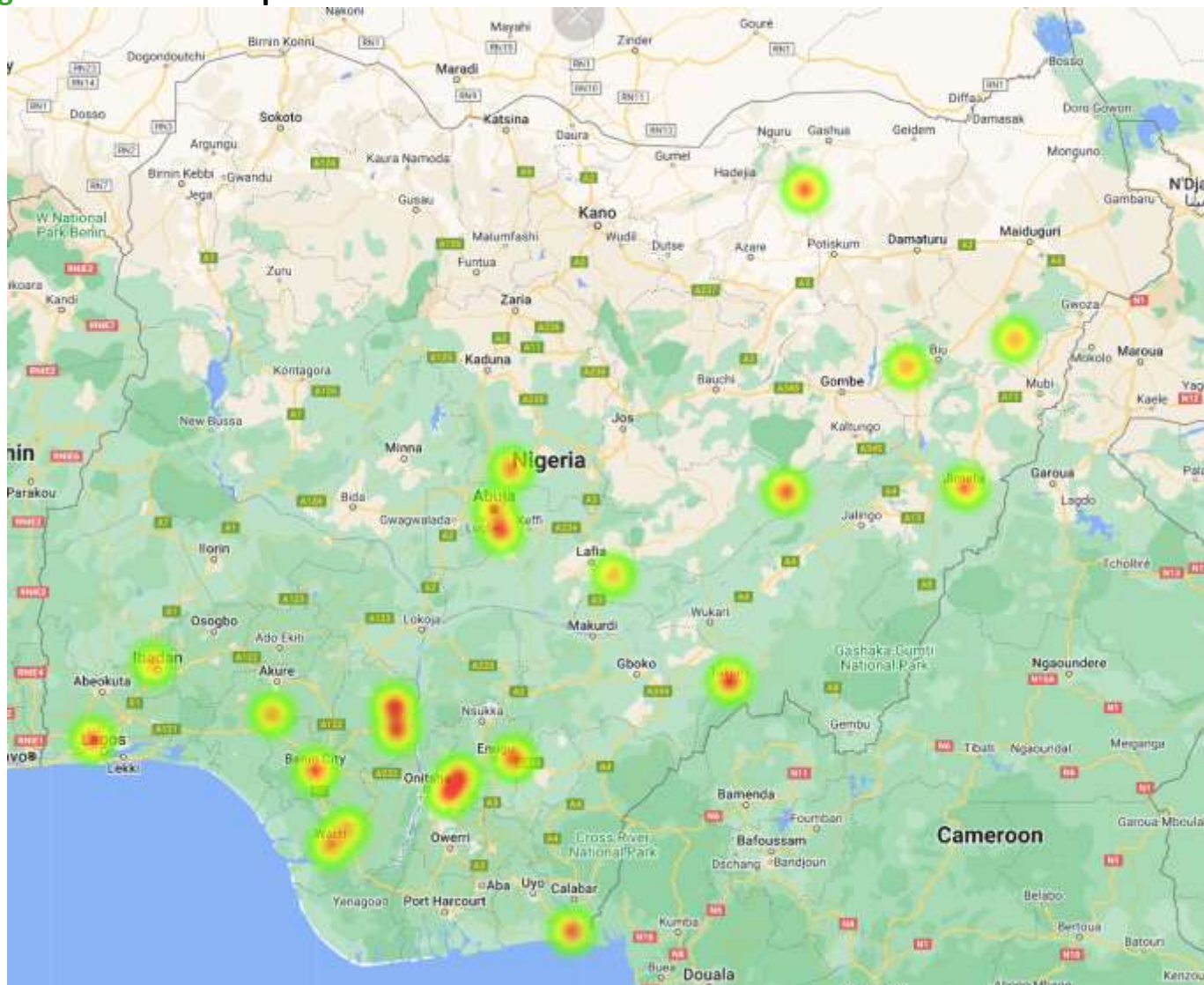


Figure 2. Graph portraying incident types per region

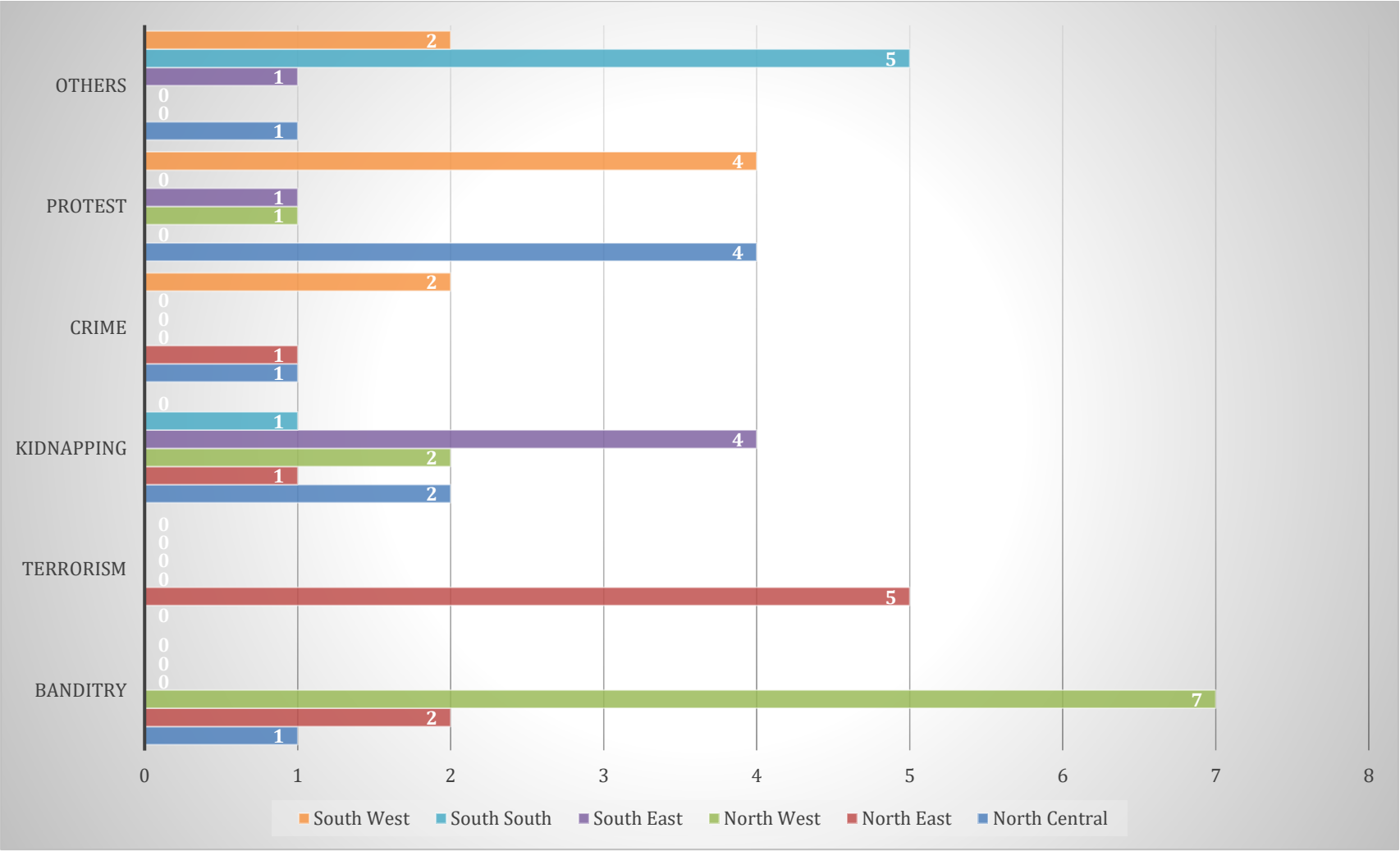

