If you ever see me driving down the road you can count on me doing one of two things, if my eyes are closed, I'm praying and if you see my lips moving, I am probably talking to myself.

When I had my churches down in McClure I had over an hour's commute. After 13 years of this commute the hour went by pretty quick because it gave me time to decompress and contemplate on a lot of my philosophical questions.

Now that I only have a 45-minute commute I still am doing the same things so if you see me on Buffalo Run Road and my eyes are closed don't judge me, I might be praying for you!

As I am writing this, I just got back from another pastoral road trip and as usual I was asking myself questions. My questions had to do with some Lent soul searching and what was in Jesus's mind leading up to his crucifixion.

The first question I had was ~ when did Jesus actually know he was destined for the cross?

Our Bible doesn't explicitly state when Jesus first knew he would be crucified, the Synoptic Gospels (Matthew, Mark, and Luke) record Jesus predicting his death and suffering, including crucifixion, multiple times during his ministry though.

So, another question I asked myself is when Jesus knew he was destined for the cross, I would think he would have been having some conversations with Dad along the lines of: Is my ministry on earth really coming to an end? Did I accomplish what you sent me for? I don't think my job here is done, surely, I can do more dad so why are you doing this to me?

I think these are legitimate questions considering clearly Jesus was dismayed when he said, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

Jesus's words clearly indicates he felt abandoned, abandoned by his own father and he had to be thinking I am not done here, I have so much more to do, look at the world you put me in, the need is great, "why have you forsaken me"?

So, I guess we also might be thinking as Jesus did "I am not done here" or "I have so much more to do!"

The fact is my friends, we all have been given a ministry by God, and we have so much more to do.

You do not have to have Pastor, Reverend, Priest, Rabbi or Inman before your name to be in ministry with God.

Another fact is God has given each and every one of us talents to be in ministry together and those talents come in so many varying forms.

Serving in the food bank, cutting and splitting wood, making spaghetti meals work, helping serve those spaghetti meals, just being a greeter at those spaghetti meals, Sunday school teachers, Youth leaders, church trustees, being part of the visitation team, putting together communion, Master bakers ~ just to name a few! So, the next time you have a little free time or are driving down the road, ask yourselves what it is you want me to do in your name Lord Jesus.

Remember these words from 2 Timothy chapter 2 "The Lord wants to use you for special purposes"

If you don't know that purpose, well, just ponder these words from Matthew 7:7-8

"Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives; the one who seeks finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened.

Keep asking and knocking, keep asking and knocking!

would also like to thank everyone that came out to support the group.


Who they are: The Chi Rho Singers are a group of approximately 35 active and retired pastors from the Susquehanna Conference of the United Methodist Church.

Easter - Celebrating a New Covenent

The true message of Easter celebrates the resurrection of Jesus and marks the beginning of a new covenant between God and man. It was indeed a colossal event in Bible history.

Shortly before His arrest, Jesus offered a prayer often referred to as, "The Great Intercessory Prayer." Many Scholars consider this prayer to be a conversation between Jesus and His Father, God, with Jesus speaking His requests into existence.

- First, He prayed for Himself: That the Father would receive Him back into Heaven, and restore the glory He had before the world began. (John 17:4-5).
- Then He prayed for His Disciples:
 That the Father would protect, guide and be with them as they delivered His message.
 (John 17:18).
- Then he prayed for all Christians:
 He prayed for each child of God to have the same unity as exists between He and the Father. A unity, which allows for the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, and oneness with God, (John 17:20-21).

Later that day Jesus was hung on a cross until dead. Near the point of death He said with a loud voice, "It is finished!" (John 19:30). The torn veil in the Temple was to signify that the Spirit of God would no longer be in the Ark that had been kept in the back of the Temple as the Most Holy of Holies under the "Old Covenant." Under the "New Covenant" the Spirit is placed in every born again Believer. The Followers of Jesus are now His Tabernacle, (His Church).

He was the new Passover Lamb. Never again would there be a need for animal sacrifice. The Lamb of God had shed His blood once and for all! Jesus is the true message of Easter, and Because Of Him mankind can have a relationship with their Creator, and be with Him for eternity.

