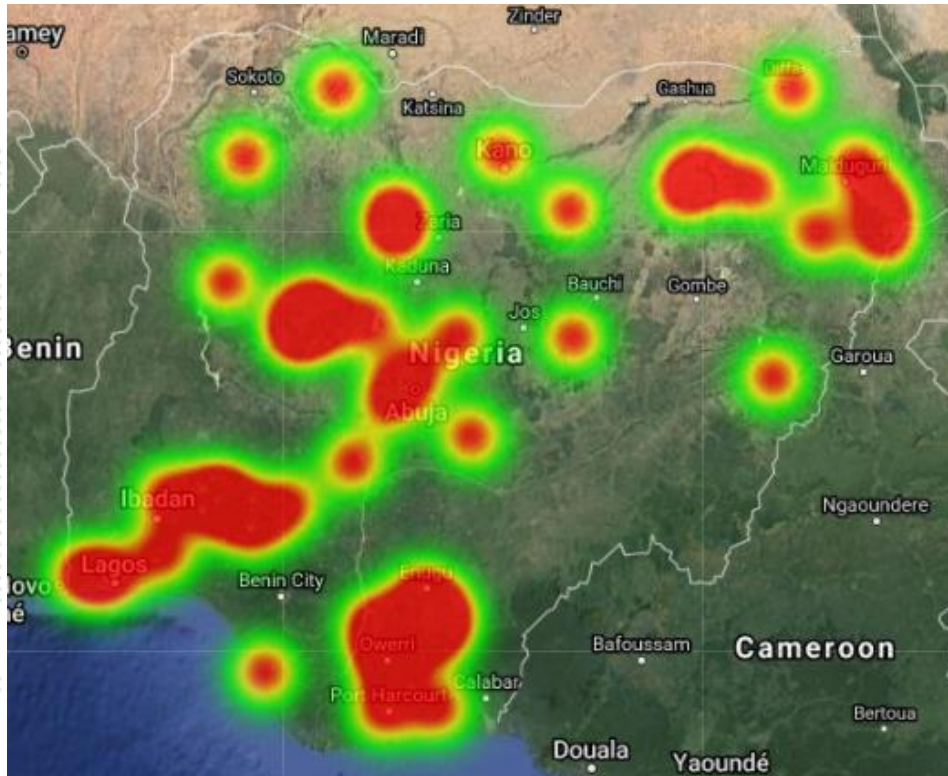

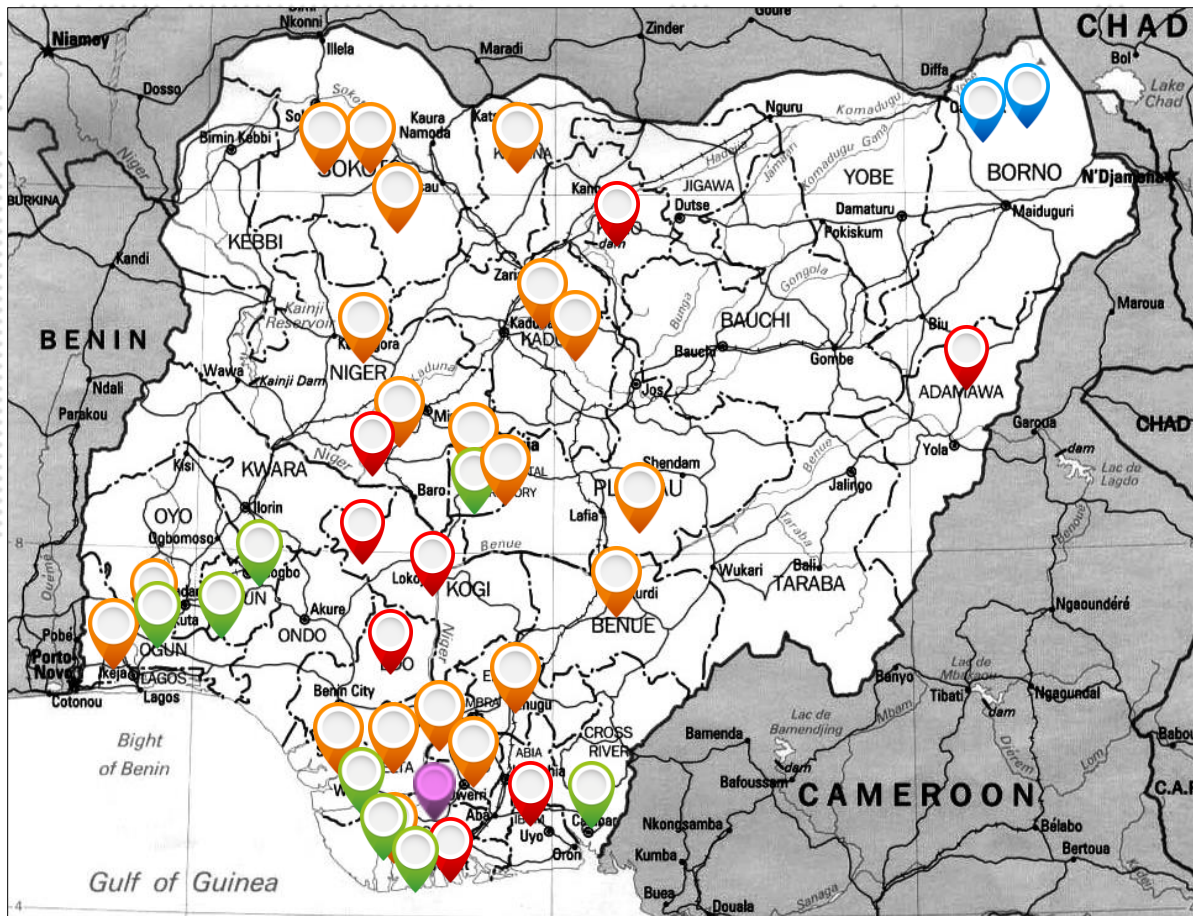

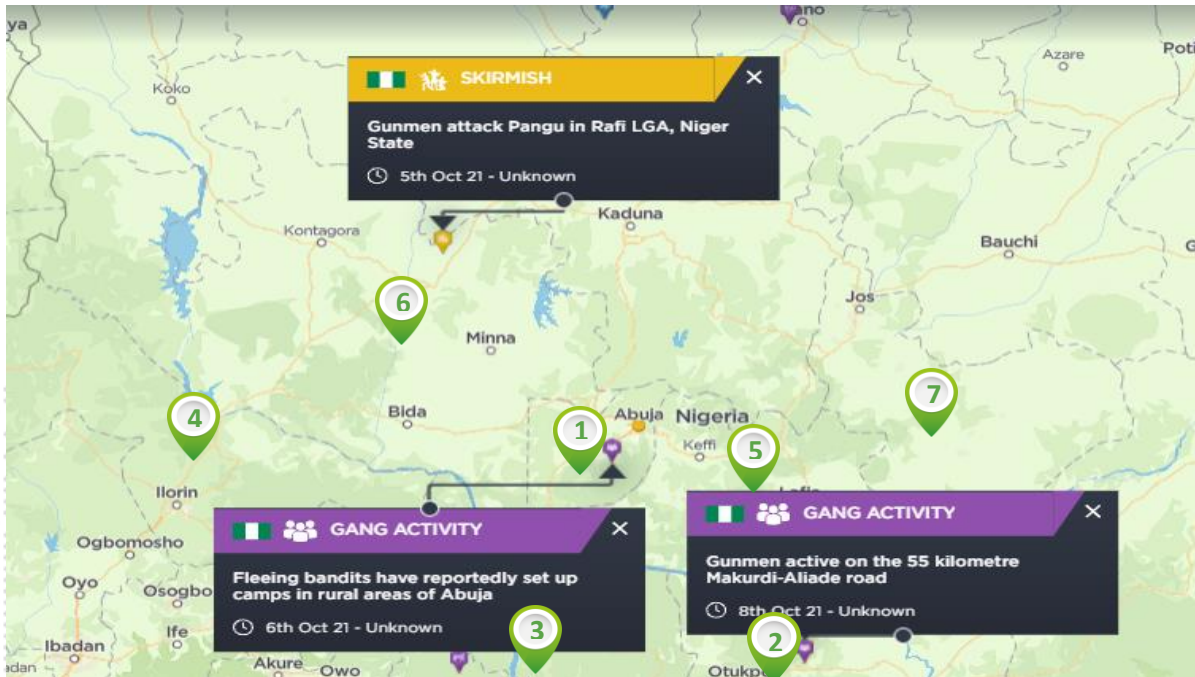
## OVERVIEW OF INCIDENTS FOR THE WEEK

**Incidents of the week** – Kogi State recorded a surge in kidnapping incidents during the week with five persons kidnapped from Kabba and Lokoja LGAs on 8 October. The incident recorded in Kabba was reported around 0830 hours and three high profile persons from the community were kidnapped. A ransom of NGN 30m has been demanded by the abductors to release the