Regional fatalities/kidnapped victims

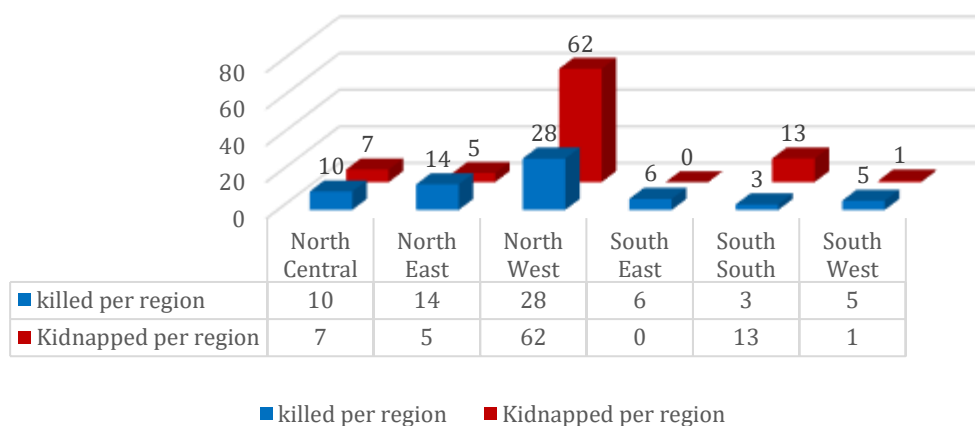
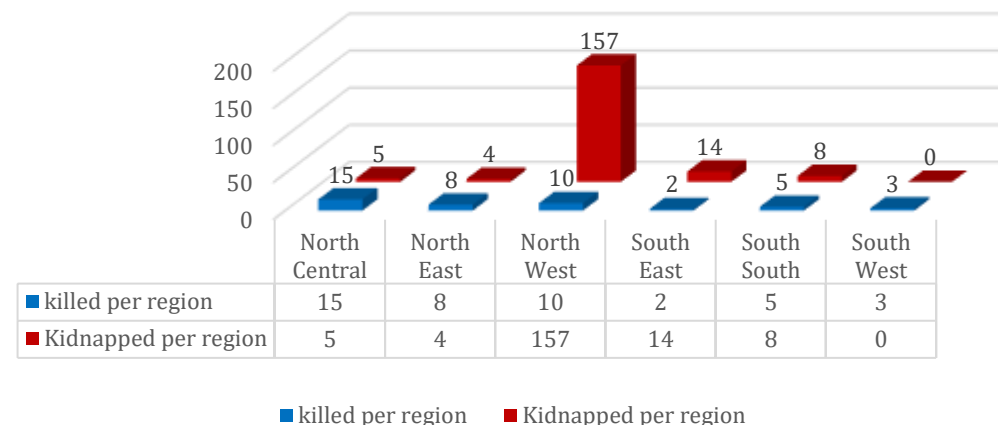


