



Sequester Turf-type Tall Fescue

Premium Turfgrass

One of the most versatile and persistent turf grass species, tall fescue can be utilized from Canada to the mid-South and from coast to coast. Of the cool-season grasses, tall fescue is best at thriving in hot, dry conditions. That characteristic makes the species' geographic adaptation range very large, along with making tall fescue an option for well-drained or drought-prone soils. Furthermore, tall fescue is also very cold tolerant. The species has a wider leaf than perennial ryegrass or Kentucky bluegrass, but turf-type varieties, such as Sequester, have been developed to have a very soft feel. Development for Sequester finished in 2005, and it was specifically developed to have a dark green color and create a very dense turf. Sequester is an excellent option for premium turf mixes.

Turfgrass Ratings

In a private 2007-2008 Oregon trial with 40 varieties, Sequester ranked:

- 4th in early spring color.
- Top 25% in cumulative color.

In a private Oregon trial with six varieties (Montana, Sequester, Rebel IV, Mystix, Mustang 4, Lexington), Sequester ranked:

- 2nd in color rating.
- 2nd in turf quality rating.

In 2006 private trials in Oregon and Pennsylvania with 10 varieties (including well know varieties, such as Falcon 4, Rebel II, Inferno), Sequester averaged:

- Highest average turf quality rating.
- Highest average color rating.
- 3rd highest density rating.
- 2nd highest texture rating.

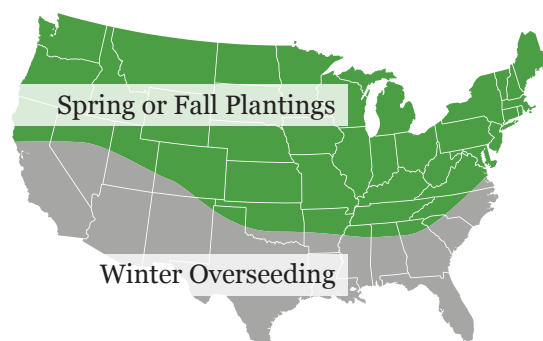