For much of the world, Easter is only a tradition celebrated by colored Easter Eggs and the Easter Bunny. To the Followers of Christ, the true message of Easter proclaims the greatest act of love known to man. God's infinite love for mankind is the True Message of Easter, a love that will continue into Eternity. -- Sam Mills

It is also a time for many to reflect and honor loved ones who have passed away. The annual observance, formally known as Decoration Day offers a sacred time for us all. Along with honoring those who served our country, it is also a time for us to reflect and honor loved ones who have passed away recently or many years ago. Their memories live on in our hearts and are represented in the flowers, wreaths and other remembrances decorating their final resting place. Each one a reflection of the love and special memories shared in life. So thankful for each one.

God is Like a Mom

There aren't many people more familiar to us than our moms, so in honor of Mother's Day, allow me to share a lesson about who God is from my own mom.

The kingdom of heaven is like that time my mom forgot to tell me she let some homeless people move in with us.

"Who are Eddy and Malita?" I asked. My mom forgets things sometimes. Sometimes it's her wallet or her keys. Sometimes it's telling her kids that she let two strangers move into our house. It turned out, Eddy and Malita were a homeless couple my older sister Catie met at church, invited them to our house for dinner and told them her mom would help them find a place to stay. And Mom did find them a place to stay. It was with us. Over the next seven months, Mom attended court dates with Eddy and Malita, bought them diapers and toys for their kids, and helped supervise visits with their children, so they could work towards being reunited, which they eventually did.

My mom helping Eddy and Malita makes me think of how God is always working with other people in ways we don't know about. Like most moms, He doesn't feel the need to trumpet what He's doing.

I don't think anyone is more present with a child than a mother is. They carry their children before they are born, and then, after, they spend their days kissing invisible injuries and walking them through all their emotions, even the silly stuff that doesn't really matter in the long run.

One of the most beautiful things about God is how He makes Himself present to us. When Adam and Eve opted to eat from the tree, selfishness took the place of other-centered love as the principle they lived from. They believed the devil's lies that they couldn't trust God. Pretty soon all of creation had gone off the rails. Instead of God telling Adam and Eve to pull themselves up by their bootstraps or condemning them, God made a promise to save humanity by stepping into our world. Like a mother kneeling down next to her toddler. God walked with Abraham. When He told Moses to make a sanctuary so He could be "with" His people, I almost picture a mom climbing into a fort her child has built in the living room. Finally, Jesus came and got down next to us on the floor of a stable. He said things like, "You're My friends" and "I've longed to gather you together, like a mother hen gathers her chicks." Christians spend a lot of time talking about chasing after God and finding Jesus, but I think if we stopped moving, we'd find that, like a mom, God is the one who's been there all along. Spend some time today thinking of the ways your mother or the mother-figures in your life have shown you Jesus.

Attributes of a Loving Father

In the story of the Prodigal Son we find characteristics of a remarkable father that remind us of how God loves and cares for all His children.

The first characteristic is that remarkable fathers often possess unconventional wisdom. Jesus tells the story of the Prodigal Son to a diverse group of people. He speaks of a son who has grown tired of life at home. He wants to go far away and live how he pleases, so he boldly asks his father for his part of his inheritance now, essentially saying to his father, "You're worth more to me dead than alive."

Even though it would have been controversial, and the father had to know it wouldn't end well, he did what the son requested. Sometimes parents have to make decisions that are hard. He had determined that his son had finally reached a point in his life that he wasn't going to learn in any other way. In Hebrews we read that God disciplines those He loves. Sometimes our Heavenly Father lets us go through tough stuff as a way of helping us grow when we've demonstrated we can't grow in any other way. Sometimes God allows us to bottom-out physically, emotionally, spiritually, financially, or relationally. The son ends up broken, penniless, and bankrupt and winds up doing something no Jewish man would do: he gets a job feeding pigs and is so hungry he wishes he could eat the food he is giving to the pigs. These feelings lead him to think, "What I wouldn't give for a second chance." Gratefully, our Heavenly Father does some of His greatest miracles in the pigpens of our lives. The boy decides to go home and beg for forgiveness. He is willing to be a servant rather than a son, if only his father will take him back into his household.

Then the craziest thing happens, while the boy is still a long way off his father sees him and is filled with compassion for him. The father runs to his son, throws his arms around him and hugs him and kisses him. The most important characteristic of a remarkable father, a father who portrays what God is like to his children, is the ability to instill in a child the sense that he or she is truly, deeply loved. Not everyone had such a remarkable dad but regardless of our upbringing, today we have a Father who loves us. Through this story we see this father not only possessed unconventional wisdom and expressive love but was also full of extravagant forgiveness. Just like the father in the story our Heavenly Father expresses these same attributes to each one of his children including you.
