There will be no cost to the Village, once they have more details they will share with the Board.

REGULAR MEETING

Clerk Trapp gave a report of Abstract #8 for a total of \$653,255.88: General \$192,290.88; Water \$3,692.21; Sewer \$7,252.72; Pool \$130.44; Water Ban \$439,214.33; Trust & Agency \$10,675.30. Buildings & Grounds

After reviewing all quotes that were provided and comparing the work that will be done the Board came to the decision that John Nevin Jr provided us with the best quote at \$6,500.00 for the work that he will be doing.

Officer Healy announced that they have replaced the Pepper Spray that was previously used with Crotega Repuls Spray, which is also non-lethal self-defense spray.

Mayor Brim reported that the Tower Ladder Truck blew a hydraulic line, the company came out and fixed it the next morning. Of course it is under warranty, however, it may have been that the hose was not long enough t60 begin with.

Mayor Brim stated that we have received bond money of \$350,000.00 for the Tower Ladder Truck. The general fund has been reimbursed the \$250,000.00 and \$100,000.00 to the Jordan Volunteer Fire Dept. to reimburse what was borrowed from prior to receiving the bond money.