victims. Notably, Kabba is in proximity to Ekiti State which has witnessed an increase in kidnapping incidents. The recent surge in criminal activity has been attributed to the jail break recorded in September where at least 241 inmates were released following a jailbreak by armed men.

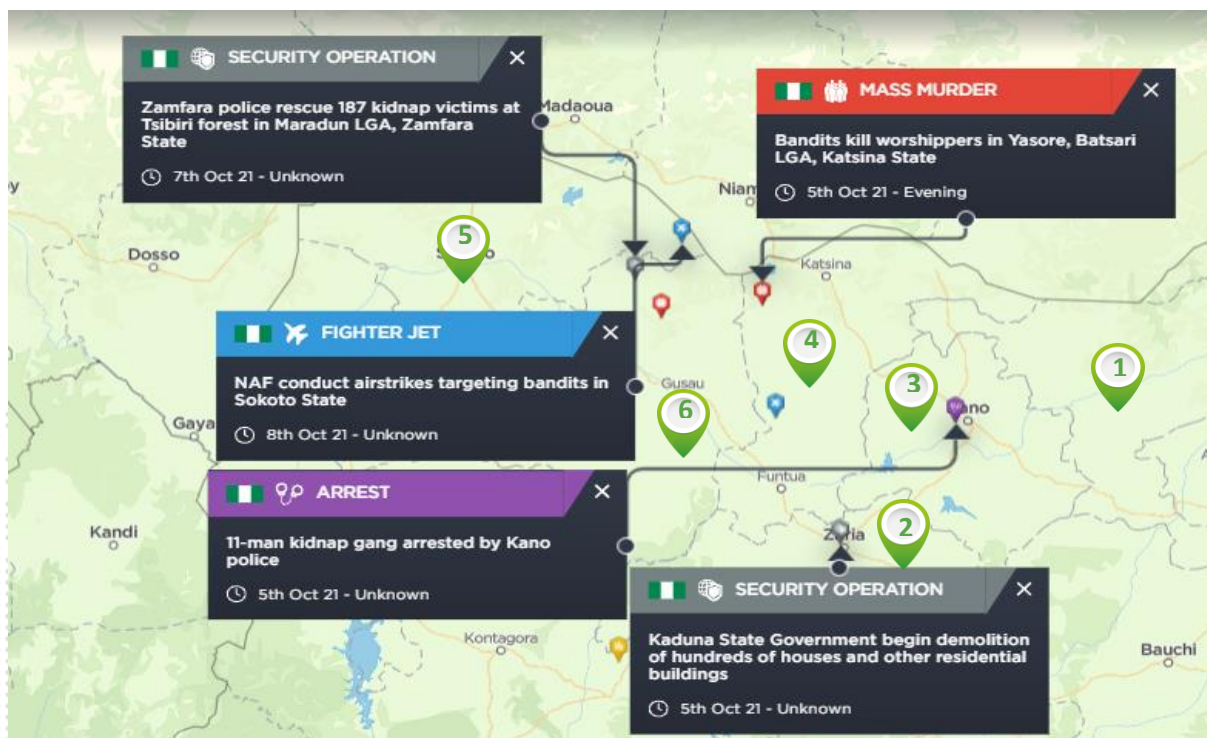

**Incidents of the week** – Number of reports on terrorist activities declined during the week. Nevertheless, a report emerged on 5 October about the clashes between ISWAP and Boko Haram terror groups resulted in the death of 87 Boko Haram terrorists residing along the Lake Chad axis of Borno State. Fighting have reportedly been ongoing between the two groups since June 2021 and in the incident, it was reported that five speed boats were used by ISWAP to invade the Boko Haram camp in the area last week. Two things can be deduced through this info. One, the Lake Chad area remains a major Boko Haram territory and two, the infighting between the terror groups continues despite the death of Boko Haram leader, Abubakar Shekau.