Figure 6. Week 29

Regional fatalities/kidnapped victims

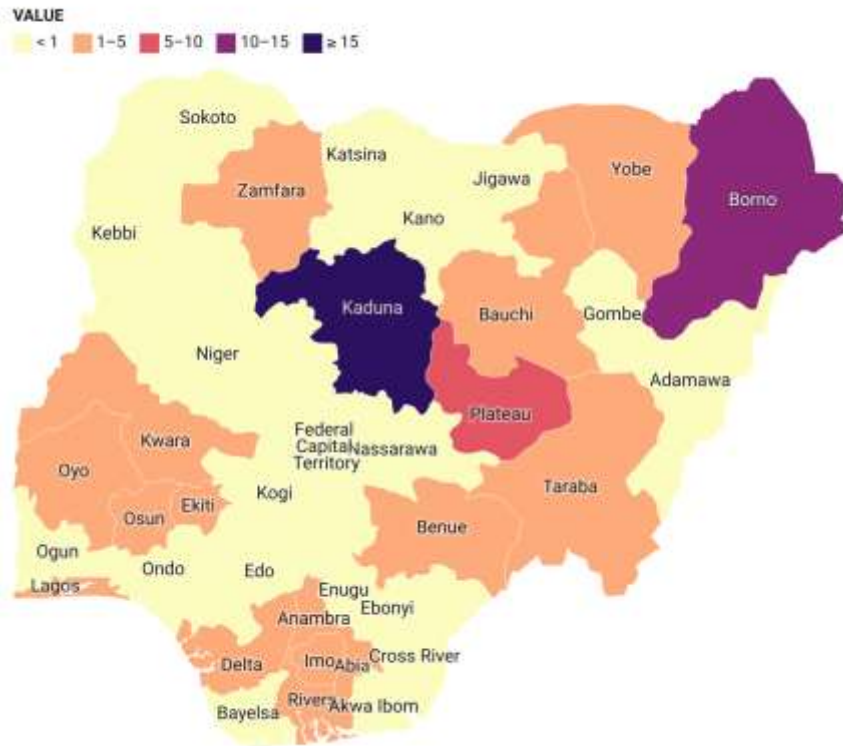

The figures show regions where conflict-related fatalities were high and low, also capturing regions with high/low numbers of kidnapped victims. The blue bar represents the number of persons killed, while the dark red represents kidnapped victims.

The above figure shows a risk map contrasting areas where fatalities occurred in the country. The contrast between week 28 and week 29 helps spot the progression of conflict-related fatalities and shows areas where fatalities occurred the most and least. The color intensity and lightness depict areas with the least and most fatalities. Based on the above map, there was an overall decrease in fatalities, with Benue state having the most fatalities nationwide.

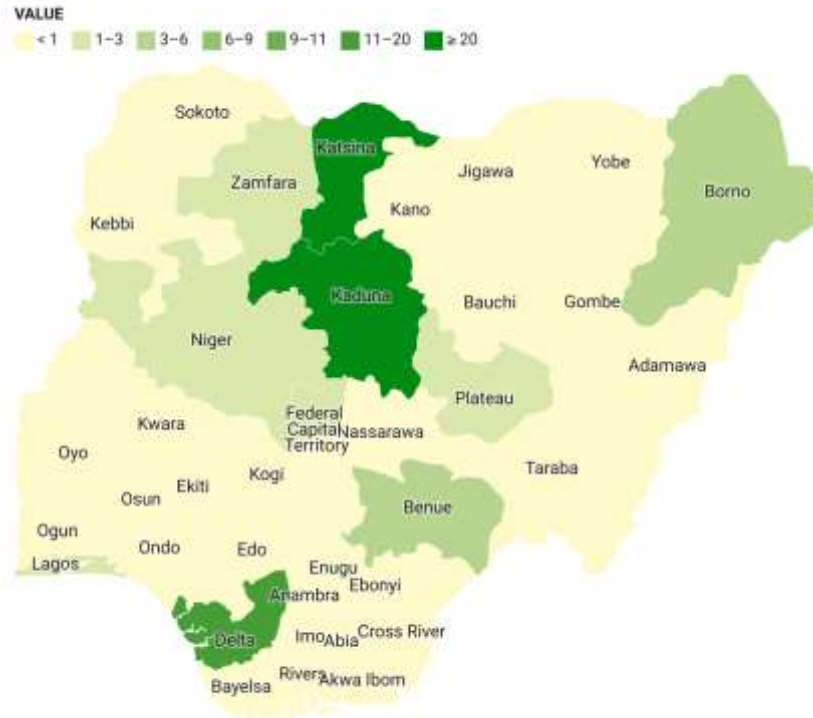
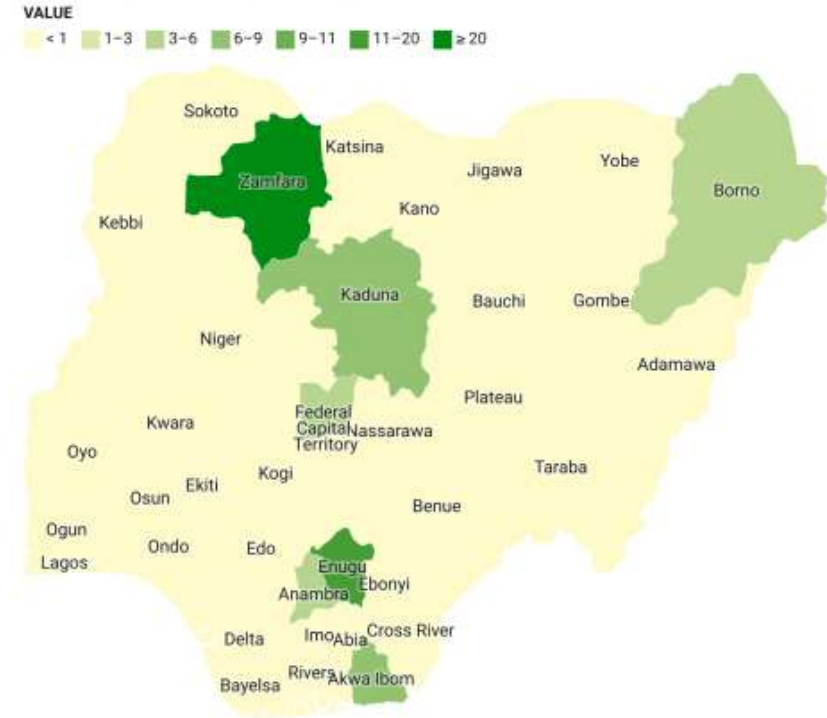


