WHEREAS, as part of Joint Water System Capital Improvements Project, the Joint Water System proposes to integrate the new instrumentation and controls to the existing controls located in the UV Facility; and

WHEREAS, the Joint Water System Capital Improvements Project's instrumentation and controls scope of work is anticipated to be included in multiple general construction contracts; and

WHEREAS, municipalities participating in the Joint Water System Capital Improvements Project have previously contracted with Aqualogics Systems, Inc. to furnish, install, and maintain equipment control and data acquisition systems; and

WHEREAS, the Village finds it desirable to obtain the integrated SCADA Controls for the Joint Water System Capital Improvements Project through Aqualogics Systems, Inc., so as to maintain continuity of programming and equipment, efficiency, and economy within the Joint Water System.

NOW THEREFORE BEIT RESOLVED: The Village Board authorizes the standardization of the integrated SCADA controls for the Joint Water System to Aqualogics Systems, Inc., as System Integrator for instrumentation and control components for the Joint Water System Capital Improvements Project; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately.