In Adamawa State, a mother and her baby were kidnapped by armed men who also attacked Ngurore Police Station in Yola to prevent any rescue mission from the police at about 0200 hours on 10 October.

**Incidents of the week** – More activities were witnessed in Sokoto State during the week with at least 41 persons killed in attacks orchestrated by armed groups including a proscribed group known as Yan Sakai who killed at least 22 traders identified as Fulani during Mammande weekly market on 7 October. They reportedly invaded at about 1700 hours with at least 200 armed men who also stole food items. It was reported that they took advantage of the telecoms shutdown which prevented locals from calling security forces to salvage the situation. This is one of the disadvantages of the current decision on the shutdown of telecommunications.

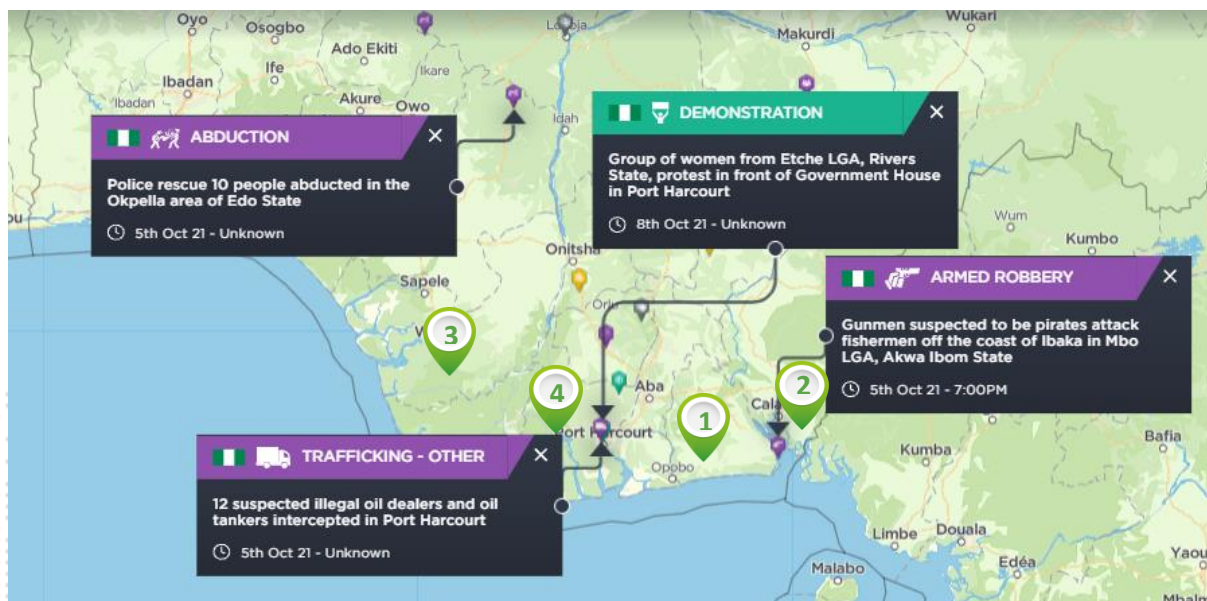

**Incidents of the week** – During the week, all the states in the SE region except Abia State recorded violent incidents either orchestrated by armed groups or by soldiers. Also, attacks on police officers and police stations have become a weekly activity in the region. There were reports of highhandedness by soldiers currently embarking on operation in the area specifically in Izombe community, Oguta LGA, Imo State. On 8 October, several houses were set ablaze by soldiers in a reprisal against youths in the community protesting the killing of a young man which reportedly led to the killing of two soldiers. The soldiers returned and set the community ablaze. Brutality by security personnel is common in Nigeria. A day prior to the abovementioned incident, at least ten persons including two lawyers and two police officers were killed by armed men in Isu and Onicha LGA, Ebonyi State. The indiscriminate violence fuelled by IPOB’s agitation led to the threat by FG, to declare a state of emergency in the region which might hinder the organisation of the gubernatorial elections in Anambra state.