Figure 10. Week 29

The above figure captures areas where victims fall into kidnapping threats the most or least. In week 29, most kidnapped victims were from Zamfara state. This is most likely because kidnap incidents were underreported in other states during the week.

# Regional Summary/Incident list

## NORTH CENTRAL (NC) - Summary

**Analysis** – During the week, the number of fatalities increased slightly with 15 fatalities recorded, while the count of kidnapping victims decreased significantly, with over 5 victims.

The North Central region experienced a slight decrease in reported incidents, from 11 the previous week to 09 this week. Key threats like herdsmen attacks, kidnappings, criminal activities, and protests remain significant concerns. The armed attacks in Nasarawa, Plateau, FCT, and Benue states resulted in multiple fatalities, injuries, and abductions. On 19 July 2024, a Tiv community in Keana Local Government Area (LGA) of Nasarawa state allegedly launched an attack on an Alago settlement. This violent confrontation resulted in multiple injuries. The following day, 18 July 2024, Yakubu Muhammad, a youth leader of the Miyetti Allah Cattle Breeders Association of Nigeria (MACBAN) in Bassa LGA, Plateau State, was killed by gunmen while sitting at a tea selling point in the Jebu area. Additionally, on 17 July 2024, a group of at least 15 gunmen fired indiscriminately and attempted to abduct residents of El-Rufai Estate in Kuchiko, Bwari Area Council, FCT. One person was shot and injured in the attack, and Government Security Forces (GSF) personnel engaged the gunmen in a firefight until they withdrew.

On 15 July 2024, five individuals were abducted by unidentified armed individuals in Yangoji village, located in the Kwali Area Council of FCT, Abuja. The assailants attacked the residence of a prominent local politician, shooting him in the leg and kidnapping two of his children along with three other residents. Earlier, on 14 July 2024, gunmen suspected to be armed herders carried out separate attacks on Benue communities, resulting in the deaths of 13 people. Twelve individuals were killed in Egwuma, Agatu LGA, and one displaced person was killed in Gwer West LGA.

Protests and demonstrations were notably prevalent, with various groups expressing their grievances, leading to significant disruptions and confrontations with security forces. the Academic Staff Union of Educational and Associated Institutions (NASU) and the Senior Staff Association of Nigerian Universities (SSANU) from embarking on a protest to demand payment of their withheld salaries. On 17 July 2024, members of the Islamic Movement of Nigeria (IMN) held their annual Ashura procession in the vicinity of the Sky Memorial Complex, Wuse Zone 5, AMAC, FCT. GSF personnel were deployed to disperse the protesters. On the same day, nine communities hosting Tiv farmers in Obi and Awe LGAs, Nasarawa State, protested against a proposed agricultural program on 10,000 hectares of land. The spokesperson for the communities expressed confusion and concern over how the land was acquired by the state government. Earlier, on 13 July 2024, members of the IMN held a protest along Abacha Road in Karu LGA, Nasarawa state, resulting in significant traffic gridlock. The reason for the protest remains unknown.

## NORTH CENTRAL (NC) – Incident List

**19 July 2024** – A community predominantly inhabited by the Tiv in Keana Local Government Area, Nasarawa state allegedly attacked the Alago settlement, resulting in multiple injuries and the death of a woman who was raped.

**18 July 2024** – A youth leader of Miyetti Allah Cattle Breeders Association of Nigeria (MACBAN), in Bassa Local Government Area of Plateau State, Yakubu Muhammad, has been reportedly killed. It was learnt that the youth leader was shot dead by gunmen in the Jebu area of Bassa, around 7:40 pm on Thursday, while he was sitting at a tea selling point in the area.

