BSSC client and family transport service

Near the end of last year, BSSC applied for a \$35 000 grant from the Gambling Community Benefit Fund. This was for the purchase of a new Kia Carnival 8-seater people mover, to replace our current vehicle. In early May, we were informed that our grant application was successful!! BSSC funds of around \$20 000—donations from our community—will be used with the grant money, to purchase this vehicle. We have placed an order for this new vehicle, with delivery expected in December this year.

So why a vehicle like this?

Banana Shire Support Centre currently delivers a range of support programs and services to the community across the Banana Shire. Services include homelessness prevention and emergency relief. A new, 8-seater people mover to replace our current 2006 model SUV, will provide us with a safe and reliable vehicle that will greatly enhance the support we are able to offer our clients/families.

Homelessness/housing

Due to the alarmingly limited access to emergency housing in our shire, clients at times need to be accommodated in other locations such as Gladstone. This is very challenging because many of our clients do not have their own transport. Emergency accommodation, particularly for those experiencing domestic and family violence, often needs to be organised out-of-business hours when public transport is not available and public transport options in our rural location are extremely limited, irregular and expensive.

Health/emergency/other support

Clients regularly require our support and assistance to access health and other services both locally and within the greater region. This vehicle will allow us to better support clients to access such services. For example, a family who has no personal transport and needs to use public transport to travel to Rockhampton for a medical appointment, also requires two nights' accommodation in Rockhampton, because the bus travels only three times/week. The financial burden and disruptions to family routines and responsibilities caused (including disruptions to schooling), can impact greatly on the ability of families to access essential medical care.

Disability/Improved accessibility

A people mover provides improved accessibility for those clients/families with physical disabilities/mobility issues.

What now?

This is a new venture for BSSC, and with that comes unknowns! We recently received a grant of \$5000 from the CS Energy Community Sponsorship Program... THANKYOU CS Energy... to assist us to fund this service for 6 months. During this time, we will be better able to assess the demand for and costs associated with providing this service to our clients. We plan to ask clients to make a financial contribution to assist with vehicle running costs. BSSC is looking forward to partnering with other local community organisations, to also make this vehicle available for their use to assist clients.