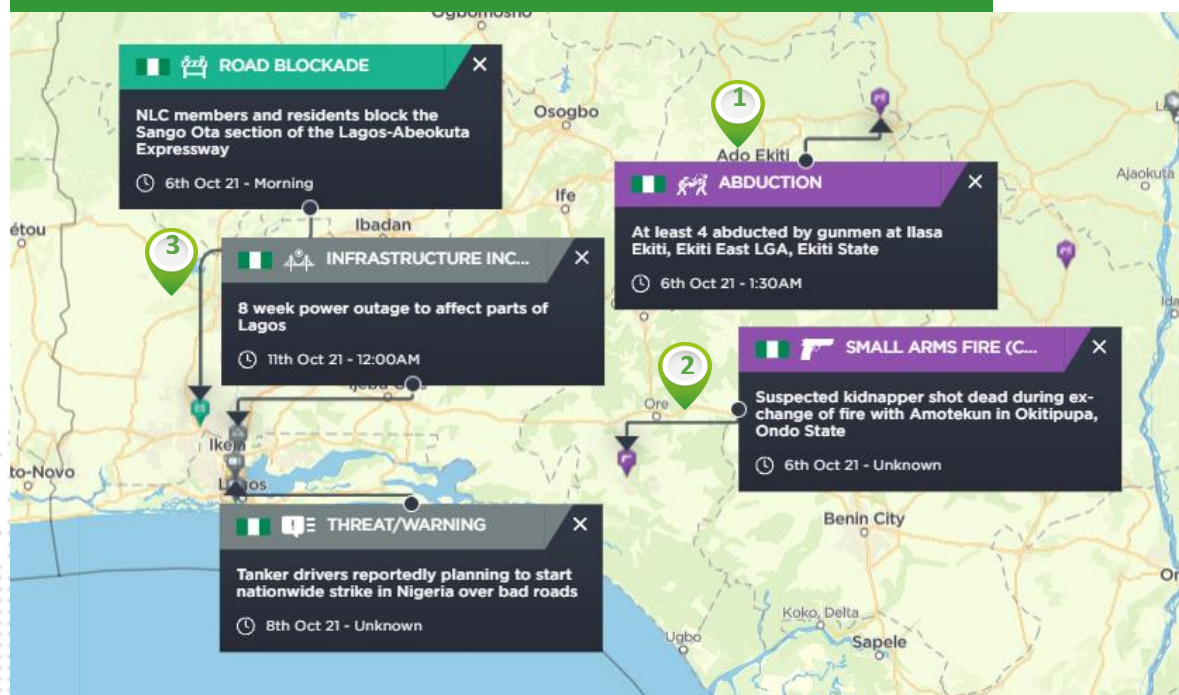

**Incidents of the week –** The incident which highlighted the week was the assault on the leader of Etche Local Council Assembly, Cynthia Nwala at Etche LGA, Rivers State. Her clothing was torn by men attached to the Chief Security Officer for reportedly stealing the mace following a conflict amongst legislators on 4 October. She was physically prevented from leaving the premises and her vehicle was vandalised allegedly at the order of the Chairman off the Assembly, Obinna Anyawu which he denied vehemently.

Women took to the streets of Port Harcourt on 6 October to protest the assault on the council woman demanding an apology and investigation into the matter. Generally, legislators are commonly known to embark on disputes which degenerates into violence.

