SPECIAL EDUCATION

Participants should quote what each is capable of doing. These participants usually quote what they can from the Bible Memorization category. They can be any age.

All Special Education participants will receive a second place size trophy with special wording on the trophy plate.

BIBLE MEMORIZATION RULES AND SCORING

The Bible Memorization Program is strictly a rote drill. Its purpose is two-fold: to acquaint youngsters with Bible memory and basic Bible precepts; and to prepare them for future competition in Bible Sword Drill, Bible Tic Tac Toe, and Bible Bowl. Bible Memorization is for Beginners 0 to 4 years old, 5 years old and Kindergarten, First, Second, and Third Grades. A child must be the correct age by December 31st to be put with the next grade level.

- 1. Participants should memorize the following according to their age and grade:
 - a. Beginners 0 to 4 years old Psalms 23
 - b. 5 years old & Kindergarten Psalms 23 and The Ten Commandments
 - c. First Grade Psalms 23, Romans Road, and The Ten Commandments
 - d. Second Grade Psalms 23, Romans Road, The Ten Commandments, Model Prayer, and the 12 Apostles
 - e. Third Grade Psalms 23, Romans Road, The Ten Commandments, Model Prayer, the 12 Apostles, The Beatitudes, and Books of the Old and New Testaments
- 2. The Quiz Panel consists of the following:
 - a. A <u>Quizmaster</u> has general oversight of the contest; explains the rules and procedures; sets the tone for a proper atmosphere; goes over the score sheets for the Judges before prayer and beginning the game.
 - b. <u>Three Judges</u> will score each participant according to the Bible Memorization Score Sheet.

3. Game Procedures

- a. Contestants should be divided according to age and grade so that the youngest compete first on through the third grades in order.
- b. The Quizmaster should call each contestant and then state the title of each item, in correct order, that is required for each grade level, e.g. for first graders the leader would call "Psalms 23," allowing the contestant to quote it, then "Romans Road to Salvation," allowing the contestant to quote it, etc.
- c. If a contestant fails to begin quoting 15 seconds after the Quizmaster states an item, the Quizmaster should move on to the next item, and the Judges should deduct one point under memorization for each item completely missed.

4. Scoring

- a. The Rating System is: 8-poor; 9-average; 10-above average.
- b. Contestants are scored on memorization, confidence, regular, not-sing-song.
- c. References must be stated before and after each category or points will be deducted.
- d. A separate sheet shall be used for each contestant.
- e. Judging must be totally objective and impartial.
- f. Each Judge shall mark scores without conferring with the other Judges.
- g. Judges should grade only what is required for that grade level. If a child says more than is required, then the Judges do not count it.
- h. One point is deducted: each time prompting is required, not to exceed 10 points in deductions; when five words are skipped; and when portions are stated out of order.
- i. Judges are to add score sheets across for subtotal, then deduct times prompted to get final score across. They should then add the final right column down for the Total Score.
- j. The combined score of all the Judges will be considered the final score.
- k. If a tie between two participants occurs, the Judges will select the passage to be quoted to break the tie.
- 1. The Quizmaster puts each contestant's total on the Bible Memorization Summary Sheet for final score.
- m. The contestant with the highest combined score in each grade shall be declared the winner. The contestant with the second highest score in each grade shall be declared second place finisher. The contestant with the third highest score in each grade shall be declared the third place finisher.
- n. Each person competing shall receive proper recognition (medallion with ribbon). The top three winners should receive a trophy.

GRADE ONE

1. Psalm 23 (citing the reference of Psalm 23 before and after the recitation)

The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want.

He maketh me to lie down in green pastures: he leadeth me beside the still waters.

He restoreth my soul: he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake.

Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me;

Thy rod and thy staff they comfort me.

Thou preparest a table before me in the presence of mine enemies: thou anointest my head with oil: my cup runneth over.

Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life: and I will dewell in the house of the Lord for ever.

2. Ten Commandments (citing the reference of Exodus 20:3-17 before and after recitation-the entire passage need not be recited, simply the excerpts, or commandments, themselves, as follows)-

Thou shalt have no other gods before me.

Thou shalt not make unto thee any graven image.

Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain.

Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy.

Honour thy father and thy mother.

Thou shalt not kill.

Thou shalt not commit adultery.

Thou shalt not steal.

Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbour.

Thou shalt not covet.

3. Romans Road to Salvations (citing reference before and after each Scripture)

Romans 3:23 For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God.

Romans 6:23 For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Romans 5:8 But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.

Romans 10:9 That if thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved.

Romans 10:10 For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.

Romans 10:13 For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved.

GRADE TWO

The three categories for Grade One are to be memorized and recited in addition to the following:

4. The Model Prayer (citing the reference of Matthew 6:9-13 before and after the recitation)

Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil: For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen.

5. Twelve Apostles (citing the reference of Luke 6:14-16 before and after the recitation)

Simon, Andrew, James, John, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Thomas, James the Son of Alphaeus, Simon called Zelotes, Judas the brother of James, and Judas Iscariot.

GRADE THREE

The three categories for Grade One and the two categories for Grade Two are to be memorized and recited in addition to the following:

6. Beatitudes (citing the reference of Matthew 5:3-12 before and after the recitation)

Blessed are the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are they that mourn: for they shall be comforted.

Blessed are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth.

Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled.

Blessed are the merciful: for they shall obtain mercy.

Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God. Blessed are the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God.

Blessed are they which are persecuted for righteousness' sake: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are ye when men revile you, and persecute you, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake.

Rejoice, and be exceeding glad: for great is your reward in heaven: for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you.