**18 July 2024** – The Federal Capital Territory (FCT) Police Command, on Thursday morning, blocked protesting members of the Academic Staff Union of Educational and Associated Institutions (NASU) and the Senior Staff Association of Nigerian Universities (SSANU) from embarking on a protest to demand payment of their withheld salaries.

**17 July 2024** – At least 15 gunmen fired indiscriminately and attempted to abduct residents of El-Rufai Estate in Kuchiko, Bwari Area Council, FCT. One person was shot and injured. GSF personnel were deployed to the area and engaged the gunmen in a firefight until they withdrew.

**17 July 2024** – Members of the Islamic Movement of Nigeria (IMN) held their annual Ashura procession in the vicinity of the Sky Memorial Complex, Wuse Zone 5, AMAC, FCT. GSF personnel were deployed to the area to disperse the protesters.

**17 July 2024** – A total of nine communities hosting Tiv farmers in the Obi and Awe Local Government Areas of Nasarawa State have rejected a proposed agricultural program on 10,000 hectares of land in the area by the state government. Speaking with Journalists after a peaceful protest in Udugh, the Obi LGA on Wednesday, spokesperson for the communities, Felix Upav, explained that they were confused over the manner the land was acquired by the state government to commence the said agriculture program in the area.

**15 July 2024** – Reports indicate that five individuals were abducted by unidentified armed individuals in Yangoji village, located in the Kwali Area Council of FCT, Abuja. The assailants attacked the residence of a prominent local politician, shooting him in the leg and kidnapping two of his children. During the same operation, the armed men also abducted three other residents from the area, bringing the total number of captives to five.

**14 July 2024** – Gunmen suspected to be armed herders have killed 13 people in separate attacks on Benue communities on Sunday. According to locals, 12 people were reportedly killed in Egwuma in Agatu, and one displaced person returning from a farm in Gwer West LGAs, Benue state.

**13 July 2024** – Members of the Islamic Movement of Nigeria (IMN) held a protest along the Abacha Road in Karu LGA, Nasarawa state. The protesters barricaded the road, resulting in traffic gridlock. The reason for the protest is unknown.

## NORTH EAST (NE) - Summary

**Analysis –** There was an overall decrease in the number of fatalities as 8 persons were killed while kidnapped victims decreased slightly to 4 victims as compared to the previous month.

The region experienced 9 major incidents this week, which is a decrease, compared to the previous week. Patterns of incidents include terrorist attacks, counter-terrorism operations, kidnapping, and criminal incidents. Most incidents reported this week occurred in Borno and Yobe States. On 19 July 2024, ISWAP elements attacked a military position near Njilang village, Borno State. Military reinforcements from Chibok town were deployed to the location and managed to repel the attack around 1100 LT. Details of casualties remain unavailable at this time. On 13 July 2024, suspected ISWAP fighters in several gun trucks reportedly attacked the HG SF position in Goniri town, Gujba LGA, Yobe State. HG SF engaged the attackers in an exchange of fire and repelled the attack. Three soldiers were reportedly killed during the fire exchange, and the attackers withdrew. In a separate incident on the same day, a man and his three children were kidnapped from a farm inside the Government Girls Secondary School, about 3 km northeast of Bama town, Borno State, by unknown persons. The kidnappers later demanded ₦3 million ransom; however, all the victims were released the following day without any ransom.

Despite the persistence of terrorist activities in the region, a few security raids and counter-terrorism operations were also reported during the week. On 13 July 2024, troops of the Nigerian Army conducted clearance operations at a JAS insurgents' hideout in Bama town, Bama LGA, Borno State, resulting in a firefight between the soldiers and insurgents. Three insurgents were killed, 22 abducted victims were rescued, and valuables were destroyed. On the same day, AOG insurgents attacked farmers on their farms in the vicinity of the University of Maiduguri, Maiduguri LGA, Borno State. GSF personnel were deployed to the area and engaged the insurgents in a firefight until they withdrew. Additionally, AOG insurgents attacked a GSF position near Pump House, Ngala LGA, Borno State, resulting in a firefight until the insurgents withdrew. A joint team of security forces and vigilantes also raided ISWAP locations in Kanama village in Damboa LGA and Imimi Bulabulin in Konduga LGA, Borno State. The raid resulted in the death of one ISWAP member and the rescue of seven abandoned kidnap victims. The team also destroyed the camp and recovered 11 bicycles, 2 AK-47 magazines, and other materials.



## NORTH EAST (NE) – Incident List

**19 July 2024** – Reports indicated that ISWAP elements attacked a military position in Njilang village, Borno State. Military reinforcements from Chibok town were deployed to Njilang and managed to repel the attack at around 1100 LT. Details of casualties are not available.

**18 July 2024** – A joint SF and vigilante team raided ISWAP locations in Kanama village in Damboa LGA and Imimi Bulabulin in Konduga LGA, Borno State killing one ISWAP member and rescuing seven abandoned kidnap victims. The team also destroyed the camp and recovered 11 bicycles, 2 AK-47 magazines, and other materials.

**17 July 2024** – Due to a misunderstanding over the food rations in Hajj Camp Maiduguri (center for rehabilitation of ex-combatants), some ex-combatants assaulted a MOPOL officer at Maiduguri LGA, Borno state. Tensions were reported after the incident. However, at the time of writing the report, the situation was back to normal.

