

BREAKING NEWS: MI Secretary of State Jocelyn Benson Ordered to Explain Failure to Implement Court Order

Michigan Secretary of State Jocelyn Benson and her defense team have been ordered by Court of Claims Judge Brock Swartzle to provide their response to Attorney Ann Howard's motion to hold defendants in Contempt of Court. It has been 14 days since Benson was ordered to revise her May 2022 manual to comply with the Judge's October 20, 2022 order. There is no evidence that Benson or her office has taken any steps to comply with the order since that time. In contrast, her legal team, which now features Hillary Clinton lawyer Marc Elias, has filed well over 460 pages of pleadings founded on her argument that she does not have time to update 5 paragraphs in her 27 page manual.

Benson has been found to issue unlawful guidance in five separate court cases making her a serial lawbreaker. To date there has been no consequence for her unlawful actions which seem to be designed to create conflict at the polls. The motion to hold Jocelyn Benson in contempt is now before the court. Michigan will soon see if there are consequences for unlawful actions or not.
