Visibility Survey

Who contacts BSSC?

Why do people contact our service?

Do we provide the services expected?

During March this year, our staff kept records of contacts made with our organisation during the month. This information was collated and discussed at our Board Meeting in May and with the BSSC staff. Information collected included—

- Whether the person making contact was a client/potential client or from another organisation or business.
- Whether the person had contacted BSSC previously, and if so, how often did they make contact.
- How the person making contact heard about BSSC, if they had not made contact previously.
- Whether BSSC provided the information/service they expected.

Information collected was very helpful in assisting us to understand our visibility in the community, along with which of our services are accessed most regularly and who is making contact with BSSC.

Some facts and figures-

- During March, 200+ contacts were made with our office; this included phone and counter interactions.
- Most contacts were from clients or potential clients, but also included Qld and local government as well as contacts from businesses, support organisations, volunteer organisations and those wishing to make donations (eg, excess food from local businesses, second-hand furniture).
- Word-of-mouth is the most popular way that information about BSSC is shared—this was particularly the case in regards to new and potential clients.
- A great majority of the contacts said BSSC provided them with the information/service they were seeking .



A special thanks to our staff for collecting this information...remembering to complete a survey form each time BSSC was contacted was additional to their primary tasks.