**15 July 2024** – Ex-JAS Shekau elements attacked some civilians on their farmland around the Ngurore/ Fadagwe Fulani area along the Gwoza-Bitta Road about 6.5 km West of the Gwoza UN HH, Borno state. One person was killed while the attackers stole the tractor the people were working with.

**13 July 2024** – Suspected ISWAP fighters in several gun trucks reportedly attacked the HG SF position in Goniri town, Gujba lga, Yobe state HG SF engaged the attackers in an exchange of fire and repelled the attack. Three soldiers were reportedly killed during the fire exchange, and the attackers withdrew.

**13 July 2024** – A man was kidnapped with his three children from a farm inside the Government Girls Secondary School, about 3 km NE of Bama town, Borno state by unknown persons. The kidnappers later demanded ₦3 million ransom, however, all the victims were released the following day without any ransom.

**13 July 2024** – Troops of the Nigerian Army conducted clearance operations at a JAS insurgents' hideout in Bama town, Bama LGA, Borno state resulting in a firefight between the soldiers and insurgents. Three insurgents were killed, 22 abducted victims were rescued, and valuables were destroyed.

**13 July 2024** – AOG insurgents attacked farmers on their farms in the vicinity of the University of Maiduguri, Maiduguri LGA, Borno state. GSF personnel were deployed to the area and engaged the insurgents in a firefight until they withdrew.

**13 July 2024** – AOG insurgents attacked a GSF position in the vicinity of Pump House, Ngala LGA, Borno state. The attack resulted in a firefight until the insurgents withdrew.

## NORTH WEST (NW) - Summary

**Analysis** – The number of fatalities decreased significantly, with 10 persons killed, while kidnapped individuals increased significantly with over 157 victims during the week.

Most incidents reported this week in Northwest Nigeria were concentrated in Kaduna, Katsina, and Zamfara States. On 17 July 2024, bandits attacked farmers in Kidanda village, Giwa Local Government Area (LGA), Kaduna State, resulting in two casualties, including one fatality. The farmers were reportedly attacked while working on their farmlands. On the same day, a farmer was shot dead in Dagwagwar village by members of an organized crime group (OCG) riding motorcycles. The criminals then proceeded to neighboring Gidan-Busa village, near Akilbu village along the Abuja-Kaduna highway, Kaduna State, where they abducted six family members. A police investigation is ongoing. On 14 July 2024, bandits attacked Zauma village in Bukkuyum LGA, Zamfara State. An unspecified number of shops were vandalized, and food items were stolen.

On 15 July 2024, unidentified armed individuals abducted seven persons from their homes located in Damba, on the outskirts of Gusau town, along the Funtua Main Supply Route (MSR), Zamfara State. Information received also revealed that the Islamic Movement of Nigeria (IMN), popularly known as Shiites, is planning a procession to mark the 2024 Islamic Ashura Day ceremony in Kaduna State. Nigerian Security Forces (SFs) are strategically positioned at key locations in the town. On the same day, bandits attacked Danisa village in Kaura Namoda LGA, Zamfara State, killing four people and abducting an unspecified number of individuals, including 150 persons and two babies.

## NORTH WEST (NW) – Incident List

**17 July 2024** – Bandits reportedly attacked farmers in Kidanda village, Giwa Local Government Area, Kaduna state resulting in 2 casualties including a fatality. Reports indicate that the farmers were attacked while working on their farmlands on 17 July.

**17 July 2024** – According to available information, a farmer was reportedly shot dead in Dagwagwar village by members of an OCG, riding motorcycles. The criminals then proceeded to neighbouring Gidan-Busa village, near Akilbu village, along the Abuja-Kaduna highway, Kaduna state where they abducted six family members. A police investigation is ongoing.

**16 July 2024** – Bandits killed a member of the Katsina Community Watch Corp (CWC) in Bare-Bari village, Safana LGA, Katsina state.

**16 July 2024** – Bandits attacked herders in Dutsin Ma, Dutsin Ma LGA, Katsina state. Vigilantes were mobilized and engaged the bandits in a firefight. Three herders were injured, and an unspecified number of cattle were rustled.

**15 July 2024** – Unidentified armed individuals abducted seven persons from their homes located in Damba, on the outskirts of Gusau town, IVO Funtua MSR, Zamfara state.

**15 July 2024** – Information received revealed that the Islamic Movement of Nigeria (IMN) popularly known as Shiites is planning a procession to mark the 2024 “Islamic Ashura Day” ceremony in Kaduna State. Nigeria SFs are strategically positioned at key places in the town.

**14 July 2024** – Bandits attacked Zauma village in Bukkuyum LGA, Zamfara state. An unspecified number of shops were vandalized, and food items were stolen.

**14 July 2024** – Bandits attacked Danisa village in Kaura Namoda LGA Zamfara state. Four people were killed, and an unspecified number were abducted. the group abducted 150 persons, including two babies

**13 July 2024** – Suspected armed persons attacked Danabashi village of Kekun Waje Ward in Bungudu LGA, Zamfara state.

**13 July 2024** – Bandits attacked Gidan Dawa village in Chafe LGA, Zamfara state. An unspecified number of people were killed, and others were injured.

## SOUTH EAST (SE) – Summary

**Analysis** – The number of fatalities decreased slightly, with 2 killed victims while kidnap victims increased with 14 kidnap victims recorded during the reporting week.