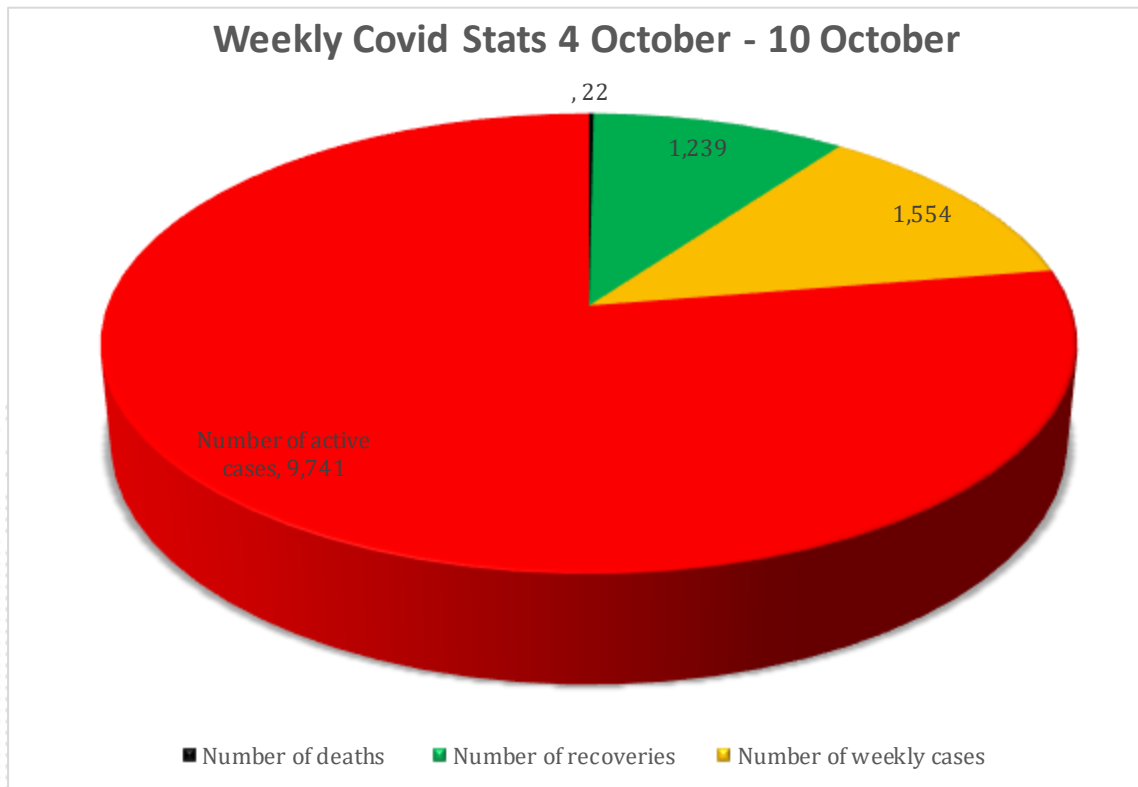

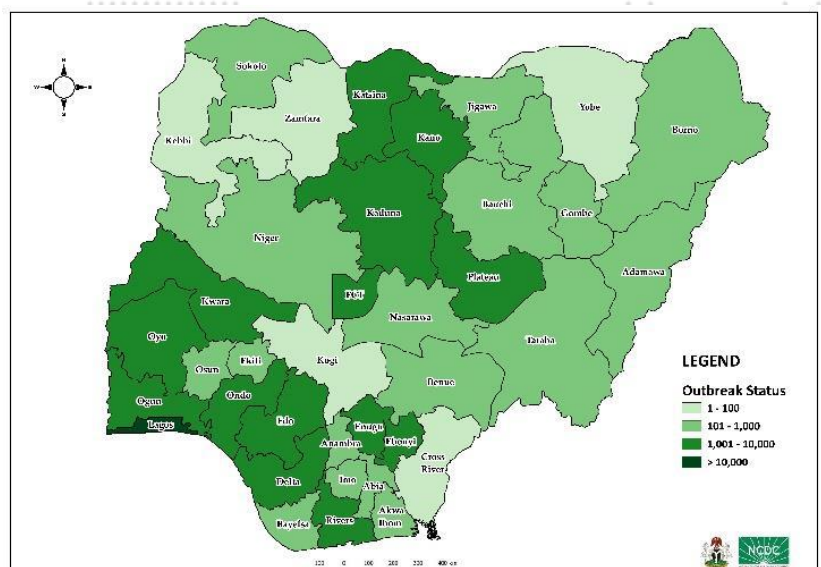
**Incidents of the week** – The week recorded a kidnapping incident in Ekiti State. Armed men attacked Eti-Ero farmstead in Ilesa-Ekiti at about 0130 hours and vandalized the area before kidnapping four persons including a boy. Kidnapping has become a common occurrence along routes and in towns in Ekiti. Most of the incidents have been attributed to Fulani armed herders. Their activities seem to have extended into Ondo State and in the last five weeks incidents have been recorded in border towns on Kogi State. Another kidnapping incident was reportedly foiled by Amotekun security men on 6 October in neighbouring Ondo State. One of the assailants was reportedly killed by a fellow assailant during the firefight which commenced in Okitipupa area of the state.

## OVERVIEW OF WEEKLY COVID-19 NUMBERS



First case of COVID-19 was recorded in the country on 27 February after an Italian national returned from his trip to Milan. Other cases have been recorded in all parts of the country. As of 10 October 2021, total number of confirmed cases is at 207,618. There is a surge in COVID-19 cases as the NCDC announced that the third wave has begun in the country.
