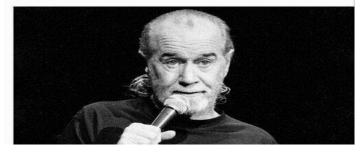
out. We do not offer transportation as a service to non-members.

If you don't feel comfortable answering a particular question, just skip it! No problem at all.

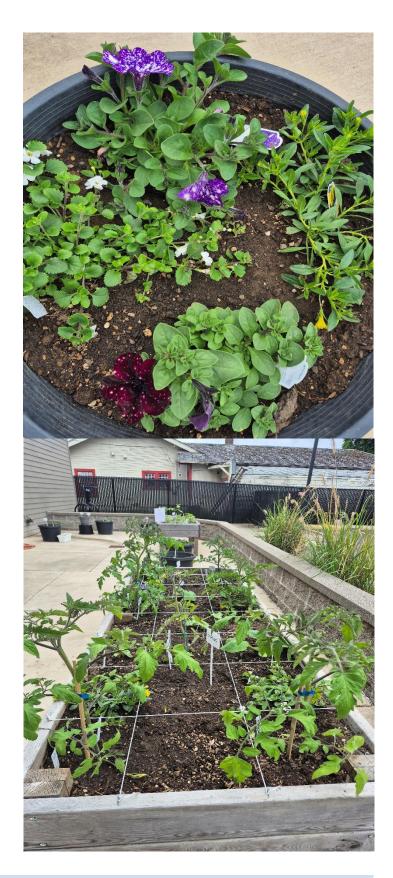