This week, incidents in Southeast Nigeria were notably reported in Anambra and Enugu States. On 16 July 2024, youths from Oba in Idemili North Local Government Area (LGA), Anambra State, blocked the Onitsha-Owerri expressway, denying motorists passage. The youths' actions were in response to the killing of an innocent youth on Monday night, allegedly by operatives of the Anambra Vigilante Group (AVG), known locally as Ebubeagu. On the same day, unidentified armed individuals kidnapped about 11 passengers from a commercial bus traveling from Awka to Abakaliki near the Amechi-Idodo axis of the Enugu-Abakaliki federal highway, Enugu State. This area has reportedly seen multiple abductions recently, and investigations are ongoing. Additionally, on 16 July 2024, a member of the “Aye” cult gang killed a member of the “Vikings” gang in Awada, Onitsha North LGA, Anambra State. This incident highlights the ongoing cult-related violence in the region.

On 13 July 2024, several attacks and abductions were reported in Anambra State. Gunmen attacked a vehicle and abducted the driver in Oraukwu, Idemili North LGA. In another incident, gunmen abducted a man from his vehicle near the Nnamdi Azikiwe University in Ifite Awka, Awka South LGA. Additionally, gunmen attacked a vehicle in the Nimo community, Njikoka LGA, resulting in one person being shot and killed, and another being abducted.

### **SOUTH EAST (SE) – Incident List**

**16 July 2024** - Youths of Oba in Idemili North Local Government Area of Anambra State have blocked the Onitsha-Owerri expressway, denying motorists passage. The youths said their actions were based on the killing of an innocent youth on Monday night by people they alleged to be operatives of the Anambra Vigilante Group (AVG), who are popularly called Ebubeagu in the area.

**16 July 2024** - Unidentified armed individuals kidnapped about 11 passengers in a commercial bus traveling from Awka to Abakiliki IVO Amechi-Idodo axis of the Enugu-Abakiliki federal highway, Enugu State. Reports further revealed that there have been reported incidents of abduction in recent times IVO that axis. Meanwhile, an investigation is ongoing.

**16 July 2024** - A member of the “Aye” cult gang killed a “Vikings” gang member in Awada, Onitsha North LGA, Anambra state.

**13 July 2024** - Gunmen attacked a vehicle and abducted the driver in Oraukwu, Idemili North LGA, Anambra state.

**13 July 2024** - Gunmen abducted a man from his vehicle in the vicinity of the Nnamdi Azikiwe University, Ifite Awka, Awka South LGA, Anambra state.

**13 July 2024** - Gunmen attacked a vehicle in Nimo community, Njikoka LGA, Anambra state. One person was shot and killed, and another was abducted.

### **SOUTH SOUTH (SS) – Summary**

**Analysis** – The number of fatalities decreased this week with 03 victims captured, while over 13 individuals were kidnapped during the reporting week, which is an increase compared to the previous week.



This week, incidents in the South-South region of Nigeria were reported primarily in Edo, Delta, Bayelsa, and Akwa Ibom States. On 18 July 2024, an undisclosed number of people were injured when armed thugs fired shots at the convoy of the Edo State governorship candidate of the All Progressives Congress (APC), Senator Monday Okpebholo, and former Deputy Governor Phillip Shaibu. The incident occurred at the exit gate of Benin Airport as they were leaving for Abuja. The yet-to-be-identified gunmen, positioned in a Toyota Sienna bus, reportedly opened fire on the convoy, leading to a reprisal from armed security details attached to the APC candidate and Shaibu. On 16 July 2024, violence erupted in Ogume, Ndokwa West LGA, Delta State, where a member of the “Vikings” cult gang was killed following an altercation. Additionally, in the Ogume community, Ndokwa LGA, Delta State, two friends died after a dispute over an alleged affair with a woman led to one being stabbed and the other killed in a reprisal attack by an angry mob. On 15 July 2024, a final-year student of Niger Delta University (NDU) in Bayelsa State was killed by youths over a minor financial dispute at a sand dump on Wilberforce Island, Amassoma.

Abductions were also a significant concern this week. On 15 July 2024, unidentified armed individuals abducted eight people, including a security force member, near Classic Point Hotel in the Ibaka area, Mbo LGA, Akwa Ibom State. The abductors have yet to contact the families of the victims, and their whereabouts remain unknown, with investigations ongoing. In terms of criminal acts and arrests, on 14 July 2024, a teenager was arrested by the Edo State Police Command in Ugboha, Esan South LGA, for killing his father with a sledgehammer over a monetary dispute. This incident underscores the range of security and criminal issues affecting the region.

## **SOUTH SOUTH (SS) – Incident List**

**18 July 2024** - An undisclosed number of persons were injured on Thursday when armed thugs fired shots at the convoy of the Edo State governorship candidate of the All Progressives Congress (APC), Senator Monday Okpebholo, and former Deputy Governor of the state, Phillip Shaibu as they were leaving the Benin Airport on arrival from Abuja.

**16 July 2024** - Reports revealed two friends died following a clash over issues relating to an alleged affair with a woman IVO Ogume community, Ndokwa LGA, Delta state. Further investigation revealed that one of the deceased was allegedly stabbed to death while the other was killed in a reprisal attack by an angry mob. An investigation was ongoing.

