weeks ultimatum to meet their demands.

10 July 2024 - There was a tragedy in Rivers State following the killing of a member of a local vigilante group in Ikwere LGA, Rivers State, ONELGA Security Planning and Advisory Committee, OSPAC.

09 July 2024 - There was a protest in the Ofuoma community, Ughelli, Ughelli LGA, Delta state over increased herder attacks in their community. The protesters blocked the roads within the community.

08 July 2024 - Unidentified armed individuals suspected to be herdsmen killed a 55-year-old farmer and kidnapped his wife in Ika South LGA, Delta state. Further reports revealed that the kidnappers are demanding ransom for the release of the wife of the deceased. An investigation is ongoing.

06 July 2024 - The special anti-kidnapping operatives of the Police killed one suspected kidnapper and arrested three others at different locations in Ughelli LGA, Delta state during a security operation. One AK-47 variant rifle was recovered from the suspects.

06 July 2024 - Gunmen attacked Egbo community in Ughelli South LGA, Delta State. At least 12 people including a chief priestess and five followers were abducted.

SOUTH WEST (SW) - Summary

Analysis – The number of fatalities stayed the same with 2 fatalities captured while over 21 individuals were kidnapped during the reporting week. This is a significant increase, compared to the previous week.

The wave of kidnappings continued with the abduction of the Deputy Registrar of the Federal College of Education (Technical) from his official residence in Akoka, Lagos Mainland LGA, on 11 July 2024. Protests and civil unrest were prevalent, driven by issues ranging from unpaid wages to police violence. On 09 July 2024, members of the NASU and SSANU unions protested at the University of Lagos, Akoka, Lagos Mainland LGA,

over unpaid salary arrears, reflecting ongoing labor disputes. On 06 July 2024, youths in the Imala/Elega area of Abeokuta North LGA, Ogun State, protested the killing of a betting agent by policemen on 05 July 2024, resulting in police firing shots to disperse the crowd, injuring an unspecified number of people.

Several armed attacks and killings were reported, highlighting the volatile security situation. On 07 July 2024, a suspected cultist was waylaid and killed by a rival cult group near the Iwo road area of Ibadan, Oyo State, an incident linked to annual cult celebrations. On the same day, a violent clash between the “Aye” and “Eiye” cult gangs in the Akesan area of Igando, Alimosho LGA, Lagos State, resulted in one death. On 06 July 2024, unidentified armed individuals suspected to be armed robbers shot and killed a woman who resisted them on NTA Road in Ado Ekiti LGA, Ekiti State. Additionally, the bodies of two individuals were recovered from a dilapidated building in Inisa, Odo-Otin LGA, Osun State, after they allegedly stabbed each other to death following a heated altercation.

SOUTH WEST (SW) – Incident List

11 July 2024 - Gunmen abducted the Deputy Registrar of the Federal College of Education (Technical) from his official residence in Akoka, Lagos Mainland LGA.

09 July 2024 - Members of the NASU and SSANU unions held a protest at the University of Lagos, Akoka, Lagos Mainland LGA, over unpaid salary arrears.

07 July 2024 - A suspected cultist was waylaid by members of a rival cult group and shot dead IVO Iwo road area of Ibadan, Oyo state. The killing was speculated to be connected to a day celebrated yearly by various cult groups.

07 July 2024 - There was a violent clash between members of the “Aye” and the “Eiye” cult gangs in the Akesan area in Igando, Alimosho LGA, Lagos State. One person was killed.

06 July 2024 - The bodies of two persons were recovered from a dilapidated building in the Inisa area, Odo-Otin LGA, Osun State. Reports indicate that they had stabbed each other to death following a heated altercation. An investigation to ascertain the true cause of the deaths was ongoing.

06 July 2024 - Youths held a protest in the Imala/Elega area, Abeokuta North LGA in Ogun state, over the killing of a betting agent by policemen on 05 July 24. Policemen reportedly fired shots to disperse the protesters. An unspecified number of people were injured.

06 July 2024 - Unidentified armed individuals on a motorcycle suspected to be armed robbers shot a woman who resisted them from dispossessing her of her valuables along NTA Road in Ado Ekiti LGA, Ekiti State. Sources indicate that the assailants shot her dead and fled the scene immediately.