**16 July 2024** - A member of the “Vikings” cult gang killed another following an altercation in Ogume, Ndokwa West LGA, Delta state. Youths assaulted and killed the gang member.

**15 July 2024** - Reports revealed that a final year student of the Bayelsa State-owned Niger Delta University (NDU) was killed by some youths over a 150 Naira levy at a sand dump, at a popular relaxation spot IVO Wilberforce Island, Amassoma, Bayelsa state. An investigation was ongoing.

**15 July 2024** - Unidentified armed individuals reportedly abducted eight persons including a HG SF IVO Classic Point Hotel Ibaka area, Mbo LGA, Akwa Ibom state. The abductors were yet to make contact with the families of the victims, while the latter's whereabouts are still unknown. An investigation was ongoing.

**14 July 2024** - The Edo State Police Command arrested a teenager for killing his father, using a sledgehammer, over monetary demand at Ugboha, Esan South LGA, Edo state.

## SOUTH WEST (SW) - Summary

**Analysis** – The number of fatalities increased slightly with 3 fatalities captured while no individuals were kidnapped during the reporting week. This is a significant decrease, compared to the previous week.

This week in Southwest Nigeria, several types of incidents were reported, including armed attacks, clashes, protests, and robberies. On 18 July 2024, police operatives arrested a robbery suspect in Lafenwa, Abeokuta North LGA, Ogun State, for allegedly attacking and injuring a clergyman while attempting to steal his motorcycle and loot the church of electronic appliances and other valuables. The suspect was found in possession of a cutlass, scissors, and pliers. On 15 July 2024, four men armed with guns and cutlasses robbed a pharmaceutical store and attempted to kidnap the owner in Oko Oba, Orile Agege, Lagos State. The robbers fled when they got stuck in a bad road portion after residents raised an alarm. One suspect was apprehended by residents. Additionally, on 15 July 2024, unidentified armed men killed a maize farmer on his farm in Odomosibi, Ijebu-Igbo, Ogun State.

On 17 July 2024, students of the University of Ibadan (UI) protested at the school entrance along Sango-Ojoo Road, Ibadan North LGA, Oyo State, against increased tuition fees and power supply rationing. The protest led to a road blockade and traffic gridlock. On 16 July 2024, students in Ogun State protested the death of Idowu Pelumi David, a student of Gateway ICT Polytechnic, Sapade, Aiyeye Annexe, under the National Association of Nigerian Students and National Association of Ogun State Students. On the same day, protesters from the Coalition of Ondo State Indigenes Against Corruption (COIAC) called for the dismissal of the Vice Chancellor of the University of Medical Sciences, Ondo State, Prof. Adesegun Fatusi, just months before the end of his tenure. On 15 July 2024, transport workers in Shasha, Idimu, Ejigbo, and Ikotun areas, Lagos

State, staged a peaceful protest against alleged harassment and extortion by security officials collaborating with the police. The protest did not result in any casualties.

## **SOUTH WEST (SW) – Incident List**

**18 July 2024** - A robbery suspect was arrested by police operatives IVO Lafenwa, Abeokuta North LGA, Ogun state for allegedly attacking and injuring a clergyman while trying to rob him of his motorcycle and loot the church of electronic appliances, cables, and other valuables. A cutlass, scissors, and pliers were recovered from the suspect.

**17 July 2024** - A clash between rival cult groups has been reported along Irete Street in Ijora, Apapa Local Government Area, Lagos State resulting in a fatality. Reports indicate the clash occurred on 17 July, reprisal attacks are probable within the area.

**17 July 2024** - Students attending the University of Ibadan (UI) held a protest at the school entrance along the Sango-Ojoo Road in Ibadan North LGA, Oyo state over the increase of tuition fees and power supply rationing. The protesters barricaded the road resulting in traffic gridlock.

**16 July 2024** - Students in Ogun State, under the auspices of the National Association of Nigerian Students and National Association of Ogun State Students, on Tuesday, protested the death of a student of Gateway ICT Polytechnic, Sapade, Aiyeye Annexe, Idowu Pelumi David.

**16 July 2024** - Protesters under the aegis of the Coalition of Ondo State Indigenes Against Corruption (COIAC), have asked for the sack of the Vice Chancellor of the University of Medical Sciences, Ondo State, Prof. Adesegun Fatusi. The call for his sack was coming barely eight months before the expiration of his tenure as the Vice Chancellor of the institution.

**15 July 2024** - Four men armed with guns and cutlasses robbed a pharmaceutical store and attempted to kidnap the owner at Oko Oba in the Orile Agege area, Lagos State. The culprits tried to drive away with the victim's car when but got stuck in a bad portion of the road, and they fled from the scene after some residents in the area raised the alarm. One of the suspects was eventually apprehended by residents.

**15 July 2024** - Transport workers in the Shasha, Idimu, Ejigbo, and Ikotun areas, Lagos State staged a protest over alleged continuous harassment and extortion by officials of various security forces that operate in synergy with the police in crime fighting across the state. However, the protest was peaceful. No casualty was recorded.

**15 July 2024** - Unidentified armed men killed a maize farmer on his farm in the Odomosibi area of Ijebu-Igbo, Ijebu North LGA, Ogun state.
